Regional Questionnaire Results and the Club Race Tango

I want to thank all of the Carolinas Region Members that took the time to fill out the Regional Questionnaire (355 in total). That represents approximately 25% of the members that receive my direct emails, which is a good hit rate although we are hoping for a better percentage next year. The information provided will allow your Board and your Area Directors to better understand what you, the members, really want and need out of your Club and your Region.

I am planning on doing a full analysis of the data and providing that in TR next month but I wanted to share with you some of the major takeaways of the Questionnaire, which are:

- 1) 91% of you felt that PCA has met your expectations. Although we should be very pleased with that number there is still room for improvement.
- 2) A large majority of you want the option of Area Meetings on the weekends (not so much on Fridays though) as well as during the week since not everyone has the same schedules.
- 3) There is a strong interest in having more Tech Sessions at Local Shops and Dealerships.
- 4) Many of you want more casual social gatherings like the monthly 'Cars & Coffee' event at NorthLake Mall in Charlotte.

Some of the verbatims were very interesting. Such as to the question 'If you have not attended any Area Meetings in the past 12 months, why?'. One response was that the meeting was always held in the same location ... followed by one that said that the meeting moved too much and that it should always be in the same place. From the information that I have just given you, you can see that everyone has a different opinion and we are facing challenges in trying to accommodate everyone.

In a similar vein several people suggested

that we move events (like PorscheFest and Fall Tour) around the Region. While on the surface that may seem logical and easy but in reality you have a lot of factors to consider. First of all does the venue fit the event? Fall Tour in the mountains works but having it in say Charlotte or Durham ... not so much. But the main factor that dictates where an event is held is who is running the event. As an organizer you have to have a dedicated committee that will put many hours into organizing an event like PorscheFest. The decision usually comes down to who wants to run the event and then they decide where they want to have it. PorscheFest has been held in Charlotte, Greenville and now Asheville. All of those locations have been chosen by the groups running the event. It would be impossible to say we are going to have an event in a specific area without having advocates in that location.

One of the things that perplexed me in the Questionnaire were comments some individuals made about not feeling welcome at meetings and events. While long time members do tend to hang out with their friends, as most people do, I have never been to an Carolinas Region gathering where people have been intentionally excluded ... new members or old members. I am hoping that this is more of a perception thing than anything else. One of the things that has been implemented at most Area Meetings as part of the normal 'business' portion of the meeting is the recognition and introduction of new members and/or members that have not attended meetings in a while. We usually ask for names, where they are from originally and what kind of car you have. This is usually a great icebreaker.

What I think happens at larger events, say AutoFair, is that new members coming to the event expect people to immediately recognize them as being 'new'. Unfortunately with around 2,500+ members, family and affiliates it is hard to know who is new and who is not. So if you are attending an event for the first time you may want to take the initiative to tell the people that are running the event that you are new and they will be happy to introduce you to some other members to get the ball rolling.

Onto the Club Race ...

As most of you know by now our annual Club Race has been cancelled for 2009. This cancellation was very disappointing to the Board and to me personally. The decision was not taken lightly as this decision not only impacted Club Racers, inside and outside our Region, but it also affected many of our Sponsors that support those racers.

There were a couple of serious attempts to salvage the race by some of our local Club Racers. We worked closely with Bruce Boeder, PCA National Club Race Chair, in conjunction with those efforts.

However, after being looked at by two previous Club Race Chairs it was decided that due to the time constraints in place the quality of the event would suffer. At the end of the day it was not worth forcing the issue and end up with a mediocre showing.

On a positive note we are in the process of putting together a new Club Race Committee and are moving forward with plans to have the Club Race on the Calendar for 2010. If you are interested in assisting with those efforts let me know.




