From the Driver's Seat

The 'New' Porsche

With the ownership of Porsche transitioning to Volkswagen it is apparent that the stated goal of getting the sales volume up to 150,000 (vs the peak of 100,000 a few years ago) is well underway. Several new models have already been confirmed. Among those in the pipeline are the 550 (a sub-Boxster model based on the 2009 VW BlueSport Roadster Concept), the Cajun (Cayenne Junior) and the 918 Spyder.

A sub-Boxster model has been hotly debated within the walls of Porsche AG for years. The stance before the VW take over was that a lower priced, high volume model would dilute the marque and was never pursued. Now the 550 (aka the 'New' 356) is approved for production and should be in Porsche showrooms in 2013. The engine (appropriately 4-cylinder boxer and possibly a turbo version also) will be unique to the 550 (there will be VW and Audi derivatives of the shared chassis however). I am hopeful that Porsche does justice to the legendary 550 name.

The Cajun (a working name but I think it would match well with the 'spicy' SUV theme) was another model that was looked at prior to the VW merger but not approved for the same reasons mentioned above. The new baby SUV will be based on the Audi Q5. Multiple engines will be available including a NA V6, a turbo-diesel V6 and a twin turbo V6.

For us mere mortals just seeing a 918 Spyder in the flesh, when it arrives in late 2013, will be an experience much less getting the chance to drive one. At \$845,000 and a production number of only 918 ensure exclusivity. But look for the technology pioneered in the 918 to trickle down to the more pedestrian models in a few short years.

Other models being discussed are a 2-door variant of the Panamera (a latter day 928 anyone?) and a smaller 4 door sedan that may spawn a 2-door and a convertible. There are even rumors of a mid-engined model above the 911 Turbo but below the 918. That model would directly take on the Ferrari 458 Italia in sales and in racing (it is unclear how Porsche would address the outcry of purists that only accept the 911 chassis for sports car racing). A radical but exciting possibility. Stay tuned.

Closer on the horizon are the new 911 (aka 991) due later this year and the next gen Box-

ster and Cayman which will be out in 2012. The 911 will carry the traditional silhouette on a longer wheel base. The Boxster and Cayman will also be a bit bigger than the current models. Expect electric power steering and 7-speed manual transmissions to be standard on all.

Some would say all the new models dilute Porsche and prove that it has lost its 'soul'. In my view successful organizations change with the times and Porsche has done so pretty convincingly. Plus a company that can make cars like the GT3 RS 4.0 and the GT2 RS clearly has not lost its direction ... or its 'soul'.

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Sponsor and Host for the Monthly Metrolina Area 'Shine & Show'

On April 16, Zuffenhaus/Eurowerks celebrated its 9th anniversary and with its first Open Haus at its new home in historic downtown Monroe, 13 miles east of Charlotte.

The forecast was ominous, but the threat of severe weather did not deter friends and clients from joining the celebration, some of whom arrived before the event began. This event served to both introduce Monroe to its newest Porsche business and to welcome PCA to the new facility. The Monroe Chamber of Commerce was on hand to welcome Zuffenhaus/Eurowerks to the area, and the Mayor of Monroe arrived to cut the ribbon on their newest member company and show local support for the business and clientele.

The early crowd enjoyed local gourmet coffee during the preparation and detailing of the 20 plus Zuffenhaus-prepped cars that were put on display on the front lawn and throughout the 16,000 square foot shop facility.

These cars included full competition cars, custom street builds and aggressive dual-purpose cars.. All eras were present and accounted for, from 1964 356 Notchback Coupe to 2010 997 GT3, and several impressive BMW models.

The car show on the lawn was accompanied by the incredible aroma of local barbecue, smoked overnight on-site by Steven and Heather Coward, and Blues and Old-Time guitar played live by local musician Shelton Powe from the mezzanine overlooking the shop.

Guests were free to wander the shop and examine major fabrication and restoration jobs in process, including a reproduction

of the 1973 Martini 'Mary Stuart' RSR (the 1973 Targa Florio winner), a 1972 RSR Prototype reproduction based on a 4.0 liter 964, a 3.6 liter 356 project, and rehabilitation work in process..

