## ***God Loves A Cheerful Giver!!***

In case you've been asleep for the last few months ... here is Wikipedia's description of the **ALS Ice Bucket Challenge**: *The Ice Bucket Challenge, sometimes called the ALS Ice Bucket Challenge, is an activity involving dumping a bucket of ice water on one's head or donating to the ALS Association in the United States. It went viral throughout social media during the summer of 2014. The challenge dares nominated participants to be filmed having a bucket of ice water poured on their heads. A common stipulation is that nominated people have 24 hours to comply or forfeit by way of a charitable financial donation.*

I think the Ice Bucket Challenge is waning a bit now. It went viral in late July and showed no signs of letting up until recently. How much money has been raised? Unbelievably, one source reported that "As of Monday, August 25, The ALS Association has received \$79.7 million in donations compared to \$2.5 million during the same time period last year (July 29 to August 25)." Holy hashtag!! That is truly amazing, and how great is it, that this silly little exercise captured the imagination of people around the world, and created a tool whereby donations just poured in?!

As Bethel focuses on financial Stewardship in the month of October, we will look at the many exciting ways our financial giving undergirds and supports the important ministries of our church. I am excited about the "Narrative Budget" Bethel's Stewardship Ministry Team is preparing to share with our members and active visitors. Bethel's Narrative Budget will demonstrate how our money and time are filtering through the church to touch the lives of people in need. It will help us to have a more clear indication of how our financial donations are making an impact in people's lives through the ministries of our church.

Now, think of your own motivation to give. Are you inspired by the fact that your donation is funding the church's postage meter and photocopier? Do you get all tingly inside knowing your donation will help pay for heat and electricity? Most of us don't get excited about giving to administration and fixed overhead expenses. Sure, we know these expenses are a necessary component of running a church's ministry, but we certainly don't want to think about them. Bethel's Narrative Budget will help us to better understand our faith community and our church's mission from a faith perspective.

In thinking about the Ice Bucket phenomenon, I am wondering just what it is that causes us to “GIVE.” What is our motivation for supporting the church financially? What is it that affects when we give, and how we give? The IBC reached into the wallets of many people who otherwise might not have given anything to help ALS research (\$79 million v. \$2.5 million). Must Christians wait for a digital chain letter to stir us up and get us motivated to give?

In 2 Corinthians 9, the Apostle Paul reminds us, “A farmer who plants only a few seeds will get a small crop. But the one who plants generously will get a generous crop. You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don’t give reluctantly or in response to pressure. For God loves a person who gives cheerfully. And God will generously provide all you need. Then you will always have everything you need and plenty left over to share with others.

“As the Scriptures say, ‘They share freely and give generously to the poor. Their good deeds will be remembered forever.’ For God is the one who provides seed for the farmer and then bread to eat. In the same way, he will provide and increase your resources and then produce a great harvest of generosity in you. Yes, you will be enriched in every way so that you can always be generous. And when we take your gifts to those who need them, they will thank God.

“So two good things will result from this ministry of giving—their needs will be met, and they will joyfully express their thanks to God. As a result of your ministry, they will give glory to God. For your generosity to them and to all believers will prove that you are obedient to the Good News of Christ. And they will pray for you with deep affection because of the overflowing grace God has given to you!”
