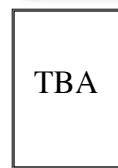

For those of you not familiar with Rennfest, it is a 3-day Multi-event weekend on which PorscheFest was based. BTW – Our Fall Tour will be utilizing Brasstown Valley Resort also this year. If you have not signed up I think we have a few slots left.

On September 12th the Triad Area held a “Porsche Corral” at The American Children’s Home Annual Charity Car Show in Lexington, NC. Jerry will have more details in his write-up later in this issue of TR.

Mike Jones had to go solo this time around organizing our People’s Choice Concours at the Fall Food Lion AUTOFAIR at Lowe’s Motor Speedway. Mike Rich was out of town on a well deserved vacation with his wife Lenore. We had 73 cars at the event, this time displayed proudly on Bruton’s nice green infield. If you have not attended this event previously remember to sign-up for the Spring AutoFair. It is a great opportunity to see a very unique mix of machinery from every decade and marque.

Continuing our Regional Autocross Series Event #5 was held on Sunday, September 20th. This event was hosted by the Metrolina Area and held again at Metrolina Tradeshow Expo in Charlotte. Steven Zakely will have details in his write-up later in this issue also.

By the time you read this the 2009 edition of Petite LeMans at Road Atlanta will be history. Our Zone 3 Rep., Bob Saville, was in charge of the PorschePlatz this year. I am sure Bob will give us a complete wrap-up in next month’s TR.

Last month I promised you an analysis of the Regional Questionnaire, those results are

below:

Meeting Attendance: A little over half of the respondents have attended an Area meeting in the past 12 months. The majority that were unable to attend meetings cited prior commitments followed by distance to the Area Meeting.

Event Attendance: 2/3rds of the respondents have attended a Regional or Area Event during the past 12 months. Compared to other Regions that is a very high rate of participation.

Interest in Specific Event Types:

Guest Speakers – Most would like to see more guest speakers at meetings

Dine & Drives – Lots of interest in both Lunch & Dinner events

Shine & Show – Again, lots of interest
Visits to Porsche Shops & Dealers – Huge interest here

Fall Tour – This has always been a big Regional favorite and it was reflected in the positive numbers

Wine Tours – Big interest

PorscheFest – No surprise here ... big numbers.

Autocross – This is where we start seeing a shift in numbers. Only about 50% are interested in Autocross. Good numbers but I think a lot of people are concerned that they may damage their car. We might need an Autocross 101 similar to our Mid-Winter Track Seminar for our DE events.

Club Racing – This was a pleasant surprise. Almost half were interested in Club Racing. Excellent numbers.

Driver’s Ed – Almost 2/3rds were interested in DE sessions. Wow ...

Caravan’s to PCA Events, Regional Car Related Events and Professional Races – Very positive (approx. 2/3rds for each). We just need to put a system into place to coordinate. We will most likely utilize the Area Directors

to put these together.

Area Meetings on Saturday Mornings – Very positive. I have received lots of feedback on having meetings during the weekends. The Metrolina Area held their 1st one on September 26th. We will see how that went next month.

Area Meetings on Friday Evenings – Not as popular as Saturday mornings but still positive. I will be distributing Area based results to each Area Director so they can determine whether Friday or Saturday works best for their members.

Wine Tastings – Good interest. Over half responded positively.

Single Malt/Cigars – Only about 1/3rd of the respondents were interested but that was still over 100 people so we will see which Areas had the greatest numbers.

Once all of the data has been distributed to the Area Directors we will discuss how to implement the feedback at our next Board Meeting. Again thanks to all of you that participated in the Questionnaire this year!

Before I close this month’s article, I wanted to share a life changing event for my wife and I. Many of you know that Vivian and I had been working on having children for several years. “None of this would have been possible without the support of my parents ,Kathy and Herbert Boehm. Without them, I would more than likely still be dreaming about what it feels like to drive a 10/10's on a race track. I love to talk about how that feels.” This quote is from Kevin Boehm who I think is a shining example of one of our young PCA members that has excelled in the class room and on the track and deserves a great big “well done” from all of us.

Kevin Boehm is no stranger to most of us PCA'ers in the Carolinas Region, especially those of us that participate in the Drivers Education Program. Kevin is a tall, handsome young man, and at most DE's at Carolinas Motor sports Park, you could usually find him at the DE Tech shed helping inspect the cars, making sure they complied with PCA safety regulations. Then of course, those of us that have been in Kevin's DE run groups, are also familiar with him showing up in our rear view mirror, looking for and when he gets the passing signal, then he is gone! Kevin is fast!

Kevin grew up watching his Dad (Herbert) work on all types of race cars, and also watched his Dad as he drove the cars at various racing and drag strip events. Herbert, who is a seasoned “car guy”, taught Kevin a lot as he grew up. At the age of 15, Kevin started racing a Junior Dragster at the Wilkesboro Drag Way Park. Not only did Kevin enjoy driving cars fast, he also had an interest in learning the integral engineering aspects with everything associated with making race cars go faster. So, how do you develop your driving and technical skills? Right, you drive on the track every chance you get and you go to college! Kevin did both!

During his time in college, Kevin excelled in all areas, especially those areas

related to motor sports. While working on his degree, Kevin also received an undergraduate research assistantship position which focused on creating a new lab using a shock dynamometer; he was a teaching assistant in the Computer Aided Design area; and during his sophomore and junior years he worked for UNC Charlotte tutoring freshman engineering students. Kevin was also selected as the 2008 Formula SAE team leader, and according to the Director of Motor-sports and Automotive Research Center at UNCC, this is perhaps the most prestigious position offered to a student. During summer breaks and at other times away from the books, Kevin found time to participate in the PCA Drivers Education program. He had just turned 18 when he drove in his first DE event in March, 2005 at CMP. He continued driving in the DE program and was certified as a PCA National DE Instructor two years later, at age 20. The PCA Drivers Education Program was great for Kevin because, among other things, he was able to get in a lot of track time and further develop his high performance driving skills. From DE, the next step up the ladder is PCA Club Racing. So with financial support and encouragement from his family, they built Kevin a very fast Porsche 944 race car. In his rookie season in PCA Club racing, Kevin set the PCA SP3 lap record at CMP (1:51.422) and VIR (2:16.841).

Kevin graduated in May, 2009, with a

degree in Mechanical Engineering with a Concentration in Motor sports and a Minor in Mathematics from the William States Lee College of Engineering at UNC Charlotte. Like most college graduates, the time comes when you have to get a job. Most graduates really struggle trying to find the “right job”. However, finding the right job was not a problem with Kevin. Because of his strong academic background in engineering, his driving skills, experience, training and knowledge of motor sports, Kevin applied for and landed the job of a life time! Kevin started work on July 6th with Honda. He will be working in the Vehicle Research Performance-Advanced Traction Systems group of Honda R&D Americas in Marysville, Ohio. There his main focus will be on developing and testing anti-lock brakes, traction control, stability management, and all-wheel drive systems on the new Honda and Acura vehicles. Wow! As a test driver for Honda, Kevin will be getting paid to get on the track and have fun doing what he enjoys most.

Kevin feels that the PCA DE Program and his Club Racing experience kept him motivated to complete his engineering degree and had a direct impact on getting his job at Honda. The next time you see Kevin at one of our PCA events, take time to say hello and ask him how his racing career is coming along, and then watch for the big smile as his face lights up!
