Reflections on Parade, PorscheFest and Autocrossing

My mom always told me that as we get older time passes faster. When you are young that sounds pretty silly. Now it seems like a month is like a week. Mom was right.

As our brethren in Colorado begin the execution phase of Porsche Parade 2009 in Keystone I reflect back on our Parade last year. It is hard to believe that an entire year has passed since the Carolinas Region hosted Parade 2008.

For me that entire week was and still is a blur. Being in the proverbial 'fishbowl' during Parade it was hard for me to absorb everything that was going on around me as I was focused entirely on the task at hand (aka whatever fire that needed to be put out at the moment). That entire week still comes to me in bits and pieces. I have been told by previous Parade Chairs that this is normal, but thankfully we have a lot of pictures that help capture a lot of incredible moments of that week that I missed.

Bob Saville and I will be in Keystone by the time you read this, representing Zone 3 and the Carolinas Region respectively at various events including the National Board of Directors Meeting and the President's Reception. I have been told that a Parade Chairs' favorite Parade is the next one as you get to enjoy the event rather than run it ... this I am really looking forward to. I am sure both Bob and I will have some interesting observations during our stay which I am sure we will both share in Tobacco Roads next month.

For those of you that were unable to attend PorscheFest 2009 you missed a truly great event. Our biggest problem was the fact that it proved to be too popular resulting in the event turning away approximately 40+ on the wait list. We will look to being able to add more spaces next year but we also have to keep an eye on the quality of the event.

We were initially a bit concerned about two things: 1) having the event over Memorial Day weekend and 2) swapping the days for two competitive events ... the Autocross and the Concours. Traditionally the Autocross is on Sunday but we were unable to secure a viable Autocross site for that day, so Saturday it was. That caused concern for a few people that thought we would lose too many Concours participants since anyone running the Autocross on Saturday would have to re-detail their car for Sunday. But in the end the schedule proved to be perfect. We had what I would call optimal participation in both events.

As an added bonus for the modified schedule since we had the Awards Banquet on Sunday evening we were able to complete all competitive events and give out the awards there whereas normally we have to give out Autocross awards on site on Sunday afternoon.

The venue, Scenic Wolf Resort, was perfect for the Autocross. The Resort opened up its Lodge at the top of the mountain providing participants and spectators with food, shade, bathrooms and hospitality. The Autocross course itself, while small, was pretty much perfect. To the point of enticing me, Mr. DE and Wannabe Club Racer, to participate and in the process rediscover how fun autocrossing can be (more on that later). The course layout is a testament to what a wizard our Autocross Chair, Walter Stone, is when it comes to utilizing available space. Kudos to Walter.

And then came the rain ...

Sunday morning was one of those moments when an event can either come crashing down on you or it ends up being a spectacular success despite the elements and the circumstances. This was the latter.

In order to do the Biltmore photo shoot everyone had to be up at O'Dark Thirty. That coupled with the rain made me think that a lot of people would choose to pass ... boy was I wrong. I think everyone that had signed up for the photo shoot was there. But this was not only a testament to the participants but to Jim Peterson's team and their military-like organization and execution.

From my observations it looked like Jim and his team did this every day of the week. It was that flawless. They got 75 cars lined up around the front lawn at Biltmore for a group shot, followed by individual shots for each car and off the main house property ... in an hour ... in the rain. Unbelievable!

Following the photo shoot we had a really

great breakfast at the Deerpark Restaurant on the Estate property followed by a damp but enthusiastic Concours in the parking lot next to the restaurant.

That evening we had a great Awards Banquet at the host hotel, the Crown Plaza, followed by more socializing at the Hospitality Room.

The final numbers for the event were as follows:

150 Registrants, 82 Cars, 75 Cars at the Biltmore Photo Shoot, 153 at Banquet, 33 in Concours, 28 in Gimmick Rally, 23 Cars and 27 Drivers in the Autocross, Tour 1 - 17 Cars, Tour 2 - 20 Cars, Tour 3 - 4 Cars.

