Continuing a rundown of our 2010 Events, our Autocross Series will be bigger than ever. This year we will have a Concours Series with a point system similar to our Autocross Series. We are shooting for 4-6 events including the Concours at PorscheFest.

With our newly formed Track Committee we have some very exciting Driver's Ed events lined up, including a summer date at VIR (still tentative as of this writing) and our Club Race, which took a hiatus in 2009, will be one of the premier PCA Club Races of the season.

PorscheFest for 2010 will again be run by Jim Peterson and the crew from the Mountain Area. It looks like it will be another classic Carolinas Region event.

Vince and Vallie Piccirelli have taken on Fall Tour for 2010 after a successful event in 2009. Since Vivian and I had to take a rain check this past year we are looking forward to attending the event this year.

MID-WINTER TRACK SEMINAR Saturday, January 30th, 2010 11 am to 2:00 pm Carolina Motorsports Park, Kershaw, SC

In 2010, we will be adding a July VIR date on July 12th& 13th. Yes, that's a Monday-Tuesday event. We have not done a mid-week event in the past, but open weekends at VIR are as scarce as the proverbial hen's teeth. Hey its July, take a vacation day. We'll try it this summer and see how it goes. We'll still have our Fall VIR date as well.

Now for the real 2010 changes. There are several changes DE participants need to be aware of for 2010.

Tech Inspections – All tech 1) inspections must be completed by an approved tech site. Drivers Education events put an additional load on certain mechanical components. Condition of those components is a serious matter and the inspection should be treated in an appropriate manner. Unfortunately, we've seen an increase in various backyard tech inspections. Beginning with the March 2010 event, tech inspections completed by unapproved vendors will not be accepted. A list of the approved sites is posted on

the web site. Don't dismay if your preferred shop is not an approved site, qualified shops are easily added by contacting Brian Powell. There may be other drivers in your area who are also looking for an approved shop. Advanced Instructors who qualify for the annual tech inspection, must also utilize an approved vendor for their annual inspection.

2) Extended Passing - Our highest run group (Red) will initiate Extended Passing following the guidelines issued by PCA National. EP allows for passing in any place on track with a signal by the car being overtaken. EP is NOT open passing. This will only apply to the Red group, all other run groups will utilize the traditional passing zones. Drivers can express an interest in the EP group during the registration process. However, participation in this group is based on previous driving experience and must be approved by Marty Barrett, our Chief Instructor. Drivers in the red group will be required to attend a mandatory EP drivers meeting and will have additional exercises to complete on track at each event ...

3) Instructor fee – We will be reducing our Instructor fee to \$100. We are blessed with having a large experienced pool of instructors. And we recognize attracting a high caliber of instruction is critical to the success of a DE program. As we are adding more events in 2010, reducing the instructor fee is just a small token to retain the excellent instruction Carolinas Region members have come to expect.

4) Helmets - This is actually advanced notice of a change for 2011 but it does have major implications if you're in the market now. The Snell SA 2010 helmet standard is expected to be released in October. SA2010 helmets should be available shortly thereafter. For use in PCA DE's, we allow the current standard as well as the one previous. In the past and for 2009, Carolinas region has allowed both M and SA rated helmets. However beginning with the standards changeover in 2011, we will only accept SA rated helmets. In a nutshell, beginning with the 2011 season, only SA2005 or SA2010 helmets will be accepted. IF SA2010 helmet production is delayed, SA2000 helmets may be allowed on an event by event basis.

OK, I know that's a lot to cover in one article. But as I said there are a lot of updates before we kick off a big year for the Track committee. We have one or two other surprises up our sleeve, but are still working out those details.
