There are free services within the community that can support you with finances, accommodation, healthcare and transport concessions.

We have included the general search engine 'Ask Izzy' as it can locate a range of services and supports in your local area.

Ask Izzy

When you're looking for support, Ask Izzy can help you find the services you need, right now and nearby.

It is free and anonymous, and you can search over 350 000 services to find housing, meals, healthcare, counselling, legal advice, addiction treatment and a whole lot more.

If you're on the Telstra mobile network, you can access Ask Izzy even if you don't have credit.

FMC Mediation and Counselling

This service provides face-to-face or over-the-phone advice and is a free and independent support.

They offer:

- assistance with financial stress
- a confidential financial assessment of your income, household expenses, assets and debts
- a review service for your loan contracts and legal notices
- advice on the options available to you, including getting debts waived or reduced
- representation and negotiation services on your behalf

- help completing bankruptcy forms or applying for early superannuation release
- assistance with debt settlement or debt payment arrangements.

FMC also provide counselling for family dispute resolution, family mental health, mediation and education (eg parenting after separation).

There are 21 offices across Victoria.
