The following article is a collection of my thoughts and observations during the recent Porsche Parade in Savannah GA.

Sunday, July 31: Having just arrived back from India the previous evening and fighting off a severe lack of sleep the previous 36 hours, I was not really looking forward to the drive to Savannah (approx.. 4 hours from Charlotte). But once I got on the road the fatigue diminished and the drive became a bit more fun. I credit that to the fact that I had not driven my 993 any further than Hickory this year.

Upon arrival in Savannah (actually Hutchinson Island, across the river) I found a reasonable spot in the expansive parking lot adjacent to the Savannah International Trade and Convention Center which is where most of the Parade activities were to take place.

Parade Check-In was painless and always provides a great opportunity to catch-up with PCA friends who invariably staff the check-in stations.

One of the best spectacles at any Parade is the Concours Prep Area. Upon arrival at my first Parade (2005 in Hershey), John Nelson recommended that we all go to the prep area, which that year was the parking deck next to the Hershey Lodge. I had never seen the level of cleaning and detailing that I witnessed there. I quickly learned that the hard core competitors have a set of roll-on/ roll-off tire and wheels and a set of show

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tires and wheels, which are usually in plastic bags btw.

Later that evening was the Pirelli Welcome Party, which is the big kickoff for the week. I finally made it back to the condo at Tybee Island around midnight after negotiating a lot of standing water resulting from severe thunderstorms that evening.

Monday, August 1: The Concours and Historic Display teams were sweating bullets due to the rain the previous evening and that the forecast was for rain. However, upon examination of the grounds at Forsythe Park it appeared that the drainage was excellent and the rollout began in earnest around 5AM.

Since Parade judges apparently do not find the humor in a car with no provenance having racing 'patina', I chose to just participate in the Corral. Luckily we did not have to be onsite until later in the morning, but rain continued to threaten with dark overcast skies.

I made a couple passes through the Historic Display (organized by our own John Meek) and the Concours competitors.

On my second pass I ran into Al Citro, who is the owner of the 1958 Speedster that won the People's Choice Award and Honorary Judges Award at the Charlotte Parade. I have never met a more humble and excited participant at any Parade. And apparently his hobby has infected the entire family.





















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Later in the morning the EC and representatives from Porsche AG, PCNA and Porsche Classic unveiled the 1973 911T that underwent restoration at Porsche Classic in Germany. No final number was given as to the total cost, but with 1,400+ hours of labor invested excluding the original purchase price of the car (\$7,000), parts and transportation costs, I am guessing close to \$200,000.

Later that evening my wife, Vivian, accompanied me to the President's Reception, which was held at the famous Olde Pink House in downtown Savannah. An excellent venue and great place to catch-up with everyone.

Tuesday, August 2: The order of the day was tours, including:

- Driving Tour to Jekyll Island
- Scenic Drive to Hilton Head Island
- Rose Hill Plantation Tour and Scenic Drive
- Bus Tour to Brumos Autowerks

But since I was not sure what my schedule would look like with my entire family coming to Parade I passed on signing up for anything. For those not participating in the tours the three Race Simulation systems setup by Fanatec was the main entertainment. While I briefly had the best lap time, the numbers continued to drop pushing me off the 'Top 5' board. Once you dropped out of the top 5 you could run again, which I did a couple of times bettering my previous times, but I finally hit a wall (figuratively, not literally) and called it a day.

Later in the day was the traditional Ice Cream Social, followed that evening by the Concours Banquet. One of the surprises of the evening was an impromptu offer from Porsche AG to host a trip for several multidecade Parade attendees to the Porsche Museum and Factory.

At the end of the evening the Carolinas Region was well represented bringing home several Concours trophies.

