

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

Updates, Updates, Updates ...

One of the ideas that I mentioned last month was the concept of a Regional Planning Meeting separate from the Board Meeting. The problem that we ran into was adding additional dates to an already busy schedule for our Board and Staff. A compromise was found by moving the Planning Meetings (aka Breakout Sessions) to earlier in the mornings of the regularly scheduled Board Meetings and then pushing the Board Meeting to an hour or so later.

We implemented the above format at our first Board Meeting of the year on January 15th. While we had some logistical challenges (we had to use two different venues) the overall feedback and the resulting productivity was positive. As a result we will continue to use this format in the future and making tweaks where they are needed.

By-Laws

The By-Law Committee reported that we should have an initial draft available around the March time frame. While many of the unique aspects of the current Carolinas Regions By-Laws will be incorporated this will be in essence a complete re-write as to adhere to the guidance provided by PCA National last year. Once the draft is completed we will make it available for review and comment to the Membership.

Everyone at the meeting was incredible impressed with the 'look and feel' of the design as well as some very unique features that will allow members quick and easy access to all the information from the Region. Don said that we are looking at a March/April launch of the new site. Stay tuned.

The Event formerly known as 'PorscheFest' Many of you saw my emails about the Naming Contest for our Multi-Event Weekend, which will be held in Charlotte this year on June 10-11-12. Many of the responses I received expressed anger towards Porsche and their seeming heavy handedness in the restricted usage of their name. Actually the fault lies with our legal system. In our country if a company does not actively defend their trademarks

does not actively defend their trademarks they can (and do) lose control of them. For example, below are some examples of trademarks that lost their legal protection in the US:

- Aspirin, originally a trademark of Bayer AG
- Butterscotch, originally a trademark of Parkinsons
- Escalator, originally a trademark of Otis Elevator Company
- Kerosene, originally a trademark of Abraham Gesner
- Phillips-head screw, named after Henry
 F. Phillips
- Pogo for the toy Pogo stick
- Thermos, originally a trademark of Thermos GmbH
- Yo-yo, originally a trademark of Duncan Yo-Yo Company
- Zipper, originally a trademark of B.F. Goodrich

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
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As I entered into the sweeping left-hander, I gently rolled off the throttle. While there were no caution lights or yellow flags, I sensed that there was something on the pavement. The car ahead of me was into the outside wall and the car behind was gaining on me as I decelerated. The front end shuddered signaling the tires were at the limit and searching for traction. Calling on all my accumulated driving skills, I applied some trail braking to transfer some additional load on the front tires while being careful not upset the balance of the car. I held my line and was able to accelerate down the straight-a-way. The guy behind me over-braked and spun.

Was I at turn two at Carolinas Raceway in Kershaw, or turn 5 at VIR? No, I was on my way to the Carolinas Region's 2010 Christmas party in a driving snow storm. The overpass on I-74 had frozen and except for the dry two-track path in the snow, it had become a sheet of ice. I arrived safe and sound with nary a scratch on my car. That's why YOU should autocross and why I'm sharing a few thoughts so you won't feel like such a "newby".

My First Autocross

The autocross is the second most popular form of motorsports racing behind drag racing based upon driver participation. It is

a one car at-a-time timed driving event, usually in a large empty parking lot, through a series of "gates and turns" created by soft orange cones (traffic pylons) at speeds usually below 45 mph. With just a bit of common sense and alertness, it is a very safe form of racing.

Honestly, I really didn't know what I was doing when I went out to my first PCA autocross about five years ago in my 1965 356. I figured I would not be competitive and I figured would make a fool of myself. But, I also thought it was time to see how the car really handled. I was right on all counts. I spun my car in a cloud of blue tire smoke going into the first turn, and I got lost

amongst all those cones for a DNF (Did Not Finish untimed run). Both of those are "rookie mistakes". However, I began learning the limits of my car and my abilities; that's useful information, and I had a terrific time.

Your First Autocross – General Suggestions and what to expect:

Your first autocross can be much more successful than mine by setting a few goals. The goals could be as simple as arriving on time, getting registered, getting the car teched, participating, and getting home all in one piece.

So, here are some hints to help make that first autocross successful:

Get to the autocross early. If registration starts at 8:00 or 8:30, be there "when the doors open". Find a parking spot in the "paddock" area where other cars are being parked in preparation for the autocross. Usually the parking area is obvious, because a few cars are typically trailered in. Actually, you can be there a bit earlier and help set out cones or chalk the outline of cones if you'd like to. Hint #1: Make sure your tire pressures are at least to the manufacturer's recommendations and being early will help relieve the rushed feelings.

> Go to the registration table and get signed up. The registration ladies are especially nice and helpful. They'll get you and everyone else with you to sign a standard PCA release form, assign you to a "run group" (usually blue or green) and they may ask if you have a particular

car number you prefer. Hint #2: Since the numbers are created by blue "painter's" tape which comes off easily, ask/suggest a car number using straight lines such as "1's", "4's" and "7's". Particularly popular numbers are 11 or 41 or 71. I can get creative with the tape and can make 2's and 5's so don't over stress about the number.

