

On February 16, I attended the Zone 3 Presidents meeting in Chattanooga, TN, the site of the Tennessee Region's Winterfest, similar to our Porschefest. The annual meeting is a chance for all the Presidents in Zone 3 to gather together with our Zone Rep, Allan Cox, and discuss what's going on and how each region could help each other. 