All-in-all a great success. Hats off to Jim and his team!

So back to Autocrossing for a minute. Those of you that know me understand my mild obsession with driving at speed on road courses. Over the past few years I have made my way to Carolina Motorsports Park, Lowe's Motor Speedway, VIR, Roebling Road, Road Atlanta, Barber Motorsports Park and Watkins Glen ... with a list of other tracks that I want to drive. Needless to say I had not thought a lot about autocrossing ... until now.

PorscheFest rekindled my interest in running Autocrosses. As a matter of fact I attended the 3rd installation of our Regional Autocross Series today here in Charlotte at the Metrolina Expo. Once again it was a Walter Stone Tour 'de Force in design. I think only about 10 cones were taken out today indicating a very well laid out course. Beyond the driving challenge one of the big draws for me is that I do not have to load up 3 sets of wheels and tires and hitch up my trailer to the Tahoe to participate. And it only costs me a little wear and tear on my tires and gas.

For those of you that have not tried Autocrossing in a while, give it another shot. Those of you that have not tried but think you know how to drive ... the gauntlet has been thrown!

Porschefest 2009 By: Catherine Bonfiglio

Jim Peterson, Director of the Mountain Area of the Carolinas Region describes a successful event as one in which the measure of success is the smiles on the faces of participants. If the number of smiling Porschefest participants was any indication, the weekend was a great success. A total of 82 cars and 150 Porsche enthusiasts from the Carolinas Region and other areas in the Southeast came together for the two-day event, held in Asheville over Memorial Day weekend.

This was the Mountain Area's first time to host Porschefest. Jim Peterson and his "brain trust" began working on Porschefest last summer. "It really was a team effort," Peterson said. "I'm not running this event. People picked up the ball and ran with it." And run they did, putting together an autocross, gimmick rally, driving tours, Concours, photo shoot, hospitality suite and a banquet on the last evening. The planning committee also enjoyed sponsorship support from Deal Motor Cars and German Motor Werks. This was the only Porschefest to be sold out in well in advance, which Peterson attributes to the Asheville location, and the centerpiece of the event, the Biltmore Estate.

Early arrivals rolled in on Friday, with the major events beginning on Saturday with the Autocross at the Scenic Wolf Resort. The North Carolina Mountains provided a dramatic backdrop to the event, for the 23 cars and 27 drivers who navigated the twists and turns that mirrored a mountain highway. "The Autocross worked out perfectly," said Carolinas Region President Harvey Yancey. "The course was small, but really fun to run." The venue also proved to be popular with spectators, who got a good view of participants making their way through the course designed by Walter Stone.

Whether or not Autocross was your game, there were more opportunities to experience twisty mountain roads through the Saturday morning and afternoon driving tours; a long tour on great roads to and from Erwin Tennessee, one in and around some of Asheville's locales, and a third tour down through Black Mountain and to beautiful Lake Lure. The line of Porsches snaked their way along the curvy road that would eventually open up to the front lawn of Biltmore house, and then park around the edges of the lawn with George Vanderbilt's masterpiece in the background, and 76 Porsche "smiles" in the foreground. "Dale McCourt planned and ran the photo session at Biltmore House with military precision," Peterson said. Following the group photo, each car was individually photographed for a lasting memory of Porschefest. Harvey Yancey stated that "the sheer magnitude of cars getting to the Biltmore property was problematic. However, they had everything planned out, and it came out great."

Following the photo shoot, everyone had breakfast at Lioncrest, also on the estate adjacent to the Deerpark restaurant. The parking lot at Lioncrest served as the location for the Concours. Despite heavy mist, that turned to light rain, that turned to showers, the smiles continued and the Concours was held.