Find the blue tape (often at the table) and go put your number on your car's doors. While at your car, empty it of all loose items such as coffee cups, cell phones, golf clubs and maybe that heavy spare tire and jack. **Hint** #3: Bring an old beach towel or blanket, don't pull all the way into the parking space and put your stuff on the towel in front of your car. A lawn chair is useful too. Return the tape to the table, or more often someone will find you to "borrow" the tape. Ask them to return it to the registration table.

Find the "Tech guy" carrying the torque wrench and let him know you're ready to have him come over to your car. He'll thoroughly inspect the car to make sure it's safe for the autocross. He'll check to make sure the battery is tied down securely, there's no junk in the trunk or cabin, no leaking fluids, no loose hoses or wiring in the engine compartment and that the wheel lug nuts are torques correctly (96 ft lbs.) He has a "soft socket" so he won't scratch your car's lug nuts. He'll then put a "sticker" on the windshield indicating that he's inspected the car. Hint #4: Thank the Tech guy. He's your friend.


Attend the announced "Driver's meeting". The autocross chairman will review the safety rules, caution about driving slowly outside the course, will make you aware of course workers and their duties, and other possible safety hints. He'll also go over the staging of the cars for

the start of the autocross. Safety is emphasized and I have never seen anyone hurt at an autocross.

Walk the course. Hint #5: Walk the course again! I usually walk the track to memorize the layout so I won't "get lost" and go off course. A DNF means your run is not timed. As you walk the course, imagine yourself driving your car looking for the best way to enter and exit various turns within the course. If you can, walk it with a friend and discuss the layout. The course unfolds very quickly once you get in the car. By the way, if you're looking for a friend at the next autocross, come find me. I drive a red 356 and I would be glad to introduce myself to you and walk the course, again.

At the Drivers meeting, they will announce the run groups and you will either be driving or "volunteering". Being a volunteer usually involves "working" a corner with another participant or two in your run group. (The other run group "volunteers" when your group is driving). You will not be alone on your first autocross. Let someone know you're new if you have concerns. Your primary job will be to replace the soft orange cones hit by your competitors. A knocked over cone adds 2 seconds to your run time and makes you uncompetitive.

Once your run group turn arrives, get in your car, put on your seat belt and be prepared to put on your helmet. Loaner helmets are available and there are plenty. Get one that fits, and if you wear glasses, try the helmet on to make sure you're comfortable. Driving slowly from the paddock (parking area) to the grid, get in line. Hint # 6: There is no real run order except to follow the car in front of you. Course workers will show you where to line up. (continued on page 10)




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Watch the cars as they launch off the starting line, and go ahead and put the helmet on to give yourself time to get settled. Once it's your turn to go, watch the starter and go once you are given the "go" signal. Your actual time doesn't start until you break the start-line electronic timer. You want to try to drive fast, but also smoothly and quickly, remaining on course and avoiding the cones. Your run will end quickly and you'll be given a time. Drive slowly while off the course, go get back in line behind the car that ran before you and get ready for your next run. Typically, you'll get three runs in the morning and three after the lunch break. Lunch is usually pizza and soft drinks and you can use the time to make some new friends.

As the day develops, check out your times and see if they improved. Push yourself and your car. The car will be fine. Typically, you will never get out of second gear while driving around the cones in a parking lot. You may slide the car some and make the tires squeal.

After the event is over, stay and help pick up the cones off the track. A whole lot of effort went into setting up the event and with all the folks still there, we can tear down an autocross track in about 15 minutes. Your main job will be to collect the cones, flags, extinguishers and get them near or on the trailer. Then watch as the trophies are given out, go to the paddock and load your stuff back in your car and drive "slowly" home. You've become a better and safer driver and you also have a much better feel for your car as it approaches its limits. You never know, it may "save you" on a cold snowy over pass and you might also get addicted to the second most popular form of motorsports racing-the autocross.

Next time, we'll review how to go fast.

Are you ready? 2011 Carolina PCA Autocross Series

The 2011 Carolinas PCA Autocross Series starts its season soon. Our goal is to hold at least 6 events. Results of each autocross, along with the current standings of the year-long Drivers Points Championship, will be in Tobacco Roads every month and on the website, www.carolinas-pca.com., so drivers can track how they are doing in their class as well as their fellow competitors.

At the end of the season, Year End Autocross Awards will be handed out for 1st and 2nd Place in each class, Mens and Ladies. To score points in the year-long championship series, drivers must have attended at least 4 out of 6 races.

Class points will be awarded for each autocross event as follows:

1st Place	6 Pts.
2nd Place	4 Pts.
3rd Place	3 Pts.
4th Place	2 Pts.
5th Place and beyond	1 Pt.

The year-end points total will be based off your best 5 finishes out of 6 events. So don't worry if you miss 1 event, or have a bad day. No worries. Everyone gets one mulligan.