On display was the entire range of Zuffenhaus Products' vintage Porsche reproduction parts as well as, steering wheels, hubs, and road wheels...

Monitors in the upstairs conference room played several clips of the multiple-hour testing sessions in which racing conditions were replicated in the test facility.

As the much anticipated storms rolled in and passed, all gathered in the shop for multiple technical demonstrations and Q/A sessions. The technical demonstrations were focused on:

- Touch-less Tire Mounting and Road Force Balancing,
- Alignment and setup for lowered & competition cars
- Air Conditioning Evacuation and Recharge processes for Porsche vehicles.

The storms turned out to short-lived, and left in their wake one of the most beautiful days of the year, allowing everyone to take advantage of the acreage and enjoy the day. Fifty pounds of barbecue were served hot off the cooker, and local businesses provided complimentary beverages and drawings for prizes.

The night ended with a DJ and local band One Big Love set up on the loading dock rocking out the tunes for those who were not ready to end their day when the sun set. The last of the guests departed around 10pm, after thoroughly enjoying a day dedicated to fine Porsches and great friends.

The ample facilities demonstrated the potential of the site to be beneficial for PCA as a location for local and regional gatherings. The seven acres lends itself to picnics and concours on the grass, while the 7000 square feet of Class A office space includes generous meeting/conference rooms.

It is the hope of Zuffenhaus/Eurowerks that this was just the first of many events to be hosted at the new facilities. Tremendous gratitude is expressed to all who came out to make this inaugural Open Haus a success.

The Historian's Desk By Lou Scalzo

On May 12th, I had the honor to meet with someone I consider a true friend that I have know for years, Ralph "Mutt" Brawley. I joined him and his wife Donna after work at his home and shop located in Mooresville N.C.

Ralph, is well known in the restoration business and is a Master coach builder and metal man. If perfection is what you are after, and it absolutely has to be right, Ralph is the right guy for the job. His expertise in the "art of working with metal" goes back five decades. The name of his business is "Coach Craft" and many car collectors, and Porsche lovers through out the years, have been taking their rusted or damaged Porsche's to his shop, knowing that Ralph will be able to work his mastery on their vehicle and it will be good as new. - actually even better when they get it back. Over years he has restored literally hundreds of 911s, almost as many 356s, many 550s, RSKs and many other collectable race cars.

Ralph who is a native of North Carolina, actually started his career in Colorado Springs. His mother sent him to live with his uncle who was in the Air Force, and designed uniforms for officers and personnel in the academy. While living there Ralph's father's friend George Freeze, was able to arrange a job for him at Ed Kyle's foreign car shop. Ralph said that one of his very

first jobs at his new employer was to repair a car with the German badge - Porsche - a racing RSK, that was bought by owner/driver Bob Donner, who had bought the RSK from Texas in a wrecked state from another well known racer Hap Sharpe, who later worked for Jim Hall of Chaparral fame!

In continuing the story about Bob Donner's RSK, Ralph tells me that Donner bought the car to repair and race at the up coming Pikes Peak Hillclimb in Colorado. "We repaired the car and it was able to make the

race, but afterwards when it came back we had to restore it again," Ralph said. The RSK's aluminum skin was damaged

extensively from the inside out, caused by the tough gravel surface at the infamous hill-climb!

In late 1960 Ralph returned to Charlotte, N.C. and worked in the auto body department at Young Ford. In 1963 he was drafted into the Army and was stationed in Munich, Germany. In 1965 he returned to Charlotte and Terry's Plymouth dealership for three years working auto body.

In 1968, having worked for someone else long enough and having a good amount of experience in the auto body field, he decided to open his own shop in Mooresville, N.C, called Coach Craft. In the early days Ralph did general collision work, paint and body on any type of automobile to establish his business. As his business continued to prosper, Ralph tended to gravitate towards the Porsche marque, as the automobile he preferred to repair. When asked why, Ralph explained, "My interest in working on the

Porsche cars was due to their high quality and tolerances. The cars would come into the Charleston Harbor new from Germany. The fit and finish where always the very best; perfect gaps on body lines, and metal workmanship, paint and finish. Always superior to anything else made at the time. To me with a Porsche, you started with quality and ended with quality"

Ralph has been in the restoration business so long, he has a rich history of many sig-

nificant Porsche rebuilds. He shared only a few of the good ones with me - there are plenty more. Here's just a few of the projects we discussed during my visit.

