Another small part of the

Our By-Laws take into account such situations under Article IV, Section 2:

Vacancies for the office of President and Vice President shall be filled through nomination by the Board and subject to approval by a quorum of the Board of Directors. All Officers appointed due to vacancies will hold that position until the next annual election.

Our next Board Meeting is to be held on Saturday, December 4th prior to the 50th

Anniversary / Holiday Party in Greensboro. This will be one of the main topics on our Agenda. Hopefully we will be able to fill the VP position during that meeting.

2011 will be as busy if not busier than 2010. One of the things that we have to be aware of and plan around is the 2011 Porsche Parade to be held in Savannah July 31st -August 6th. I know that many members in

Former Carolinas Region Presidents Reflect on Porsche Memories

In celebration of the 50th Anniversary of founding of the Carolinas Region PCA, we sat down with eight of the Region's former Presidents to get there memories of what makes our club and Porsche ownership so special.

You Never Forget That **First Encounter**

Fond memories of your first Porsche never seem to fade. Such is the case for Gary Bumgardner, who even remembers the VIN number from that 1972 911T. The car was spotted by a friend who saw it sitting by the side of the road. As Gary tells it, "I actually bought the car without ever having seen or hearing it run. AFTER I paid the guy, we worked to get it cranked. Within 15 seconds of it firing, we couldn't see the ground, our feet, or hands in front of our faces. Apparently there was an oil ring that wasn't doing its job." Marvel Mystery Oil came to the rescue; thus was born a Porsche that served as a touring car, autocross and track car, while

being tweaked constantly along the way. Gary has owned four other Porsche's since that first encounter with the 911T.

As past president and member of the Carolinas Region, the following are some of his favorite memories:

- · Part of a three-person team that resurrected Carolinas' Drivers' **Education Events**
- Contributing \$5000 to the fledgling **Carolinas Motorsports Park** on behalf of the region
- The first ever Club Race at Roebling Road Raceway
- Organizing the very first track event at Carolinas Motorsports Park.

Gary says the best part of being a Porsche owner has been the many special friends

and good times had along the way. "We have been a part of many car clubs over the years, but PCA folks are among the best."

The Short End of the Stick **Eventually Pays Off**

Pete was about to be discharged from the Navy, with no job prospects awaiting him. As he strolled past Brumos Porsche in Jacksonville Florida, the soon-tobe veteran wandered onto the lot. "Never one to be shy, I walked

in and asked for a job," Pete explains. "They hired me on the spot as a sales person. I sold a car my first day, even though I didn't know how many cylinders it had." Life was good in the car biz for Pete until the day when the sales manager wouldn't let any sales staff leave until someone sold a car. "We

had this old beat-up 356 out back and figured that the only way out was to draw straws among ourselves; the short straw would buy the car." So readers, guess who got the short end of the straw? You guessed it. "This became my first Porsche," Pete said. But it was a short love affair. Monday morning I told the manager where he could put the job and the car!"

Pete became a Porsche owner legitimately a number of years later, and it became a part of his family. "We went to Parades, autocrosses, meetings, and basically every event possible. My wife and kids were as into it as I was. We all worked hard at it and had fun."

He has many fond memories of being a club member and serving as President of the region. One of the most cherished memories is the establishment of the Carolinas Club Race. "My pool table was unusable in October and November because that is where my wife, daughter and I would assemble all of the packages that each racer would get at registration, also run by my wife," he said. "All of that was a long time ago, but I still think of those times fondly." According to Pete, the best part of being a Porsche owner is the people. "That's an easy one. The people make the cars. Cars don't make the people."

B.J. and Ann Craven

Can Owning a Porsche Lead to Marriage?

You bet! As B.J. Craven tells it, the numbers 911 and 914 add up to a match made in heaven. B.J. bought his first Porsche, a tangerine- colored 1968 912 in November of '67 from Reece Burris. 1970 rolls around, "and then I made a mistake," B.J. said. "I test drove a red 1970 911T, and purchased it from Reese at Autohaus Porsche in Charlotte."

Reece Burris again played a pivotal role in B.J's Porsche-life. Four years later, Reece and his wife Susan introduced B.J. to Ann Reynolds, who had just purchased her first Porsche; a white 1974 914 2 liter. "Thirty miles a gallon sounded too good to resist during the gas crunch of that year," B.J. added. "We drove the 911 on hour honeymoon to the '77 Porsche Parade in San Diego for a round trip of 7000 plus adventuresome miles. The first 928 to be displayed in the states was at that Parade. And since the Porsche bug had bitten us bad, we purchased a Caribe blue 1978 928. It leaves the garage on special occasions, but with less than 25,000 miles... not very often."

B.J. has served twice as Carolinas Region president. "I can say that Porsche was a focal point of our lives for many years, including

our son Chad, who competed in the inaugural Porsche/Corvette Big Wheel race at CMS. The best part of being a Porsche owner has been the great friendships we gained not only regionally, but also from attending national Parades in Sun Valley, Monterey, Pocono, and San Diego.

The Numbers Tell the Story

To say Bill Funderud is a Porsche enthusiast, is an understatement. Over the past 37 years, Bill has owned 42 (count 'em) 42 Porsches.

"I've owned all types. Too many to list," Bill says. But his current Porsche is a 1994 RS America.

Bill has been an active member of PCA throughout the years, and served as a Carolinas Region president in 1978. Those years add up to lots of memories. Among the activities Bill and his family enjoyed the most were autocross, tours, Christmas parties, Porsche Parades, "and many great times with Porsche friends," Bill added.

No Cure for This Affliction

Cliff Hudgins has an "affliction." It's known as Porsche. Symptoms of the first affliction presented themselves when Cliff was 26 years old. "I was definitely the first in my family and the first sports car nut as well. My career and young family were doing well, and thanks to the recession at that time, Porsche prices were cheap. I had always 🔱 admired them, and felt that this was a good opportunity to try one out." Cliff credits participation in PCA for the

opportunity to meet other sports car enthusiasts. His first position with the club was as the Triad Director in 1995. "At that first meeting I had, one person showed up, Scott. From that meager beginning, we staged an autocross by that summer and by the time I became President in 1996, we were averaging around 20 for our area meetings."

Cliff says he did "some of the work," but felt that would he did best was to promote enthusiasm in other about doing things with their sports cars, whether it be meetings, autocrosses, or drivers education events." His enthusiasm is evidenced by the fact that his "affliction" has lead to sideeffects such as being the owner of nine other Porsche cars.

Helen PCA-It's a Family Affair

Liame 1976 was a landmark year for Helen Lane and her husband Dick. While living in Knoxville Tennessee, Dick bought a Triumph TR-7 and became active in SCCA autocrossing. When his company transferred him to New Jersey that same year, he commuted home on weekends till the house sold, and continued to autocross. One fateful weekend, a friend let Dick drive his 1972 911T. Dick won the class, even beating the cars' owner. Within several months, he was a 911 owner, and in 1980, he and Helen joined PCA.

Helen caught the autocross bug and began competing in the ladies class. Members of PCA for thirty-plus years, Helen and Dick have been affiliated with the Carolinas Region for 21 years, where she served as president in 1991. One of her favorite events was the Sun Fun Run in the 1990's. This high speed autocross took place on the runways of both Macintyre Air Force base, and later North Air Force base. "This was the only high-speed event in the southeast," Helen said.

She adds that one of the best parts about being a Porsche owner is the people. "We've made friends all over the USA." Thirty years of membership, plus lots of friends, adds-up to some great memories. For Helen, some of the most special was serving as co-hospitality Chair of the 1981 Parade in Asheville, where Dick also served as the concours chairman. This, and the 14 or so other Parades, along with being a "competitive autocrosser" have provided years of Porsche camaraderie and fun. Helen and Dick have owned four Porsches over the years. Their 1982 911SC was included in the 2008 Charlotte Parade Historical Porsche display.

An Ugly Duckling Turns into a Swan

"Before driving the 912, I thought Porsche's were ugly," stated Ron Morris. "One drive convinced me of the true inner beauty, and ownership gave me an appreciation for the functionality of the styling." He traded his 1966 MGB for a

"pristine '66 Bahamas gold 911. For Ron, one word describes the best part of being a Porsche owner; driving.

Ron has many fond memories of involvement in the Carolinas region, particularly one event while serving as the region's vice-president. "Some time in the mid-70's, I was vice-president of the Carolinas Region. We were running the annual Porsche-Corvette Challenge at Charlotte Motor Speedway (wide open autocross with no pylons on the road course) and I was responsible for timing and scoring. I think we had close to 100 Corvettes and 100 Porsches. We ran two classes as close as possible to comparative performance for men, but ladies had their own separate class. A mistake was made in awarding a lady Corvette driver First in Class, which should have actually gone to the driver of a 356. It fell on me to go to the Corvette throng in the middle of the trophy presentation and take the trophy back. Their president was Chad Alberty, famous among Carolinas Shaggers. He was very gracious and probably saved me from tar and feathers."

Any Track...Anytime

Brian Sartori is a 944 guy, having owned three since 1999. A self-described "car nut" since early childhood, Brian says "I guess it was inevitable that I would own a Porsche at some time." The Porsche bug bit in 1991 when Brian bought a new 944S2 after he learned of opportunities to drive at tracks like Road Atlanta and PCA Driver Ed events. It was a slippery slope that resulted in the purchase of two more 944 Turbos.

Next year will kick off before you know it. A couple reminders to help prepare for 2011. Beginning with our 2011 events, we can no longer accept SA2000 helmets. PCA guidelines require helmets meet either the current Snell standard or one previous version. Snell has released their 2010 SA helmet standard which now outdates the SA2000 certification for PCA DE events. There are significant updates to the SA2010 standard, also including a SAH nomenclature for helmets manufactured for HANs devices. Only SA2005, SA2010 or SAH2010 helmets will be accepted for our Drivers Education events in 2011. SA2005 certified helmets will continue to be accepted until 2015. If you are looking at helmets and will be purchasing soon, consider the lifespan of each standard. Do not confuse the SA standard with the M2010 standard. M rated helmets are designed for motorcycles and are not accepted for Carolinas Region DE events.

Another reminder that all event tech inspections must be performed by approved inspection locations. The list of approved vendors is available on the region website. For instructors who qualify for annual tech inspection, keep in mind the first inspection of the year must still be performed by an approved inspection location.

Donate Your Old Helmet

Beginning next year (2011), if you participate in PCA Driver's Ed or Club Racing your helmet must be an SA2005, SA2010 or SAH2010. The SA2000 will no longer be accepted at DE events.

Since SA2000, or older Snell-certified helmets, will not be eligible for use at PCA DE or Club Race events, we would welcome your donating it to the Carolinas Region PCA for our Autocross Helmet Loaner Program.

Many newcomers to the attend to their first Autocross events without any helmet protection and the Region provides loaners for them so they can participate and get themselves acclimated to driving events. Because autocross events are ran at much slower speeds than DE's or Club Races, older Snell-certifications are still valid and accepted at autocross events. However, we can only accept SA–certified helmets, not M or K.
