Ten Fifty Nine

The Historian's Desk By Lou Scalzo



Usually if you have been a Porsche enthusiast or PCA member for any length of time you have mostly likely owned a few different cars or models over the years. Looking back, there has probably been one of those cars that you remember fondly, miss, and probably wish you had never sold. I had a personal experience that recently happened that I would like to share with the Carolinas membership regarding one of my old cars of the past. With me, it was a certain car that I would always remember, the second in a string of nine, 911's that I had over the years. This is the story of that one car.

In January of 1985, my wife and I transferred to Los Angeles with my employer, Eastern Airlines, from Miami to work as a flight line mechanic. I was 25 yrs old and had already owned two previous cars – my first a '72 914, and then a '71 911T. Moving to L.A. – after being Porsche-less for almost 2yrs, I thought it would be the perfect opportunity

to find and purchase the nicest Porsche I could afford at the time. Southern California had the reputation of being the spot with the biggest selection of used Porsche's to be found at the time. After owning the 911T - and doing the research, I felt the model I could afford with my 6-8 grand in hand would be a '70-'73 911S coupe. Well, I found the search somewhat more difficult that I had anticipated. It involved newspapers and the local "Recycler" - the paper of choice in Southern CA when looking to buy used goods. I would look on my spare time and weekends, and after approximately 3 months I had only really found 3 possibilities - 1) 1970 red 911S Targa that needed a front pan and had a lot of oil leaks, 2) 1972 Gran Prix white 911E with a rebuilt S-spec engine and Webers, or 3) 1970 Metallic green 911S euro "luxus" model.

To be honest, I was very tempted on that white 911E. That is, until I found that metallic Green 911S that fateful day on the



outskirts Chatsworth Ca. when the owner backed it out of the barn at his mini-ranch. After doing a quick once over, I knew it was THE ONE. A totally stock, mechanically injected 7800 rpm, '70 911S, with a very unusual metallic green stock paint color code 8383. The car was purchased and delivered to Southern CA by the current owner, finding it thru a showroom window while on a ski trip to Switzerland. It was also a "Luxus" model, meaning that it had unusual features - electric windows, rear window wiper, and black interior with corduroy seats. The entire car was a time capsule in beautiful condition inside and out. Asking price, \$7,500. Buying price, \$7,200.

This car turned out to be everything I thought it would be - a joy to drive - with the legendary S cams delivering that glorious power, punch and sound above 4500rpm. I enjoyed driving for a year, along Pacific Coast Highway and up to Ventura and Santa Barbara, January 1986, I transferred back to Miami. FL with Eastern, and we trailered the 911S with our '79 Z-28 Camaro. Looking back we must have been crazy, but we made it... almost. We made it as far as Stuart, Florida when after 3 days of driving, the ignition unit on the Z-28 gave up at 10pm on the Florida Turnpike. Luckily we had the 911S! We backed it off the trailer, headed to the next exit and into a small town to find at gas station with new ignition unit for the Camaro at 1am! Talk about luck! So after getting the Camaro running again, my wife Laurie followed me home to our house in Hollywood - arriving finally at 3am.

Regretfully, the following year Eastern Airlines was not to survive. The airline was a victim of merger mania of the '80's. Also, my wife Laurie was pregnant with our first daughter, Melissa, so it was time for change once again. A new start with another airline, in a new town - the house was sold



along with my prized possession - the '70 911s. Maybe I was being a little too responsible and practical at the time. Looking back now, yes probably, but it seemed to be the right decision then. Like many of us Porschephiles, it was important that if I had to sell, it had to be to a good home. When Mark Allbaugh purchased the car from me that fateful day in January of 1987, I felt he would provide a good home. He was already a car collector with several vintage muscle cars, as well as a Pantera. I remember very well driving to meet him in Pompano Beach to make the transaction. More than once I thought in my mind, "It's not too late to cancel this." But being far too practical, the sale did take place that day. But as the years went by I wondered what ever happened to the car and if Mark might still have it. I did keep his South Florida phone number throughout the years and was tempted many times to find out.

