

From the desk of your Historian/Archivist

Dave Wilburn

Perhaps you read my article last month and said "Dave made an error calling it the '901' ". Do you know the story of how the famed 911 number came about?

My Mother bought an excellent coffee table book for me for Christmas 2008 many of you may have seen advertised in Pano: Porsche Sixty Years. I highly recommend it since it contains a great deal of history, both from a manufacturing and racing perspective. It's chock-full of beautiful color photos and covers nearly 350 pages.

Its author, Randy Leffingwell, on page 87 gives the following explanation:

"Meanwhile, Porsche prepared [for] its one show car (a yellow Karmann-produced coupe for Frankfurt) for the next display at the Paris Salon in October. [1963, DSW] There it caught the attention not only of enthusiastic French drivers, but also of Automobiles Peugeot, who disputed model nomenclature with Porsche despite the vast difference between their products. In 1921, Peugeot had introduced a Model 201. The company registered with the French government's office of copyrights and patents to use three-digit model designations using a zero in the middle. The 201 was the second chassis series with a 1.1 liter engine. By 1963, Peugeot's numbers had passed through 301s, 401s and 601s to 203s, 403s and 404s. After Paris closed, Peugeot notified Porsche it could not use the 901 designation in France."

"France was a large market for Porsche. Ferry chose not to antagonize the other carmaker. He didn't remind anyone that 904 GTS Carreras already had raced in France and his 804 Formula One car had won at Rouen Circuit without comment from Peugeot. Porsche renumbered the new car as the 911..."




