- Traffic is major concern
- Benefits that UC could provide for neighborhood: parking, bike/ped improvements, meeting space, funding for open space, access to commute services, help with affordable housing

- Impact on neighbors
- Gentrification
- Settlement agreement compliance

INPUT DETAILS:

<u>Q & A:</u>

- How many employees will be in the new building? (Answer: Using current employee ratio to square feet, around 450)
- What are plans to mitigate access from University Avenue onto 101? (Answer: Traffic consultant will be analyzing mitigations and needed infrastructure)
- Will you let neighbors use your parking lot? There is not enough parking in the neighborhood near Woodland. (Answer: Working on a shared parking solution)

One Comment Card:

• Unsigned. "Respect the setbacks from the adjacent single-family residential areas in East Palo Alto. The development agreement from the initial project has never been adequately complied with—Landscaping, post-construction of bus stops. The traffic plan should reconfigure the roadways to provide direct access. Use of the ???(illegible)

Flip Chart Comments

Traffic:

- Traffic is bad near Embarcadero Road in the evening, especially
- Exit on Woodland jammed at rush hour. University Circle traffic blocking intersection at Woodland and University.
- Re-route traffic to University Avenue
- No net new trips!
- Worried about emergency access with added traffic from this project
- Circulation pattern on University and Woodland is a problem
- Concern about number of employees for the project
- Traffic is bad
- Original project circulation was not enforced, and this project makes it worse

Other potential impacts of project on neighbors:

- Loss of sunlight due to shadows
- Landscaping should have reduced impacts on the neighborhood.
- Concern about shadows extending across University Avenue impacting apartments
- Project does not respect single family homes. Building too tall. Worries about privacy
- More trees to screen housing from exhaust on University Avenue

Construction-related:

- Construction traffic and construction impact mitigation
- Where will construction workers park?
- Impact of project construction on pedestrians
- Hire local laborers

Suggestions for project:

- Want nice sidewalks and landscape
- Likes sustainable elements
- Likes emphasis on TDM, how it relates to city's goals for mobility
- Carpooling options or shuttle to Caltrain and back
- Likes our ideas on pedestrian infrastructure
- Solar—go above and beyond
- Rooftop garden
- University Circle complex is closed off, alienating. Need restaurant that would be inviting to the community.

Community Needs and Potential Community Benefits from Project

Parking

- Parking is limited near Woodland after 1:00 p.m. Many people park in Menlo Park when street sweeping occurs
- Need better parking for residents
- Need parking in neighborhood

Community use of UC shuttle

- Better shuttle times to meeting community work schedules
- The UC shuttle should be open to community members

Bike and Pedestrian Needs

- Two-direction bike bridge
- Pedestrian solutions to cross University Avenue

Open Space

- Open space lot Sandhill owns could be used as public park
- 1/2 acre community park with gazebo, BBQs, tables, play area. Not sterile.
- House taken out on and 35 parking spaces created. Turn into a park

Community meeting space

- Public Space like Cooley Landing needed on west side. Inviting community space.
- Community meeting space needs to be self-contained
- Meeting space for residents is needed
- There is no community meeting space on the west side. Needs to be dedicated space and have amenities such as a kitchenette

Other thoughts

- Lots of garbage on Woodland
- Hire EPA residents
- Likes idea of partnership with local affordable housing non-profits

Housing Issues:

- Affordable housing is important
- Concerns about gentrification

Settlement Agreement Comments:
