

The Regional Holiday Party gives us an opportunity to look back on the events of the year and to recognize the people that have given to the Region over the past year. This year our Regional Holiday Party will be held on December 5th and is hosted this year by the Upstate Area in beautiful downtown Greenville SC. The host hotel will be the Hyatt Regency located at 220 North Main Street in Greenville. Jim Horner, Upstate Area Director, is the organizer of the event.

Jim says that Greenville is a festive and charming place during the holidays, with a walk-able main street filled with shops, galleries, Falls Park, a free trolley and horse-drawn carriage rides. We have secured a room rate of \$119 for those planning on making a night of it.

The new Panamera

For those of you that have not noticed, Porsche recently added another member to the family, namely the Panamera. I was fortunate enough to see the Panamera North America introduction at this year's Porsche Parade in Colorado. But prior to that I had some misgivings about some of the seemingly awkward angles on the car shown in magazines (namely the rear hatch area). However in person that awkwardness disappeared. This machine has what I would call 'presence'. Very impressive. Mercedes, BMW and Aston-Martin need to watch their rearview mirrors. I simply cannot wait to drive one.

In conjunction with the official PCNA Panamera introduction many of our Regional Porsche Dealerships held Panamera 'Launch Parties'. I was able to attend the Hendrick Porsche event in Charlotte and as always the Hendrick Team ran a first class show. Thanks to GM David Foster, Amy Cook and Lara White for putting the event together.

As an added bonus all attendees were treated to a special appearance of the Lowenbrau Porsche 962 driven by Al Holbert, Derek Bell, Chip Robinson and Al Unser, Jr. You might recognize it as one of the rare race cars featured in the new Panamera commercial along with several other Porsches owned by the Drendell Family Collection. Our thanks to Matt, Bobby and Trevor for making that happen.

... and future Porsche Products

With VW turning the tables on our favorite marque and Porsche subsequently becoming one of the brands under VW control, there have been a lot of rumors going around about their future. Initially the story was that VW would let the Cayenne and the Panamera die after the current lifecycles in 2015-2017 and then Porsche would focus solely on sports cars. That did not make a lot of sense as Porsche had reached nearly 100,000 units in 2007 with a 3rd of the sales being the Cayenne. A highly profitable vehicle for Porsche.

The next story that emerged made more sense. VW CEO Martin Winterkorn apparently wants to <u>increase</u> Porsche production to 150,000 units by 2013. In order to do that more models will need to be added. The first would be a high volume sub-Boxster based on the VW BlueSport sports car shown at the Detroit Autoshow in 2007. Seemingly to be powered by a mid-engined turbo 4-cylinder, I personally feel that this car would be a huge hit. The second would be a sub-Cayenne SUV based on the Audi Q5 platform. The third would be a two-door version of the Panamera (latter day 928 anyone?) in coupe and cabriolet forms. Exciting stuff.

Yet Another Addition to the Family

While awaiting the arrival of our two new family additions a few months back, it became clear to me that Vivian's sedan (which was the replacement for her 993 Cab) was simply not going to be very practical as a full-time mommy mobile. The only alternative currently in the stable was my tow vehicle and daily driver, a Tahoe. And while she November 2009 - Page 7

liked the space that was provided by the Tahoe, she found it was too big and difficult to park.

Never one to pass up an opportunity to find a new vehicle, I started looking for something that would suit our needs for the next few years. Although we both know how practical mini-vans are we decided a long time ago that we would not buy one. Plus we were going to trade-in the Tahoe so the replacement would need to be able to tow my trailer. So I started looking at smaller but capable SLIV's

We had owned a 2001 X5 and while it was a nice vehicle it had a ton of recalls and we sold it after one year ... so no repeat there. Then I started to think about a Cayenne.

While I was at Parade earlier this year I sat in on several seminars. One was "911 Lightweights - R, ST, RS, RSR, SCRS, C4" presented by Johan Dirickx. The second was "Repairing Your Porsche - Pro or DIY" presented by Chris Powell and the final one was "Buying a Used Cayenne" put on by Peter Smith, the PCA National Technical Committee Chair.

Not knowing much about the Cayenne I was interested in learning more since it is a very popular choice for PCA members. Peter's seminar was very enlightening from several angles. I found out that the Cayenne was a very solid vehicle but as with any vehicle it has its' quirks. The two big ones being the plastic coolant pipes that run through below the intake manifold (there is a replacement kit for that) and the ignition coils. One other potential area of concern is the drive shaft. Other than that Peter said the Cayenne was a very solid product.

Peter was nice enough to send me a copy of his PowerPoint presentation so I could review in detail. Once I was armed with that info I started actively searching. I tend to be a serial AutoTrader lurker anyway, so every day I was scanning the new offerings. After looking at a lot of units on the market we finally settled on a '05 Cayenne S. As of this writing we have had it three weeks and so far so good. The best way I can describe it is like a lifted 928. It is torquey with a nice V8 growl plus you have great visibility. Since my 993 it not very street friendly anymore you may see me at some events driving the 'Pepper'.

Changes, Changes, Changes ...

2010 will bring a lot of changes to the Carolinas Region Board. A lot of familiar names will be in different roles and several new names will appear too. We will also be doing needed revamps to several of our committees. I am very excited over the coming changes and look forward to a great 2010.



Racing and Rambling Rock Webb

Back in August I had spent a day at Bonneville Salt Flats watching the time trials. Along with that and seeing "The Worlds Fastest Indian" movie three times I had the urge to do a high speed event. Well with Bonneville being 3500 miles away and the interstate being covered with cops, I began looking for "opportunities". My biker friend, Gene Brown, said "you should run the Maxton mile, they have Hayabusa's doing over 200"!

Hey, that sounded interesting and its only 150 miles away at Laurinburg, NC. It's not too far past "South of the Border", the tackiest place I have ever seen and the only thing yankees remember about SC on their way to Florida.

So I joined the ECTA (East Coast Timing Association), read the rule book, and called Gene to tell him we would do it. Basically if you stayed under 135mph you could run a street car and all you needed was a 2000SA helmet- cool! The most I could do optimistically was around 130. I have seen that at Daytona going into the infield, so I really didn't need all my road race safety equipment. However, if I had a blowout I would be glad I had it.

Maxton is an old WW II glider training site with two miles of bumpy old concrete runway. It felt a lot like the back straight at Sebring. You have a standing start mile to run and another mile to slow down just in case brakes fail etc. Cars that run over 180 mph have to have a parachute.

So let's do it, we loaded up and headed out Friday around noon, getting there around 3:00 in time for tech. We teched ok and were ready to run on Saturday.

The place was covered with bikes, this was the Sport Bike Magazine sponsored "Shoot-out". We saw everything from turbo Hayabusa's to a Sears 125 CC bike that, by the way, set a class record at 68 mph!

Plenty of cars there but I did not expect to see many Porsches. I was delighted to see Cory Friedman and his Autometrics Grand Am Porsche Cup car. The whole crew was there and they wanted to see some serious speed. Saturday morning we lined up and started our runs. Time trials are kind of like being in a war zone, lots of waiting around interrupted by short times of intense excitement and a huge adrenalin rush. Yes, it was like a hill climb with no hill and straight! No where near as satisfying as a 40 minute road race.

There were some neat cars there, my favorite was a 1938 Buick straight 8 with a modern day supercharger, about 4000 pounds of American iron that ran about 120 or so. Another interesting car was the immaculately prepared 51 Crosley roadster that set a record at 71 mph. The fastest vehicle there was a highly modified turbocharged Suzuki Hayabusa that hit around 210. Right behind him was an outstanding Ford GT 40 that made it into the 200MPH club with a run of 202mph.

Cory did good with a record run of 172 mph. Old Yeller was still pulling at the end of the mile at 125mph, not quite enough to beat the 128 mph record I was shooting for. Let's see skinny tires, take off the spoilers -Wait till next year!!

Keep your eyes on the road and your hands

upon the wheel for sure.



