



The Carolinas Region Meets the New 911

On February 4th and 9th, PCA members were treated to the unveiling of the 7th generation 911 (991) across the Carolinas Region. Each of the dealerships hosted a special event revealing

the 991 with extensive involvement from local PCA members. As a lead up to the unveiling, the dealerships had one or two new 911s under a mysterious black cover on the dealership floor for a week or more before the big event. The silhouette of the 991 lurking beneath the cover was a tease of things to come.

Each dealership invited customers and members of PCA to a lavish and fun party, consisting of great food, refreshments of all kinds and the opportunity to socialize. A few of the dealerships, working closely

with Carolinas Region members, staged a "History of the 911" display to put the new 991 into perspective. These displays consisted of PCA member's vehicles placed in the showrooms, representing the different generations of the 911. These legacy displays drew rave reviews from the attendees and great appreciation for the member's efforts in presenting their vehicles.

The high points of each event were when the dealership representative presented a brief history of the 911, some referring to the member's cars on display as examples, drawings for door prizes, leading up to a champagne toast as the 991s were revealed. After the applause and cheers died down it was time for the attendees to get "up close and personal" with the new 911.

The following are specific activities that took place at the individual dealerships.




Despite the early morning rain, 13 Upstate Area members brought their cars to participate in the "History of the 911" showroom display. Once all the vehicles were placed inside the complex and wiped down, they provides a comprehensive perspective of the 911, covering every model grouping of 911 and also a couple of 356s to show the family heritage. There was also a PCA member Show & Shine gathering in front of the dealership prior to the event kick-off. In all, there were over 220 guests in attendance.

The main event began with our special guest, Erika Powell, the current Miss South Carolina USA, singing a couple of songs. Erika was also available all evening for photo opportunities with guests and the New 911 or their own vehicles. We then presented an award to Mike Burgess, General Manager of Porsche of Greenville, recog-

nizing the strides they have made in forming a close relationship with the Carolina's Region over the past year. Mike announced that effective February 1st; anyone purchasing a new or used Porsche will receive a one-year membership to PCA courtesy of the dealership. After the speeches, everyone raised a champagne glass, as the Carrera White 991 was uncovered for all to see.

Thanks to Mike and the staff at Porsche of Greenville for putting on a great event, to Lloyd and Karla Kuhn for arranging for Erika Powell to be part of the event and a special thanks to Erika for giving of her time and talent entertaining the crowd and posing for hundreds of pictures.

After introducing the Harmony staff, Charlie spoke of Porsche's history using the cars from the 911 Legacy Display to highlight the progression of engineering achievements on each model leading up to the new 991. He discussed the design of the 991, the performance Porsche was able to achieve and his experience driving it. Then the cover was removed to reveal a sparkling Black on Black Carrera S Coupe. After reviewing some of the new features, Charlie invited everyone to sit behind the wheel and take a closer look at the new 911.

Mountain Area members enjoyed the event and were pleased to actively participate by providing the 911 Legacy Display. Introduction of a new Porsche 911 is significant, and to share it with fellow enthusiasts and PCA members in such a setting as provided by Harmony Motors was very special.

Our thanks to David Foster, Hendrick Porsche General Manager, who did a great job working the crowd into a heightened state of anticipation before the big reveal.


History of the 911 - PCA Members Provide Perspective

First Impressions:

The New Porsche 911 (aka 991)

Unless you are now in your late 60's or early 70's your first experience with a truly new 911 was in 1998 when Porsche launched the 996. Yes, you can argue that the 964 was 90%+ new and the 993, well, it looked new and there was a new rear suspension. But in reality the core of those cars was the same as it was in 1964, which is not a bad thing. What other platform lasted 34 years? The VW Beetle definitely, but not many others.

Porsche takes a platform and refines to the point that it cannot refine it any further or is forced into making a change. The original 911 platform reached its' pinnacle with the 993. If you have ever watched the movie 'Blade Runner' think of Roy Batty as the 993 and Dr. Tyrell as a Porsche Engineer explaining the facts of life: 'You were made as well as we could make you.'

Enter the 996.

I think of myself as a bit of an anachronism when it comes to Porsche. I am a traditionalist in that I truly love the air cooled cars, especially the 356. All of my other track buddies, you know who you are (Bob, Rob, Bill, Jeff & James) don't get it. They think of the 356 as an oddity. Sort of an experiment Porsche did with VW parts that was a stepping stone to the 911. But if you have ever driven or owned a 356, you get it. There is a purity and solidity that is impossible to find with other cars.

On the other hand I am a non-traditionalist, in that I have never had an issue with water cooled cars. I actually fell in love with the 928 after an encounter with a new one on the streets of Daytona Beach in 1978 during the Daytona 500 weekend. I also had an encounter

with Linda Vaughn (aka Miss Hurst) the same weekend. Ok ... I was 16 and I did meet Miss Vaughn.

