

I autocross a 1965 356SC Cabriolet that I got in 1997. It is a beautiful red car. What you may not know is, that my Dad gave it to me for my 40th birthday. He bought the car in 1967 when I was 10 years old. Carol (my wife) and I went on our first date in it in 1975 while still in high school and it's been in our family for 43 years.

I was sharing this with Cari Steinbrueck at the last autocross of the year and she said I ought to write an article about the car. Well, actually I did! It was published in the 1999 Panorama magazine as a "Personal Porsche". As an active member in the club competing in concours events – as somebody to beat – the car is not competitive if you're closer than 5 feet, competing in autocross events for a number of years, participating in the national Porsche Parade in Charlotte and Porschefests put on by the Carolinas Region, you may be familiar with the car. But, not "the story".

I was not really planning to attend the 50th Anniversary of the Carolinas Region Christmas Party. I didn't need to attend. My Dad, also a Phil Evans, has "acted in my behalf" in the past getting any award presented to me so I was planning on letting him get mine this year, if I won. But after Cari'squestioning, I called Sadie and

Jerry Kilcrease and asked if it was too late to register for the Christmas Party and to "shhhhh...not tell Mom and Dad." They were happy to have me decide to come and she assured me she would let me surprise them. She also mentioned Mom and Dad had been the first ones to sign up for the Region's Christmas Party in Greensboro. This year the Christmas Party in Greensboro would be taking a look back at our region's history and Harvey had sent out a request for any memorabilia. I thought the article written by a Carolinas Region member that was published in the national magazine might qualify, so I set about making it presentation quality. Then, as I put the three panel plaque together, I was again reminded of how blessed I was to have parents that shared the Porsche experience with me and decided maybe I could share it with the club since we were celebrating an anniversary event. It was settled.

When I got to the hotel ballroom in Greensboro on that cold, snowy Saturday December evening, I "snuck" into the room and found Sadie. Mom and Dad had already gotten there. She got me quietly signed in and I mentioned the plaque to her and Jerry. By the way, they did an outstanding job putting the Christmas Party together. I know it takes a lot of people, but I'm pretty sure they were on "the point". We hid the plaque up front and Jerry said he'd allow me to "say a few words". The plan was coming together perfectly. I was able to sneak up on Mom and then Dad and get a big "Hello!, What are you doing here?" from both of them as well as a big hug. They were smiling the rest of the evening.

After a very lovely evening of dinner with friends, an over view of the clubs history by Harvey Yancey, a congratulations by the National PCA representative, and the presentation of the current and past Presidents of the region, Jerry Kilcrease and Sean Steinbrueck began the presentation of the Autocross Awards. My name was called first and my Dad stood up in a comical gesture, and then "allowed me" to go get the 2010 Autocross Series Class First Place Award for Class P01. As planned, I was given the microphone, and I am sure people were wondering what "few words" I might have. I introduced myself and mentioned the car, and then shared the attached "story" as a read a part of the 1999 article which is attached. I took that opportunity to tell the story of how a small red Porsche became "an Evans". And, I thanked my Dad (again) for what he had shared with me, and took the time to share my appreciation for him

in introducing me to so many new friends in the Porsche Club. But ultimately, what was witnessed was a son, in an intimate way showing his appreciation and love to his Mom and Dad.
