Around the Region-Bob Saville

OK, this is a new low for me... I am writing this one day AFTER it's due to Dale. And while I would love to say I have a really good reason, it's kind of shallow and weak, but there is kind of an excuse....

This past weekend, Nadine and I attended the Rocket City Ramble – the annual 914 Special Interest Group gathering. For the past 9 years, there has been a Mid US Ramble, but nobody in the Mid US was planning on holding it, so the great folks down in Huntsville, AL stepped up for a fun weekend of socializing, driving and showing.

Our Ramble weekend started off with us driving Huey down to Huntsville on Thursday. This is the farthest Huey has been since his unfortunate incident at Targa last year. And while the seats are actually very comfortable, a long 7 hour drive is still not the best in a 914 – especially one with headers and a sport "muffler". My ears are still ringing.

There were street cars, race cars, race cars used for street use, show only cars...a very impressive collection.

Mountain Area member survey results

In the survey, members were invited to rate their interest in each of 15 different items. The top 5 areas of interest (from questionnaire) were:

#3. (Tie) Visits to local specialty shops with technical presentations – service/maintenance, tires, restoration, race, engine rebuild, etc.

#3. (Tie) Guest speakers at monthly meetings (tires, batteries, lubricants, detailing, prepping your car for events, dealer presentations, etc.)

#5. Monthly meeting on Saturday mornings (allowing time afterwards for optional drives and/or lunch.)

The 5 items reflecting the lowest ratings (from questionnaire) were:

#15. Club race #14. Autocross events

#13. DE (Drivers Education) events

#11(Tie) Shine and show events

#11(Tie) Monthly meetings in the evenings during the week with social time and dinner

CAROLINAS REGION PCA MEMBERS BRING HOME GOLD FROM TARGA NEWFOUNDLAND INTERNATIONAL RALLY



With Harold Seagle Stan driving and Pendergraft navigating, the Sea Eagle Motorsports race team from Asheville, North Carolina just completed the 2008 Targa Newfoundland Race/Rally from September 13 through September 20. Seagle and Penderaraft. both members of the Carolinas re-

gion of the Porsche Club of America, were racing the *Time Warner Cable / Road Runner High Speed Online* Porsche 911SC. They completed the grueling race/rally, known as the "Iron Man of Motorsports Competition", finishing first in their racing class and, in the process, won the much sought after *Targa Gold Plate* for finishing all racing stages under trophy time. In their "other lives" Seagle is a lawyer in practice in Asheville and Pendergraft is a principal in Exclusive Motors in Charlotte.

Targa Newfoundland is an international race/ rally which covers approximately 2,200 kilometers along the coast and across the island of Newfoundland. While some transit stages are on open roads, all racing stages are run on roads which are closed and dedicated solely to the race. The cars race through remote fishing villages around the coastline and cross country, reaching speeds up to 200 kilometers per hour. The race is truly international, with race teams routinely making the trip to Newfoundland from as far away as England, Ireland, Australia and New Zealand. Sea Eagle Racing was one of the teams representing the United States. Seagle said that the extent of international press coverage is making for intense competition, with manufacturer/factory



teams becoming increasingly more involved. The race this year included not only factory/ manufacturer backed teams from several manufacturers, but several race teams with substantial experience in European type rally racing. In addition to other international press coverage, the race is traditionally covered each year in an hour long documentary on the Speed Channel.

While Seagle and Pendergraft had significant problems during the race with fuel system, mechanical and electrical failures, they managed to finish more than 10 minutes ahead of the second place car in their class. Seagle observed that such issues are simply a part of the challenge in endurance racing, where one measure of success is enduring the tremendous demands on people and equipment --- and hopefully having a bit of luck along the way. As an example, Seagle noted that they experienced an unexplained electrical failure after driving over an unusually rough and pounding section of the road to Gander during the second day of racing, causing the car to loose all power. After getting the car as far off the racing line as possible, Pendergraft took warning triangles back to alert oncoming racers of the position of the disabled Porsche while Seagle feverishly examined the electrical components in the engine bay and, finding no problem, went to the central fuse box searching for the problem. Seagle miraculously found a loose wire under the fuse box, repaired it, and they were back in the race. To demonstrate the normalcy of such "catastrophic" events, Seagle pointed out that the second place car in his division, Edison Wiltshire, spun out and crashed within 2 kilometers of the finish line. (after racing more that 2,200 kilometers over 6 days) --- and another experienced rally team from Nova Scotia with Steve Quigley driving made it only 100 yards past the finish line where their car finally yielded to the beating and stopped, having to be moved back to the pit area by wrecker. Another race team from Las Vegas, Nevada went through three engines in the first three days of racing, and finally retired with a failed transmission.



According to Seagle, getting there and back is always a part of the challenge. Having lost their drivers who have transported the car and equipment in the past, Seagle and Pendergraft put the car on a trailer and transported it themselves, which included driving the tow vehicle more than 4,390 miles, (not including the 24 hours on the ferries to and from Newfoundland from Nova Scotia), in addition to driving more than 1,300 miles in the race.

The trip back home to North Carolina started at 6:30am Sunday morning September 21 when

Seagle and Pendergraft pulled the trailer with the race car out of St. Johns, Newfoundland and ended (after one 5 hour stop for sleep) in Seagle's driveway at 7:30pm Tuesday September 23. Seagle observed that, as long and difficult as the effort has been, and even though they faced numerous challenges and thought several times that success was virtually impossible, they found a great sense of victory in simply taking on the challenge. He added that, in the bigger picture, racing is very much like the rest of life. No matter who wins the race, we can find sufficient victory and comfort in the renewed awareness of the tremendous value of perseverance in the face of adversity.
