

## Vote No on Measure E for COC College of Corruption?

They get deductions, we pay the taxes! They've raised over \$300,000 to bamboozle you with propaganda. Is that fair? Don't buy the marketing consultant's lies!
- 7 Yes on E is also funded by "Pay to Play" contractors, most outside of the district.
- 8 Study the measure and then **Vote No!** Don't let your family, friends, and neighbors wake up on June 8th with buyer's remorse.