Wednesday, August 3: Today was the first day of the Parade Autocross. later renamed the 'Hot-O-Cross'. Due to some traffic coming from Tybee, I was a bit late in getting to the autocross site for my run group (scheduled for 10AM). Upon my arrival I was summarily chastised by one of the autocross workers for my tardiness. Once he finished getting his point across, I proceeded to the tent for the driver's meeting. At the meeting I quickly realized that I had chosen the wrong class for my car (I was in SO9 but should have been in PO9) .Talk about setting a bad example! Luckily the Autocross Chair took mercy on me and allowed me to switch to the correct run group, which was unfortunately the same time the following day.

Thursday, August 4: Back to the Autocross course... but at least I was on time today! But geez, talk about HOT! I heard that the temp hit 103... and combined with humidity it was pretty miserable. Had there not been a bit of a breeze I think that I would have probably have called it a day after my first run.

But I am glad that I hung in there as I got a 5th place for my class, coming pretty close to one of our local autocross aces, John Meek. There was a 4 second gap between John's best time and the 3rd place finisher. All of the top 3 in our class were running lightened RS Americas with fresh uber sticky tires.

Friday, August 5: Although Parade had scheduled events through Saturday, we decided that 6 days was going to be it for us. I drove in early for the Kumho Technical and Historic Quiz, which started at 8AM. The quiz took me about 45 minutes to complete and then I was on my way back to Tybee to pack up.

On the way back from Parade, I found out that the Carolinas Region had won the 2011 Website Contest Award for Class 5 Regions (Largest Regions) beating out 12 other Regions for the honor. Congrats to Don Roof who has been the architect and the driving force behind our revamped and now award winning website!

Ultimately, the drive back to Charlotte was thankfully uneventful and thus concluded a great week at Parade 2011. Hopefully when we attend out next Parade, most likely 2013 in Michigan, I will not just be getting back from overseas the day before.



Porsche is set to unveil the all-new 2012 Porsche 911 Carrera



World Premiere at the 2011 Frankfurt Motor Show Next Month

ATLANTA -- August 23 2011 - At 48, the Porsche 911 Carrera is younger than ever. The completely redesigned seventh-generation sports car icon is stepping into the limelight with its sleek and stretched silhouette, exciting contours and precisely designed features. Yet from every angle it is unmistakably a 911, holding true to the Porsche 911 Carrera 'evolution, not revolution' design philosophy.

The 100 mm or 3.9 inch longer wheelbase and reduced overall height underpin the fresh, athletic yet elegant appearance. When viewed from the front, the eye is drawn to the 911's trademark wide-arched fenders, emphasizing the wider front track. The side mirrors are now mounted on the upper edge of the door, which also

helps highlight the new design line and gives the visual impression of width.

The new lightweight body is an aluminum-steel composite construction and contributes greatly to the 45 kg or about 100 lbs weight reduction when compared to the previous 911 body. When combined with the greater structural rigidity and optimized aerodynamics – including a wider, variably extending rear spoiler – the new 911 Carrera's front and rear lift has been reduced to near zero while retaining the Cd value of 0.29.

To complement the modern exterior design, Porsche designers created an interior reminiscent of the Carrera GT. The driver is now even more closely integrated within the cockpit thanks to the rising center console and high-mounted shift lever or gear selector located close to the steering wheel. As with the exterior, classic Porsche elements abound inside. Present is the instrument cluster



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with five round gauges – one of them a high resolution multifunction screen, and of course the central tachometer and the ignition lock to the left of the steering wheel.

Setting the standard in its class, as it has for generations, the new 911 Carrera and 911 Carrera S raise the performance and efficiency bar yet another notch. All versions get by with significantly less than 10 liters of fuel per 100 kilometers (official U.S. EPA fuel mileage estimates are TBD) and fuel consumption and emissions are up to 16 percent lower in the New European Driving Cycle (NEDC) when compared with the predecessor. This is achieved through systems such as the Automatic

Start Stop function, engine and transmission thermal management, electrical system recuperation, the world's first seven-speed manual transmission and – in conjunction with the Porsche Doppelkupplungsgetriebe (PDK) – the ability to 'sail' or coast. The new electro-mechanical power steering offers not only Porsche's typical precision and feedback but also helps increase efficiency and reduce fuel-consumption.