Although Sunday afternoon saw inclement weather, Porschefest participants took it all in stride. Twenty-eight met the challenge to their intellect and driving skills by taking part in the gimmick rally; promoted to be a "brain drain" while maneuvering some of the prettiest roads in western North Carolina. Others explored Asheville, it's many sights, surroundings, and shopping opportunities, all while making new Porsche friends along the way. The banquet held on Sunday evening enabled 153 old and new friends to relax and recount their experiences over the weekend, while dining on an Italian buffet. The awards for the weekend events were distributed including the Overall Winners award, which went to Nadine and Bob Saville, who participated in all three Porschefest events. The winner of the Club Ferdinand sponsored 2008 911 Turbo "If Only I Could Drive One for Just a Day" raffle was Mike McMahan.

It's at events such as Porschefest, that many come to appreciate the benefits of taking part in club activities. As Jim Peterson said, "One thing is that by getting involved with the club, you get to meet and know people, and develop true friendships. Fall Activities and Updates

Recently, you may have received an email from PCA National regarding the Drivers Education Insurance program with Lockton Affinity. PCA National has worked with Lockton, a major provider of HPDE insurance, to provide a 10% discount for on track insurance coverage to PCA members. Many standard insurance carriers now exclude all activities held on a racing surface or at a motorsports facility regardless if an instructional or competitive nature. Unless you've read all the fine print on your policy, you may not be covered by your standard street insurance during a PCA Drivers Education event. While incidents are infrequent, they can be made worse by finding out after an incident that you are not covered. To fill this gap, there are several carriers offering niche coverage for Drivers Education events. Among those providing coverage are Lockton, Katz and ProSure. HPDE insurance is NOT required to participate in PCA DE's but is an option for those concerned about possible vehicle damage.

Our October DE is just around the corner. On October 3rd & 4th, we'll be returning to Carolina Motorsports Park for our Fall DE. It's a great opportunity to experience what a Porsche can do in the safe and controlled environment at CMP in Kershaw, SC. We accept other makes and models, too. We have several members who attend regularly in Mazda, Nissan, Mini, etc. Registration will open August 3rd. More information is on the region website.

We're also investigating a skidpad school at CMP this fall. The skidpad offers a unique opportunity to learn the dynamics of your car as it approaches the limit of adhesion. This would be a one-day event not in conjunction with a DE, possibly in the September timeframe. If you've read this far and are still interested, please send me an email.

As we're in the summer driving season between our DE events, it's my regular pitch for teen driving programs. As most of you may know, Angela and I are the lucky parents of 3. Ben, 22, now off to the Navy and sorely missing his 944. Carolyn, claiming that new found freedom every 16 year old thinks they deserve, and Rachel, 15, with a newly minted driving permit. All have attended the State of North Carolina required Drivers Education, or rather licensing ed. They all passed the legal requirements for a license and are knowledgeable in the regulatory rules of the road. However, the minimal amount of time required behind the wheel does not make them good drivers.

I've known families who have moved across state lines for their child to receive a better education or participate on a certain sports team. Would we make the same commitment for Drivers Education? Knowing where you can pass a tractor on a 2 lane road, does not change the fact that motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for 16-20 year olds. So other than chauffeuring our kids around til they're 30, what's a parent to do? It takes parental involvement. One insurance company rewards their clients with a savings bond if they spend an hour every week driving with their teen. Remember Rome wasn't built in a day though. Work on one or two particular skills each outing, such as maintaining a certain speed. Anything more than that will be taken as pestering by your teen driver.

That's also where other driving programs come into play. In a safe and controlled environment, drivers can experience situations before they're encountered on the public roads. Exercises such as ABS/Non-ABS emergency braking, evasive lane changes and distraction courses are part of the curriculums. There are courses offered at permanent facilities in the region, such as the BMW Teen School in Greer and Richard Petty's Safe Driving program at Lowe's Motor Speedway. However, there are also many other very good programs offered by non-profits, usually subsidized by a manufacturer. One coming up soon is the Bridgestone DriversEdge program which is scheduled in Greensboro on July 11th and 12th. TireRack Street Survival course is also offered regularly in the Carolinas and has upcoming events on the calendar.

C Goes For A Test Drive**

"Hey man how was the ride?" "You weren't gone long enough to really get a feel for the car were you?" "And by the way you need to keep it under 60, they are out to get you" "Right"
