Vincent Bray and Becca Cook were on hand Friday evening to get much of the course set up. We were joined by Walter Stone Saturday morning to put on the finishing touches. We had 7 run groups with a total of 36 drivers taking time. Class 1 winner was Will Balance at 72.260. Class 2 was taken by Jerry Kilcrease at 71.089. Class 3, Ste-

ven, Zakely, 71.448. Class 4, Mathew Pavelchak 64.907, which was also Mens Fastest Time. Class 5 went to John Meek at 66.498. Class 6 to Kent Clayton, 65.889. Class 7 was James Stanislaw at 65.262.