Well, fast forward to 23 1/2 years later, to, Friday, July 8th 2011. I was taking an extended weekend trip with friends, up in the North Carolina mountain town of Glenville, when I got phone call from my brother Tony, who lives in North Miami Beach. He tells me that he received a letter from a Porsche guy in Orange County Ca. who owns a certain Metallic Green 1970 911S, and is trying find out the history of the car, and looking to locate a one-time Eastern Airlines mechanic who owned the car in Southern California in the 70's or 80's - the name. Louis Scalzo, could this be? After so long my old car has now resurfaced? Whatever it was, luck or fate, of course I left a phone message to the new owner - Rick Kreiskott, and on July

Rick filled me in on the last 23 ¹/₂ yrs of the car and told how he had gone about acquiring her. It turns out Mark Allbaugh had maintained ownership for 20 more years until 2007 when he ironically moved to Brevard, North Carolina. The 911 had practically been in my back yard all these years! When Mark decided to sell it in Hemming Motor News, Rick was in California, had noticed it and had been looking for a post '69 early 911, After some phone conversations, Mark agreed to have a pre-purchase inspection done by of all places, John Forbes and Black Forest Racing. After several trips to check out the progress and when the work in N.C. was completed, Rick flew out for the last time and drove the '70 911S home to Southern California, back where it all started in 1985.

Rick has been a great new owner to the car. After a trouble free drive back to California he has recently completed a exterior restoration, has replaced the S front spoiler with an original valance, and replaced the rear lid with a correct aluminum one. He has sent me many pictures. Also a member of the Early 911S registry, he sent me a link to the blog on his recent work being done entitled 1059. When I asked, Rick explained it is the last 4 digits of the serial number, and then it came back to me after 23years – also my birthday October 1959, another irony. It's so good to see an old friend looking better than ever, with a new owner that is really appreciating her. Many thanks Rick.

Rennsport Reunion IV Update

Stellar lineup of drivers and cars for Porsche's celebration of its motorsport heritage

or the Porsche Rennsport Reunion IV taking place at Mazda Laguna Seca Raceway in October, it's both the men and machines that are expected to draw one of the largest crowds in track history. And, if early sign-ups are any indication, both elements will not disappoint.

Just a glance at the guest list reveals names that are well entrenched in Porsche Motorsport history. For example, Vic Elford, who won the Monte Carlo Rally and scored Porsche's first overall win at the 24 Hours of Davtona - on back-to-back weekends; James Weaver, Porsche 962 driver for Dyson Racing and a Daytona and Sebring winner; Gijs van Lennep, Dutch Porsche 917 and 911 driver who won Le Mans with Helmut Marko and the last Targa Florio with Herbert Müller; Chip Robinson, IMSA champion with Al Holbert in a Porsche 962; George Follmer, who took the turbocharged 917 to Can-Am championship; Dan Gurney, who scored Porsche's first successes in Formula 1; and Hurley Haywood, the most successful Porsche endurance driver with wins at Daytona, Sebring and Le Mans. More than 50 drivers of similar stature have already said "yes" to Porsche's invitation for the October 14-16, 2011, Rennsport event. The rest of the names will be announced as the event gets closer.

And it's not just drivers that made their Porsche race cars famous. Attendees will include Norbert Singer, recently-retired Porsche Motorsport engineer, known as the father of the Porsche 962; Hans Mezger, who headed up the Porsche Motorsport racing engine function from his Dan Gurney F1 motors through the 917, 935, 962 and McLaren F1 engine; and Alwin Springer, former Vasek Polak 917 crew member who later built engines at his company Andial and served as president of Porsche Motorsports North America. Jörg Bergmeister, Patrick Long, and the rest of the current Porsche factory drivers, will all attend Rennsport.

The Porsche Club of America is honored to assist the Porsche Rennsport Reunion IV with several activities: History of the Porsche 911 Display, Porsche Model-Specific Parking Corrals with Parade laps of the track, PCA Hospitality and Membership Center, two race groups: Rennsport Reunion Cup for Porsche Cup Cars and PCA Club Racing for PCA race cars, and PCA Volunteer Pool—workers to assist with the club's involvement. Round and Round and Round Again.

Several Carolinas members from the Sandhills Area rented the skid pad at CMP on July 13. We had talked about using the pad at CMP at the last DE, but time ran out and most people did not want to give up track time on the 2.3 mile road course. So, we rented it on the hottest day of the year! We saw 103 degrees.

We were joined by a few members from the Corvette club in Pinehurst who I instructed at the Corvette Museum event at VIR in late June. A little competition between Porsches and Corvettes....who could turn that down?! I must comment, however, that I drove a new Gran Sport on the pad and instructed in a ZR1 and I was impressed; very impressed.