One of his early restorations was a Silver 914-6, owned by a local businessman Reagan Rowe, retired president of the R.S. Bullany Corporation and past PCA president. This car went on to take awards at Porsche Parade. Over the years, Ralph's abilities at Coach Craft grew and so did his customer base.

"When the 911 replaced the 356, it was the hot car to have and the 356 popularity had diminished some what," Ralph said. "So you could buy them for a reasonable price in the late 60's and early 70's." He then added that he even gave away eight 356's in the 70's because they where so abundant and he didn't have time to restore them. If he had only had a crystal ball into the future! Because of his restoration and repair business, Ralph contacted a fellow in Willoughby, Ohio named Chuck Stoddard, founder of the famed Stoddard Motors. He was looking to buy a Celete Jig, for 911 repair. "The Porsche factory would only sell the jigs to factory authorized dealerships" Ralph explained. After several conversations. Chuck realized that Ralph was indeed a serious restorer and agreed to sell him one. Over the years they became good friends and still are to this day. "Chuck,

started his business out of a two-car garage in Ohio, and had contacted Max Hoffman of Manhattan Motors in New York City about buying an Alfa Romeo dealership. According to Ralph, Max told Chuck "if you want a Alfa dealership, you will have to buy a Porsche dealership also from me to get one." Porsche wasn't well known back then and Hoffman was trying to establish the brand in the states. Once he got started, Stoddard realized the value of the Porsche marque early on and started buying up NOS 356 parts from suppliers in Germany.

"Everybody wanted the 911 stuff. The 356 parts where considered obsolete" stated Ralph. In the mid 70's when strong interest in 356's was revived, and prices on them rose drastically, Porsche wanted to buy the stuff back from Chuck," Ralph said. Well in the 80's they did indeed. They ended up buying the whole dealership from Chuck Stoddard for a sum of over seven million dollars." Today if you want a new vintage part for your Porsche, Stoddard Imports in Willoughby, Ohio, is a major source for restoring a vintage Porsche.

Ralph continued by offering his opinion about the difference of the Porsche experience back in the early days, and how things began to change when Peter Shutz took over as the CEO for Porsche AG in the late 70's. "Shutz had come to Porsche af-

ter running the Caterpillar Corporation, and was a numbers guy. He wanted to boost Porsche's sales numbers in a big way. He started mass selling and leasing programs of the 911, 928 and 944 line. It boosted the sales numbers but also fundamentally changed the customer base. It introduced Porsches to people that normally wouldn't be driving one." He then added, "Before that, Porsche never quite made enough cars each year, so there was always a little shortage, and a type of artificial demand. If you owned a well kept, nice Porsche in the early 70's and owned for about 5 years, you could drive it and enjoy, then sell it for more than you paid for it!" According to Ralph, it was also a "smaller, tighter, group of folks that would flash their headlights at each other when passing on the road. It was a different market and a different world back then."

One of his best customer's turned out to be Charlie Hunter, a retired Coca Cola executive from Virginia. Over the years, Ralph restored many award winning cars for Charlie, including the last Carrera Speedster built. Ralph explained that, "after this car sold new, there was another so called last speedster, built five months later at the factory from new spare Carrera drivetrain parts. It is the only one from the factory that is painted the same color for the body and the under-carriage."

The car was also bought by Charlie, and restored by Ralph. Success was a team effort -Ralph doing the metal coach work and paint. The other team member was Weldon Schogam, out of Virginia, who did the assembly and mechanical work. Other cars owned by Charlie Hunter include a 1956 Carrera Cabriolet with six thousand original miles, discovered on the island of Guam. It was disassembled, reblocked, and re-finished "to remove factory defects. It was also restored to Concours specs. On a brand new 1989 911 speedster, Charlie spent \$6000 replacing new parts installed by factory that where determined to not be to "concours spec." The last car restored for Charlie was a 550 spyder. During the late 1980's and early 1990's, Charlie Hunter was a dominant figure in the PCA concours circuit, winning the coveted "Manhattan Trophy" five times, with all the work done at Coach Craft and G&W!

