



At the May DE at CMP we had thirty (30) instructors volunteer to support our Novice and Beginner students. Thanks to all of those guys for volunteering to help....we cannot have a DE without good instructors. Our region is very fortunate to have a large group of PCA certified instructors who enjoy sharing their high speed driving skills with students.

Speaking of PCA instructor certification, we had nine instructor candidates participate in the national training program on Friday, May 14 at CMP. Five are from Carolinas Region and four from other Zone 3 regions. Candidates must have thirty (30) DE track days experience and be capable of driving at pace safely with the DE instructor group. The certification training program

consists of 4-5 hours of classroom presentation and discussion, and two hours of role playing track exercises. Jerry Kilcrease, Bill Williams and Jim Strowd assisted me the presentation and on track evaluations. Thanks guys!

At the DE on May 15-16 we again implemented expanded passing in the Red instructor group. We tried this first in March, but were not able to complete our full evaluation. Expanded passing means that the Red group drivers can pass other cars anywhere on the track... including in the turns. This is not racing, and safety rules are observed and enforced. Wow, it is fun! The evaluation went very well with no warnings or incidents. We will continue to use this venue at future DE events. Five more DE's are scheduled this year! Please come join us!

From the desk of your Historian/Archivist

This month's submission pertains to an interesting article I came across in Porsche 356 Registry, an excellent magazine well worth subscribing to. The article appeared in the Jan/Feb 2009 issue, and was titled Goodbye to the 356, written by Phil Carney.

The point I wanted to emphasize that struck me was the unique manufacturing difference in the car's hood. From page 18 of the article:

"The first aluminum 356s made in Austria had a distinctive, likeable face. Despite his desire to make radical design changes in other areas, Butzi (Ferdinand Alexander "Butzi" Porsche) felt it very important to preserve the classical Porsche sports car features as viewed from the front."

"This photo shows some of the Bauhaus thinking that Butzi put into making the 901 a good example of form-followsfunction. Consider for example the front hood of the 356 versus the 901. The 356 nose is full of compound curves [in this case, a perturbation of a surface which changes its dynamic about the x, y, and z axis routinely, DW] and it was very labor intensive to get all those gaps to be 3mm. The 901 hood on the other hand is based on very subtle curvature with straight seams between the hood and surrounding sheet metal. This made the car significantly easier to manufacture and assemble."

The next Regional event is the Annual Porschefest in Asheville. Hope you went and had a good time.


On June 12-13 we have a DE at NCCAR. This will be our first event at this track. Give it a whorl.

Carolinas PCA Volunteer program with B.R.A.K.E.S.

On January 26, 2008, Doug Herbert experienced every parent's worst nightmare – his two sons, Jon, 17, and James, 12, lost their lives in a tragic automobile accident. Herbert, trying to make sense of the tragedy, decided to form a non-profit organization that would focus on safe driving. He wanted to help prevent others parents, friends and families from enduring the pain of losing a loved one to an automobile accident.

Herbert partnered with Jon's classmates from South Lake Christian Academy to create a name for the safe driving foundation. The students chose B.R.A.K.E.S. – which stands for Be Responsible and Keep Everyone Safe. Herbert took action and quickly applied for 501(c)(3) status. He began to spread the word about the importance of safe driving and developed the B.R.A.K.E.S. Teen Pro-Active Driving School. In 2009, 425 teens attended the Teen Pro-Active Driving School. In 2010, their goal is to top 1000.

However, they can't do it alone. B.R.A.K.E.S needs volunteers to help the organization host fund raising activities, attend public events or hold one of the many B.R.A.K.E.S. Teen Pro-Active Driving Schools. No special skills are required, just a willingness to help.

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death among American teens, so volunteering with the program should be reward enough. But for even more enticement, Carolinas Region PCA will extend a \$50 credit to any 2010 Driver's Ed event for every 8 hrs volunteered. Help out a Saturday at a Pro-Active Driving School program, get \$50 off. Help out at the NHRA Pancake Breakfast for the day, get \$50 off.

To get credit when you volunteer with B.R.A.K.E.S, list Carolinas Region PCA as your company affiliation. What could be simpler? The volunteer form is at http://www.putonthebrakes.org/ under "Get Involved". Volunteer your time assisting teens develop good driving habits and then come out to a Carolinas Region Drivers Education event to hone your own skills.

Now for the fine print. We're giving this a try for 2010 so credits will only be extended for BRAKES events held before year end. Participants can only use one \$50 credit per Drivers Ed event. Credit is non-transferable and limited to PCA members and immediate family only.