The laps times were a little on the slow side, but we all were having a great time discussing the best way to tackle the course in the wet. As the course dried our lap times got quicker and quicker. Going into Lunch Break Cari Steinbrueck had the fastest time of anyone. Great job, but, with a completely dried track for the Afternoon Session, the times were sure to be even faster.

And that wound up being the case as each driver dropped anywhere from 2-5 sec off their morning laps.

By the end of the day, everyone had greatly improved their lap times with a great sense of accomplishment.

Alex won't let me write a book about the entire event, so I will just mention some of the highlights.

Dave Lumpkin and his wife Fran brought their BRAND NEW, 2009 Boxster S, fresh off the boat from Germany where they did a Euro Pickup. Dave Ran a Blistering Lap of 53.83 in semi dry conditions in the morning session before taking the car up to the Shine-n-Show. Fran was still trying to get used to the PDK but she was very smooth everywhere on the track. Rumor has it she Is a Pro, so she may have been sandbagging it.

Don Morris was there with his newly purchased Boxster. Unfortunately, the tires were all worn out so he wasn't able to push it too hard, but he did as always get faster and faster and wound up with 2nd place behind Dave Lumpkin.

Don was also kind enough to let Walter (who doesn't always get to bring his own car) drive it for a few laps.

Walter concurred the tires were shot, but still did what Walter does, and that is go fast. Even though he had never Autocrossed in a Boxster, he had some fast times.

As much as I love to DRIVE in the autocross, I almost have as much fun watching the other run group and help teach some of the drivers ways to shave seconds. It brings me great satisfaction when I can help someone go a little faster and they come back with a Big Smile on their face. Perfect example: Bill Petrozelli with his '77 911 SC couldn't figure out the two round-a-bouts on each end of the course. After talking to him for a few minutes, he went out and knocked off 2 sec. and then on the next lap another 2 sec. Bill wound up winning his class with a great time of 54.198.

As always Jerry and Sadie Kilkrease were in attendance, and as always it was Husband vs. Wife. You think Cari and I are competitive

Jerry is a National PCA Instructor, and their '79 911 (Slight Mod) is always ready to rock. Jerry finished his last lap with a BLISTER-ING time of 51.85. To put that in perspective, it was only 1/10 of a second slower than Bob Verhelle in his '07 997 TURBO, and Bob is fast. So Sadie had her work cut out for her on her 2nd Session. She was just getting comfortable with the now dry track, but couldn't quite figure out where to shave some seconds, but, after a few more pointers by Jerry and I, she set her best time of the day with a 52.67. This put her into 2nd place in her class behind Jerry. Right before her last lap I told her... "Sadie, let it all hang out. Go For it." And if you could have seen the way she attacked the slalom section, I don't think she left anything in reserve. It was truly magical to watch.

John Rutledge and his son Andy were pushing John's '79 911 SC so hard, trying to best each other, that John wound up doing a spectacular spin-out while trying to save some time in the slalom section. Not to be out done by Dad, Andy had his own spectacular spin-out on his next run in the same area.

Of course there was NO damage to the car. This is autocross after all. Nothing to hit, or hurt your car. Personally I think they were just showing off to Mom, who was working one of the stations right where they did their spinouts.

Andy McNeil, brought his Mini Cooper again. Last year Andy rocked the course with a top 5 overall. This year his car was having some issues, but he still had a great run, taking 2nd overall in his class.

We also had 2 newcomers. Brendan Bogue, and his friend Josh Mitchell. Brendan brought his tuned red Miata, and man, he was fast. Most of the day he either had the fastest time, or top 3. Josh was able to match his lap times for a few runs. Even though he had never driven his car. Great job.

Walter Stone took a final Bonus Lap in our Car. And with only ONE RUN, he clicked off a low 49 sec lap. WOW, and that's even with him granny shifting our car. I'm scared if the day ever comes and he gets some real practice in a late model 911 or even worse goes out and gets one for himself. I know if he keeps driving ours it's only a matter of time, before he gives in.