SKID PAD Basics

Objective... Learn to feel the balance of the car and get it loose at slow speeds in a safe environment. Once you learn the feeling of the slide you will be better able to anticipate it, or correct it..... whether on track, or on a wet road surface such as a cloverleaf intersection on the interstate highway.

Speed will not exceed 40 mph... 1st or 2nd gear, no stability control systems on.

The dry skid pad gives you confidence in the car's ability to grip the surface in a turn; not necessary to slide the car on the dry pad, but you may want to try.

Learn to keep your eyes UP and turn your head, don't look down at the line or cones immediately in front of the car. You will feel the centripetal force, but try to keep your eyes level with the horizon, your shoulders back in the seat and both hands firmly on the wheel.

1st Exercise:

5-8 laps on dry pad in one direction keeping the inside front tire on the white line around the center of the pad... gradually increasing speed on each lap; then 5-8 laps in the other direction... if you get dizzy, stop. If you spin and cannot catch it, you have exceeded the limits of the tires and were not fast enough or precise enough with your corrections... no big deal. Try to get on the brakes immediately and get the clutch in too. Just start over.

2nd Exercise:

5-8 laps on dry pad with 4 cones at 3-6-9-12 o'clock positions. Weave in and out of the cones as you go around the pad in both directions... as speed increases and the turns become more aggressive, you will feel the front end push. Try not to use the brakes unless you spin.



3rd & 4th Exercises:

Same thing on a WET pad. Here you want to get the car loose (front & rear) and then catch it by opening the wheel an inch or two, get it loose again, etc. Opening the wheel means turning it to the outside of the circle. As your skills develop you may be able to keep the rear loose for a couple of seconds as your hands move quickly to open and close the wheel... this is also called throttle steering.

Easiest way to get it loose is to jab the throttle aggressively as your speed picks up, and turn the wheel hard into the center of the circle... front or rear may come lose depending on your suspension and tire condition and pressure. To correct the spin, open the wheel just a little and ease off the gas. The car will also get loose if you stab the brake with your left foot as you continue accelerating... weight shifts to the outside front tire which makes the rear lighter... either the outside front tire will slide out (push or understeer), or the rear will slide out (oversteer).

Carolinas Region Car of the Month: The Winning Bid

We are continuing our ongoing series called Car of The Month. Members interested in having their car featured are asked to submit photos and a short write-up to the TR Editor for consideration.





It's my own fault. I have no one to blame but myself. I started instructing for the Carolinas Region DE's back in the late '90s. After some 35+ years of being Porsche-less, being so close to all those beautiful cars took its toll. I started asking for advice: "If I wanted a great, classic Porsche to drive, be able to work on it myself, yet have some degree of collectibility, what would it be?" The majority of replies kept telling me "a '95 993." After looking at a few, I had to agree. The search began.

It took a few years but THE 993 turned up on eBay back in early 2007. It was described as a C4S with 10,000 miles but there's no such thing as a '95 C4S. I called to inquire and found out that it was a neighbor's car who knew nothing about eBay and he was just listing it for him as a favor. (Apparently, he knew nothing about Porsches either!) After speaking directly to the owner, it was determined to be an early '95 black/black Carrera coupe with only 10,000 miles. A call to the owner's mechanic verified service records and meticulous maintenance. At the end of the auction, I was high bidder but it didn't meet reserve. Another phone call and a final bit of negotiation sealed the deal.

A quick drive down to central Florida in a one-way rental car and there she was, just as described...a 13 year-old "time capsule". My drive home was euphoric and quick! As I drove it into the garage that evening for the first time, Peg ran down to greet me and exclaimed, "It sounds great! It rattled every window in the house!" A few months later, we proudly drove the 993 back down to Daytona for RENNSPORT Re-Union III along with a great crew from the Carolinas Region.

Since then, it's been shown at the Heritage & Historic Display at Porsche Parade '08 in Charlotte, OKTOBERFEST at Foreign Cars in Greensboro and at "In der Bergen" at Waynesville. Now, with all of some 14,000 miles on the odometer, it goes out for occasional exercise on pretty days. Not wanting it to get lonely, we purchased a '98 C2S to keep it company....but that's another story!
