The Chamber Music Society presents *Tempest in C Minor* on Sunday, May 6, at 5:00 PM, and Tuesday, May 8, at 7:30 PM, in Alice Tully Hall. The program, featuring three works in C minor, a key that has often been the choice for composers in stormy moods, includes Beethoven's Trio in C minor for Piano, Violin, and Cello, Op. 1, No. 3; Brahms's Quartet in C minor for Strings, Op. 51, No. 1; and Fauré's Quartet No. 1 in C minor for Piano, Violin, Viola, and Cello, Op. 15. The superb line-up of musicians includes pianist Inon Barnatan, violist Matthew Lipman, cellist Clive Greensmith, the Calidore String Quartet and, in his CMS debut, the sensational violinist Augustin Hadelich. Augustin Hadelich has established himself as one of the great violinists of today. He has performed with every major orchestra in the U.S., as well as an ever-growing number of major orchestras in the UK, Europe, and the Far East. He is also an active recitalist and chamber music partner. He is consistently cited for his phenomenal technique, poetic sensitivity, and gorgeous tone. Mr. Hadelich's career took off when he was named Gold Medalist of the 2006 International Violin Competition of Indianapolis. Since then, his many honors have included an Avery Fisher Career Grant; a Borletti-Buitoni Trust Fellowship; the Martin E. Segal Award; the Warner Music Prize, and a 2016 Grammy Award for his recording of Dutilleux's Violin Concerto. Born in Italy, the son of German parents, Augustin Hadelich is now an American citizen. He holds an Artist Diploma from The Juilliard School, where he was a student of Joel Smirnoff. Mr. Hadelich plays the 1723 "Ex-Kiesewetter" Stradivari violin, on loan from Clement and Karen Arrison through the Stradivari Society of Chicago.