Another great story Ralph shared was that of a minister's 1965 356 Black Coupe. Ralph got a call one day around 1979-1980, from a Methodist Minister living in China Grove, who a Porsche he wanted to sell. He wondered if would Ralph be interested. It had been donated to the church by a wealthy owner years earlier, supposedly as an "economy car from Germany."

It had originally been driven in the low country of South Carolina, but was now in a barn outside of China Grove. Well at first "I didn't show much interest," Ralph stated. "I had guite a bit of 356 stuff at the shop already." But the minister was persistent and contacted Ralph again a few weeks later. Ralph agreed to make the 15 mile drive to look at it. He had to stop and get the keys from the church, then drive down a very narrow, long driveway to get to a old farmhouse and barn. He opened the barn door to find a nice old Ford farm tractor "that I wouldn't mind owning," he states. Behind the tractor, after he removed a bunch of old blankets that rested on top of a beautiful, black with equally perfect grey leather interior, '65 356 coupe, with 23k orig. miles. "I did not argue over the asking price, once I saw the car. I gladly paid the minister the \$8000.00" A true barn story if there ever was one!

I also asked Ralph how far gone can a Porsche be, but still be restorable "As long as the serial numbers on the cowling was intact and verifiable, we could restore it" he stated. So you see, there still may be hope out there for some of those "ran when parked" cars out there.

In the late '90's Ralph actually constructed

six speedster bodies from sheet stock plain sheet metal, that is - to factory spec. Just amazing!

In 1997, Ralph decided to close Coach Craft for awhile, and take a new direction in life after losing his first wife Melissa, after a long courageous battle to cancer. "Rick Hendrick approached me about working in his NASCAR racing effort. "I went to work on a process to stamp metal bodies for the racing program." Today Hendrick racing is one of the few teams that are able to build cars this way, improving the precision and time required for this process. In 2007 Ralph retired from the Hendrick NASCAR racing team to work for Rick restoring his vast collection of about 300 cars.

In a large shop of 48,000 square feet with 16 employees, he works full time during the day and has re-opened Coach Craft at his own shop located behind his home. I once asked Ralph what his favorite color for a 356. His response - "Metal is my favorite, natural color" "Mutt" Brawley is *The* Metal Man.



NC on June 10-12. The Concours will be held Saturday morning, June 11th, between 9:00 AM and 12:00 PM on Congress Street which is adjacent to the Marriott Renaissance Charlotte SouthPark Hotel. Check their web site for map

info. You will see that the location is easy to get to for both entrants and spectators.

Now why do we have such an event and why is there only one? The answer to the first part is that believe it or not, some of us really enjoy cleaning our cars to the point that we want to compete against other such individuals. This was clearly evident during Porsche Parade 2008 when many Carolinas Region members competed in the Concours. The answer to the second part is that it takes a lot of time and effort by both the participants and organizers to have a judged Concours.

So why would anyone want to clean their car just to have someone point out dirt to them? The best reason is that in preparing for a judged event you learn much about your car and do cleaning and maintenance that preserves its' appearance and reliability.

Each judged Concours may vary as to how you display your car and exactly what is judged but the bottom line is simple. Ultimately the judges will be looking for **DIRT**. At SommerFest four areas are judged: Exterior; Interior, Trunk and Engine. The undercarriage of the vehicle and wheel well area are not judged nor are areas of the wheels beyond the face and outer rim area.

Let's look at each area and see what you want to do:

Exterior: Wash/Clay Bar/Wax or Polish/Touch up paint chips/Treat rubber trim/Clean gas filler area/Clean glass & mirrors/Clean wheels & tires

Interior: Vacuum/Clean upholstery & carpet/Clean & treat leather surfaces/Empty all storage areas/Treat vinyl areas/Clean windows & mirrors/Clean & lubricate all hinges & seat tracks

Trunk: Vacuum & clean carpet/Clean & lubricate hinges/Clean tool kit & inspect for completeness/Clean & inspect air compressor/Clean & lubricate jack/Clean & inspect spare tire/Clean battery & battery area/Check battery for serviceability

Engine: Remove excess dirt & grease/Inspect hoses & belts/Clean & lubricate hinges

Sounds simple right? Well it is. You just need to be thorough and remember if you can find dirt then a judge probably will as well.