For example, the 911 Carrera with the new 350 hp, 3.4-liter boxer engine and optional PDK consumes 8.2 l/100 km based on the NEDC – 1.6 l/100 km less than its predecessor.

The 911 Carrera S with its 400 hp, 3.8-liter boxer engine – 15 hp more than before – achieves 8.7 I/100 km in the NEDC when paired with the optional PDK transmission. This represents a fuel consumption decrease of 14 percent or 1.5 I/100 km.

At the same time there are performance improvements in both models. The 911 Carrera S with PDK accelerates from 0 to 60 in 4.1 seconds. Using the Launch Control function of the optional Sport Chrono Package cuts that to 3.9 seconds. The 911 Carrera with PDK needs only 4.4 seconds to sprint from a standing start to 60 mph (4.2 seconds when using the optional Sport Chrono Package's Launch Control function). Top-track speed for the 911 Carrera S and 911 Carrera is 188 mph and 179 mph, respectively.

The new 911 offers both better longitudinal dynamics and unprecedented top performance in terms of transverse dynamics. In addition to the longer wheelbase, the greater agility, precision and driving stability are based, among other things, on the wider front track, the new rear axle and new electro-mechanical power steering. Depending on the model, there are other standard or optional active control systems available that can help further enhance the overall driving dynamics. That is especially true for the Porsche Dynamic Chassis Control (PDCC) active roll stabilization system, available for the first time on the 911 Carrera S. The system helps reduce lateral roll when cornering and helps keep the tires in the optimal position relative to the road surface.

The new 911 further extends the span of seemingly contradictory attributes such as performance and efficiency, sportiness and every day practicality that have always typified the Porsche 911. That makes the 911 Carrera more of a 911 than ever. The new Porsche 911 Carrera celebrates its world premiere at the 2011 IAA Frankfurt Motor Show in September.

The first new 911 models will arrive in U.S. dealerships beginning in February of 2012. The new 911 Carrera Coupe will have a base MSRP of \$82,100, while the 911 Carrera S Coupe's base MSRP will be \$96,400 (excluding destination). Both models will include substantial additional equipment when compared to the previous models.

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Member Profile: Dave Lumpkin

Hi Everyone, Saturday August 13, I attended the Annual Triad Swap meet, hosted by RennGruppe Motorsports in Lexington. I had the opportunity to meet and talk with long time PCA member Dave Lumpkin. He has contributed much personal time to the club and has served many positions on regional and national level. He was nice enough to share his PCA story with me and now I would like to share it with everyone in the Carolinas Region. Now in his words is Dave's Porsche story.

If the definition of a dyed-in-the-wool gear head includes an early start, then I guess that I qualify. I started with model airplane engines, before glow plugs, when they had spark plugs and had to haul around a coil, battery, points and a capacitor. I went to a couple of small displacement scramble bikes, and then a real '32 Ford 3 window coupe with a fairly hot 59A flathead. Progress continued through a Lancia, two MG's, and a Silver Star 220D that I kept much longer than I would have thought possible.

My lusting after the four wheel holy grail started somewhere in the middle of my vehicle history. In the early 50's I lived in Birmingham. AL., and there was a hill climb that the SCCA held up at the Old Montgomery Highway. That was where I saw my first 356, and I was hooked on the spot. I liked the way it looked, sounded, and especially liked the way it hung out in some of the uphill hairpins. A few years later I was living in Pittsburgh PA and one afternoon a Speedster passed by and the hook was sunk deeper. Of course there was the 356 sound, but the low side window openings blew me away. [Chopping my '32 had always been out of the question financially, and here was a car that came that way!]

Alas and alaack, a number of things happened along the way to my first Porsche. There was military service, an engineering degree, marriage, two kids, and a couple of moves. Then one afternoon Fran called me and said there was a car we needed to look into. It turns out that if you read the article on BJ Craven a few months back, you were introduced to the owner of the car, Reece Burris. My current 72 "RED E" was Reece's personal car for two years and it was time for him to get a new Porsche. I had known Reece from the mid 60's when we both competed in the SCCA Southeast Divisional rally circuit. I knew Reece as a navigator and had no idea of what



kind of cars he owned or what he did for a living. I am very glad he was in the Porsche business, because that '72 has been in our garage for 37 years, and is a real family member.