This year our car classes will be based on the standardized PCA classes. These classifications are listed below and will be in each issue of Tobacco Roads as well as on our website. If you are uncertain what class your car would be categorized in, please feel free to send us an e-mail.

- M01: (All 4 Cylinder, up to 1999cc; All 4 Cylinder, 2000cc up to 2699cc; All 4 Cylinder, 2700cc and above; All 6 Cylinder, up to 2399cc)
- MO2: (All 6 Cylinder and above, 2400cc up to 3199cc; All Turbo/Supercharged 4 Cylinder; & All 6 Cylinder and above, 3200cc and above; All Turbo/Supercharged 6 cylinder and above)

Driver's Education Reports: Text by Brian Powell and Marty Barrett



Registration is open for NCCAR event!

By the time you're reading this, we've had our **Winter DE seminar**. Or at least, I hope that's the case assuming the weather had cooperated. The snow certainly has come early and often this year. At the DE seminar, we explain the PCA Drivers Education program and answer questions before the DE year kicks in full steam. It also gives those attending a chance to see the CMP facility and tour the track.

Registration is open for our first event of the year. In 2 short months, we'll be kicking off the 2011 Drivers Ed season at the North Carolina Center for Automotive Research, or NCCAR. NCCAR is located in eastern North Carolina, just of I-95 in Roanoke Rapids. NCCAR (www.nccar.us) offers an 11 turn, 2 mile road course. NCCAR also offers us an opportunity to visit a facility with lodging and restaurants conveniently located to the track. Roanoke Rapids offers ten hotels within 6 miles of the track. In population and size, Roanoke Rapids slots about half way between Danville, Va for VIR and Camden, SC for CMP. Most of the common franchise restaurants are located one exit from the track at I-95 and US158, a quick 4 mile drive south. So if you're the type who wants to roll out of bed at 7:45, grab a Starbucks (also right there on US158 too) and get to the track by 8 am, NCCAR is for you. If after a days workout on track, you dread the 30 minute commute to Camden, within 5 minutes of coming off track at NCCAR you can be showering back in your hotel. For more information on the area, visit www. visithalifax.com.

Registration will be online using ClubRegistration.net. As a rule, registration for an event will open 2 months prior to the event. Be sure to visit the DE page on our region website as well. We have a lot of good information there such as our Drivers Ed Guide and the approved tech inspection list. Our dates for this year are:

2011 Kick off at NCCAR facility on April 2-3.

Return to CMP on May 14-15

Summer VIR North on July 18-19

CMP Fall date on Sept 10-11

Season Finale at VIR on November 18-20

LAST REMINDER on helmet changeover: For ALL our 2011 dates, only SA2005, SA2010 or SAH2010 helmets will be accepted for our Drivers Education events in 2011. SA2005 certified helmets will continue to be accepted until 2015. Be sure to check your helmet in plenty of time to obtain a new one if necessary.

2011 Drivers Ed Program Update

By Marty Barrett, Chief Instructor:

Again in 2011 Carolinas Region has a very aggressive DE events schedule that was kicked off on January 29 with the Winter Track Seminar. Our first DE is at NCCAR in April and registration is open. Don't forget the new drivers helmet rules: SA2005 or SA2010/SAH2010; and approved shop inspections for all cars, including instructors. New annual inspections are required for instructors.

A couple of other changes to the program this year:

- For novice students, i.e. Green Run Group: beginning with the May DE at CMP we will introduce a series of low speed driving exercises during the second run session on Saturday. Drivers will be broken up into four groups and proceed to the designated section of the CMP track. At each location instructors will have set up one of the following exercises: emergency braking, emergency lane change, 5 cone slalom course, and flag recognition. Drivers spend about 10 minutes at each exercise and move to the next position.

- For solo drivers, i.e. White & Black Run Groups: Beginning with the May DE at CMP drivers will attend a new classroom session

on advanced track driving skills. The purpose is to build upon the driving skills developed by solo DE drivers to prepare them for safe expanded passing. Our White & Black group drivers are restricted to passing areas that allow ample space and time to signal and pass safely... generally straight sections of the track. As these skills are practiced and refined over multiple DE events some drivers want more passing zones to preclude "trains" and to facilitate faster, smoother track speeds. To move from White to Black the driver must have thirty track days of DE experience, participate in this classroom, and have a check ride with a senior instructor while driving in the Black run group. The advanced skills classroom will focus on: threshold braking, trail braking, left foot braking, heel & toe braking/gear changes, no coasting, signaling – hand signals, the aggressive line, leaving racing room while passing in corners, off-line control, serpentine passing, and when not to pass.

- **DE Instructor Certification:** Experienced drivers who want to instruct at DE events must successfully complete the PCA National DE Instructor Certification program. Again this year we will conduct this training at CMP on Friday, May 13 of the DE weekend. Interested drivers should have a minimum thirty DE track days and have a recommendation from a PCA instructor who is certified. Participation requires registering with Turn1 at CMP for the Friday track day. Please let me know by May 1 if you are qualified and intend to participate, or if you have questions about instructing with PCA.