Now that you have it clean, let's look at how you have to display your car at SommerFest during the Concours.

 Show up early to complete your cleaning and stage your car. Judging is scheduled to start at 9:00 AM. No cleaning of vehicles is allowed after judging begins except for light dusting. Violations will result in disqualification for trophy competition.

- All vehicles will have retractable windows down approximately 1 inch.
- All cabriolets will be shown with tops up. Owners can choose to display the vehicles with tops down but will be assessed penalty points.
- 4. All vehicles will display standard items stored in the trunk. All of these items will be displayed on the ground adjacent to the vehicle for judge's inspection and should be displayed prior to the judges' arrival so as not to delay the Concours.
- All additional mats other than carpeting will be removed.
- 6. No prior trophies or pictures will be part of the display.
- 7. Vehicles with foldable back seats will display them in the upright position.
- 8. Vehicles will be available for judge's inspection initially with all areas closed and then upon the direction of the judges the owner or designee will open doors, trunk, engine bay, gas filler area and all storage areas for inspection.

Now for the inevitable questions:

Boxsters/Caymans will be allowed additional time to make their engine bays available for inspection since this involves removal of the engine cover. Owner's can choose to not display their engine but will be assessed penalty points assigned to the engine area. Tools for this task and expertise to do so are the responsibility of the owner. Practice prior to the day of the event and plan on having a friend or fellow entrant that is knowledgeable of the task to assist. Judges will not assist unless requested to do so prior to the event and agree to the request.

Newer cars have fewer items in the trunk than old cars. We only expect you to show what comes standard with your car; old cars usually spare tire, jack, tool kit and air compressor; new cars can be as little as a tool kit. Penalty points will be assessed for missing or incomplete items.

Originality is not a judged item in our event. Any aftermarket item is acceptable except for a small block Chevy V8. Kit cars are not allowed to participate.

We hope that most of you drive and enjoy your cars. We are not looking for museum pieces or trailer queens. Clean your car and bring it to the event. You learn from every Concours and you will never find all the dirt. You just hope the judges do not either.



Hurricane Region DE vir South Course, June 18-19





The Hurricane Region, Porsche Club of America, will conduct a Master Driver high performance driver education event in conjunction with Twelfth Annual "VIR Governor's Cup" at the Virginia International Raceway south course on June 18-19, 2011.

Highlights of the two day event will be a well structured learning experience featuring sports car legends, David Murry and Peter Krause. As Chief Instructor for the event, David Murry's instruction will feature:

- Dynamic interactive class room instruction
- Video analysis of selected participants' driving
- At-the-corner instruction during race/active track
- In-car instruction by David Murry with selected drivers
- Tips and discussion with David Murry and Peter Krause

Participants will also enjoy watching the Twelfth Annual "VIR Governor's Cup" the revival of the famous "President's Cup®" races, held at VIR in the late '50s and early '60s. It's not unusual to see a few Ferraris and Maseratis from the late '50s and early '60s to spindly, quick Formula Fords from the late '70s on this weekend. This year, the event will be held on the 1.65-mile South Course, the same used by professional schools Skip Barber Racing and Bertil Roos. About 85% of the track action can be seen from the mostly paved paddock.

Planned are four race groups accommodating different participant car eras and levels of preparation. Two practice sessions will be followed by a race on Saturday; and one practice

session will be followed by two races on Sunday. The first group is comprised of Pre-War and Preservation class cars, those '50s cars unmodified and still suitable for road use. The second group is Vintage Small Bore cars, consisting mostly of modified production-based cars less than 91 cubic inches in displacement. The third group is Medium/Big Bore, including some V-8 cars and Porsche 911's and 914's from the '60s and '70s. The fourth group is for the purpose built Formula/Sports Racer class cars.

This DE and race is a must attend event if you are serious about honing your driving skills and enjoy watching vintage cars race and mingling with the drivers off track. Registration is extremely limited since the DE event will share track with the VIR Governor's Cup. Cost of the two day event is \$300 for all driving registrants.

Participation is available for all experienced solo drivers and HPDE instructors. Mountain Area By David Butler