Cari started the Afternoon session having the quickest lap so far, but as stated above, everyone dropped lots of time, in the afternoon, and I was one of them. Finally getting into my zone, I did a mid 48, but had +1 cone, and then my next run I did a 48.319 with no cones. That was my last run. Just enough to edge by Brendan, but the 2nd Run group still had all their afternoon runs to do. And in that run group was my wife, Cari. She dropped 4 sec on her first run and then another sec on the next run I was getting nervous, but at the same time, the instructor in me, was still helping her figure out how to shave off some more time after each of her runs. By the time she pulled within 1 sec of my time, that was it. She had to figure out the rest on her own. Her last lap was a 49.3 which put her 2nd overall. She was both happy to do well, but frustrated not to beat her husband. And so the saga continues.

Anyone that knows Cari and me will tell you that we are fierce competitors. She has one goal at the Autocross, and that is to beat her husband and/or have the fastest time overall. It's what makes the autocross so much fun. Husband vs. wife, Dad vs Son., Mom vs.

Son....etc. It's just a great time had by all, and perfect family event.

Almost every autocross we have been in has had at least 5 or 6 families participating together, and even the ones that don't participate are there cheering on everyone.

Everyone had a great time, and progressively got faster and faster with each run, and that's what it's all about. Having fun. And the challenge of YOU vs. the clock. The great feeling you get when someone tells you that you just went faster then your last run which you thought was already really fast.

AUTOCROSS. "What's that.?"

Having raced cars and motorcycles for over 20 + years, I even said that, the first time I heard about it. "What is autocross.? How does that work? What do you do.?"

Autocross is a sport of trying to navigate your car through a defined course of orange traffic cones set up on a BIG OPEN EMPTY parking lot, as fast as you can. There are NO other cars on the track with you. There are no obstacles (trees, potholes, dogs, people). Just cones. And the cones never win. I have seen countless \$100,000 + cars, crush a cone, and the car always wins. Not a scuff, not a scratch... NOTHING on the car, but the cone, well that's a different story. These cones are hollow. A baby can push a cone on its side or bend them over. They will NOT hurt your car.

So, there you have it. Autocross: You against the clock. And the only thing in the way are

these soft orange cones.

Yes, by definition Autocross is racing. And for many of us, that's the excitement. How fast can I get through that course?

For others it's just about learning more about their car. What it's capable of doing without putting any risk to driver or car. Learning how to navigate in a panic situation. Are you prepared for the day that a dog runs out in front of your car, or someone runs a red light? Autocross helps fine tune your skills and ability to react to evasive maneuvers that you are likely to encounter in everyday driving. If it hasn't happened to you yet, it will sooner or later. For me, I have just as much fun going fast as I do helping someone who wants to shave a few seconds off their lap time or improve on his or her driving skills. That's the way most everyone is who participates. Helpful.

Age doesn't matter as long as you have your driver's license. You can be 17 all the up to whatever. And many of our competitors are over the half-century mark. So, don't feel like autocross is only for young whippersnappers. It's for EVERYONE.

We all walk the course together and share helpful hints on how to improve or discuss our car's tires. Many of us talk about stuff that has nothing to do with cars. It's a great time to spend a day with a bunch of people that have common interests. Of course you get a nice lunch and all this for a small entry fee.

Best of all, there is a good chance you can walk away from an Autocross event with your Very Own Award or Trophy, as each driver is put into a class specific to what type of car they drive, what year it is...etc. They even have a LADIES' Class. So besides your car specific class the ladies get their own class as well. So no matter if you own an older 914, or a new Turbo, or a First Gen Boxster, or 944, you compete against similar cars in your class. You can even bring your Cayenne. Yes Cayennes can do Autocross too and pretty well in the right hands.

And get this, almost everyone who attends Autocross does it in his or her daily driver. You don't need a racecar, you don't even need any modifications. You can drive your completely STOCK Porsche.

After all Porsche builds their cars to be fast, strong and durable.


Your Car wants to be driven and doing an autocross presents no risk to hurt or over-drive your car. That's what it was made for, to ENIOY.