I have owned two Boxsters, a 928 S4 and currently a Cayenne S. I would argue that all are true Porsches. Different approaches and different missions to be sure, but Porsches nonetheless.

So when the 996 hit our shores, I thought it was a great car. Yes, it was a bit slab sided but so was the original 911. I saw this as a clean sheet starting point as well as an homage to the 901. The flares and other refinements would come later... as they did. They always do with Porsche.

My personal car at the time of the 996 Launch was a 1983 911SC Coupe. It is one of probably three cars that I wish I had kept. Black on black with no wing. Torsion bar suspension and non-power steering goodness. So it should come as no surprise that when I first drove a 996, I think it was Rick Leander's Guards Red 996 Cabriolet, it was a bit of a revelation. The engine so powerful and suspension so competent it made my SC seem like a throwback to the Stone Ages.

Since then I have driven several flavors of the 996 including the Turbo as well as the GT3 variants. All well engineered and all very fun to drive. The subsequent 997 took most all of the criticisms of the 996 and corrected most if not all. Many would say they let Tony Hatter, designer of the 993, loose on the 996 (actually it was Pinky Lai). We did get the hips back as well as the signature round headlamps. Sort of 996 + 993 = 997 I guess.

But in reality the 997 was an evolution of the 996. An evolution, but a very good evolution sprouting, I think at final count, 14 variants including the Speedster and the GT3 RS 4.0 as a final send off to the model.

991: Evolution or Something Else?

I, like most of you reading this, keep up with happenings in the automotive world. I generally think of Porsche enthusiasts as gear-

heads with a love of all things mechanical that have experience with many marques, but settled on Porsche for one of several reasons. For me, it is the purity of the engineering. Everything that is there has a purpose. You may not know what that purpose is, but a German engineer probably did a thesis on it.

We have known that the new 911 had been coming for quite a while. We have seen it in the spy photos, we have seen it in videos from the Nurburgring. Now it is here in the flesh.

David Foster, GM at Hendrick Porsche, had told me a few months ago that he wanted my impressions of the 991 when they got one in. On January 26th I received an email from David asking if I had time to swing by the dealership.

About an hour later I was standing in front of a 2012 911 Carrera S with a PDK. First impressions ... lower ... longer ... bigger. Not 'holy cow' bigger, but more like 'I see where the extra 4 inches in the wheelbase went' bigger. BTW – Most of that increase went between the rear of the doors and the rear wheel well. All the details were there. Tight gaps, impressive finish, well thought out.

Walking around the back of the car I had to confront one of the most controversial elements of the 991, the styling of the rear. This is the most obvious break with tradition on the entire car. For some reason, this part of the car does not photograph well but in person it works. But you will have to be the judge of that for yourself.

Upon entering the interior the first thing you notice is the rising console. Originating in the Carrera GT, this has become a design signature for Porsche that has been incorporated into the Panamera, followed by the second gen Cayenne and now the 911. We should see the same treatment in the recently announced next gen Boxster and then the next gen Cayman.

Overall the interior is familiar, but new at the same time. 5 dials, center tach, ignition on the left, etc. Immediately comfortable.

David drove the car initially as we headed down Margaret Wallace Rd. We soon pulled off and swapped seats. Taking time to adjust the seats, the steering wheel and then the mirrors. While adjusting the side mirrors however, I noticed one of the hidden elements of the car: hips. This car has hips more pronounced than the 993, but you don't really notice it outside the car.

Interesting.

Before we pulled off to swap seats, my initial impressions with David driving were good power but kind of sedate. But before pulling out again David made it a point to set the car to Sport Plus and opened up the optional sport exhaust.

Dr. Jekyll, meet Mr. Hyde.

Upon entering the road and having some space for a full throttle burst, I began to experience something that I had only previously experienced in one other street car ... a Ferrari F430. The pull and the linearity of the engine was astonishing. It felt more like a turbo but without the requisite delay and 'whoosh'. Similar to the pull of a 996 GT3 but stronger. And the sound ... oh the sound. Stunning.

Then the corners started coming. And although we had slowed due to traffic, I could tell that the chassis was planted. Oh, and the stories about the electric steering filtering out too much feedback ... non-issue. While I could tell some things were being filtered out in my opinion it was negligible. I was getting the feedback I needed and wanted.

And the PDK? While I am still a dyed-in-thewool manual guy I really like the new PDK. It is infinitely better than the previous version in the 997 and very, very quick with that luscious blip of the throttle on the down shifts. My only complaint? The implementation of the push/pull shifter. I would order the optional paddle shifters with the PDK. Simpler and cleaner.