I guess it isn't unexpected to find that my interests led me to get involved with the mechanical aspects of my vehicles. I have turned wrenches with all of them from model airplane engines, motorcycles, flat-head Fords, twin cam Lancia, and my 911.

I should say a few words about how Fran fit into all of this early history. Not only was she the person that identified our first Porsche, she has been a partner in our automotive activities since before our marriage in 1965. Our second date was a grassy hillside at VIR, with Oak Tree in sight - that's the old VIR of course.

PCA History

We joined PCA in 1977 while we were living in Wilmington, N.C. At the time, if Wilmington, NC was not the jumping off place for the earth, it certainly had to be in sight of it. Every month it was the same drill; pack up and drive 200+ miles for the Carolinas Region event and 200+ miles back. The distance to events may have been a drag, but the events were really great. There were annual events that will always back great memories; the hill climb at Paris Mountain State park, the Challenge events at Charlotte Motor Speedway, autocross at Carowinds [after they closed for the season].the NC Highway Patrol driver training course in Charlotte, and of course Sun Fun Run at North Field in North, SC. There were also some of the regional events that became part of our regular activity. Peachstate's Rennfest has been a regular event for us since 1977 or '78 and we have been to all of them since, except for the one that was at Calloway Gardens. We also began going

to Parades, and this year in Savannah was number 28 for us.

In 1981 we moved to Greensboro, NC and things picked up in our PCA activity. In Carolinas Region I have served as Membership Chairman and upgraded the mechanism from card file to an Access database. I also served as Treasurer, Vice President, and two years as President of the region.

From 1989 through 1994, I served national PCA as the Zone 3 rep. One of the things that I worked to develop was a series of multi event weekends with all of the regions in Zone 3. Also during that period Woody DeLong [Peachstate] and I set up a Zone autocross series that worked for a number of years. The reason for starting the series was that each region had its own definition of classifications and what was legal, etc. In the end we adapted the PCR's and the playing field was level across the zone.

Following my appointment to Zone Rep, I held two elective offices as National Treasurer, and National Vice President. During that period I was the National Administrative Systems Chair, and led the program to shift our national records from the IBM System 36 mainframe we were using to a more progressive client-server network that provided much more information. It, of course, has grown in sophistication by orders of magnitude since its initiation.

I have also been an insider part of two Parades. I was asked to be the Scoring Chair for the 2003 Suncoast Parade, and in 2008 I was co-chair of the TSD Rally for the Charlotte Parade.

In 2009 it was time to take delivery on a new Boxster S. It was a tourist delivery that almost didn't happen because of needing to be sure about the color choice. At the 2007 San Diego Parade I was an interior judge at the Concours, and in walking the line of cars before the start I saw one that appeared black in shade, but metallic green in sunlight. I spoke with the owner and found that the color is Rain Forest Green. Well in ordering the new car in early 2009, Rain Forest Green was no longer an optional color, but a new metallic green, Porsche Racing Green was listed. It is hard to tell from paper color samples so we put off ordering until the real samples came in-only about a week or so from the drop dead for ordering a new vehicle for tourist delivery.

What a grand experience! If you are going to buy a new Porsche I can't think of a better plan than taking a tourist delivery. We had no rigid schedule except for the major places we wanted to visit. It was all done with three Michelin maps and a Garmin, and mostly back roads except when we were in major cities. The photograph of Fran and I was taken in Vienna by someone we conned to take the picture. What can I say? PCA has been a big and satisfying part of my life, and will be into the foreseeable future. I have great friends all across the country and look forward to seeing them at future Porsche events. Life is good!






Congratulations to all of the winners and thank you to all the participants for presenting their vehicles for display and judging.