We decided to drive back to the dealership on the same outbound route, so we turned around at a shopping center where a guy driving a Mercedes SL probably got whiplash trying to get a look at the car. He clearly knew what it was.


We then had an open road with a sweeping turn ... I took full advantage. In my 993, the pace at which we took that corner would have caused the rear to start coming around. In the 991, the chassis was completely unruffled and clearly wanted more however, in deference to my gracious host I decided not to push further.

The feel is more mid-engine than I had imagined but the 911 weight transfer on acceleration is still there. Similar yet different at the same time. And the brakes? One thing I always tell people about Porsches is that while they go great, they stop even better. This car is no exception. Great binders.

Upon our arrival at the dealership, it was hard not to smile. During the drive it was hard not to giggle to be honest. I told David that all he had to do with anyone sitting on the fence over buying the car is to let them take a test drive. That would seal the deal. I know of at least one member that has already taken delivery of one and know of several others that have placed orders.

My verdict? It still has all the elements of the 911 that we have all come to know and love, but it has raised its game and is now in the league of the F430 or the 458 Italia. It is like strapping on Superman's cape.

My current ask of David is a drive in a 991 Carrera with a 7-speed manual transmission. I want to be able to compare a base car with few bells and whistles to the loaded Carrera S that I drove for this article. I can't wait.



We opened our 2012 season with the Winter DE Seminar held on Saturday, February 4th at Carolina Motorsports Park in Kershaw, SC. 23 interested drivers participated in the afternoon session. To close out the event, we were able to tour the CMP facility and get on track for a few parade laps. Thanks to Shane, Lou, Don Morris & John Babinski for their support and thanks to CMP for opening their doors for us.

Whether you attended the seminar or not, registration for our April event at CMP is open. Carolina Motorsports Park is conveniently located just south of Kershaw SC. Event fees have increased slightly this year. PCA member rate is \$250, nonmember rate is \$290. Instructors are still \$100. CMP is a great facility for beginners and experienced alike. From the Kink to the Carousel, April weather should be perfect to sample the 14 turn, 2 1/4 mile track.

Registration will be online using ClubRegistration. net. As a rule, registration for an event will open 2 months prior to the event. Be sure to visit the DE page on our region website as well. We have a lot of good information there such as our updated Drivers Ed Guide, 2012 tech form and the approved inspection sites. Our dates for this year are:

April 28/29 at CMP in Kershaw, SC July 14/15 at AMP in Dawsonville, GA Sept 8/9 at CMP in Kershaw, SC Season Finale November 16-18 at VIR in Alton, VA

For potential PCA Instructors, Shane Tisdale and Marty Barrett will be holding the PCA National Instructors Clinic on Friday preceding our event. The clinic will be a combination of classroom and on track scenarios. The clinic is free although participants must register for the Turn One track day on Friday. If you have 30 track days or more and want to pass along that experience, its a great opportunity to sit in the right hand seat and get a feel for instructing.

For younger drivers, BRAKES summer schedule at zMAX in Concord, NC is filling fast. They also have a March 17th school in Morganton, NC for Burke County residents. BRAKES is a FREE, Defensive driving program for teens and is held every month or so. More information is on their web site at www.putonthebrakes.com. "It's the Real Thing"

962113 - 1986 Sebring Winner

What can be said about the 956/962? Plenty, of course, and over the years much has been published about Porsche's most successful, racecar ever. With 129 overall wins in a 13 year span;— a record that is likely never to be duplicated— wins included the FIA Group C series, America's IMSA, and the Japanese Sports Car Championship Series. The first win came in 1982 in 956-002, then a new racer out of the box, with drivers Jacky Ickx, and Derek Bell in Rothmans livery. The final win in came 1994 at Le Mans in the flat bottomed Dauer 962 built to GT1 rules, with drivers Mauro Baldi, Yannick Dalmas, Hurly Haywood and car owner Jochen Dauer.

The 956 was developed to replace the tube framed 936 by Porsche's chief race engineer Norbert Singer, and was the first Porsche to utilize an aluminum monocoque chassis and ground effects undertray. What Singer discovered during wind tunnel testing was that the ground effects concept with a full width sports car didn't work the same as in an open wheeled Formula 1 car. Singer learned that unlike a Formula 1 car, which developed downforce from the nose area, closed wheel sports cars developed downforce between the front and rear tires. Thus whenever the F1 style side skirts where added during early wind tunnel testing, the ground effect would be lost.

With this discovery, the shape of the tunnels became even more important, thus leading to angling the engine up towards the rear. The final prototype that emerged was one with a monocoque construction utilizing a double wishbone type suspension in the front, and behind the cockpit bulkhead was a detachable tubular subframe which supported the engine, transmission, and rear push rod sus-

pension. This was utilized in such a fashion to increase downforce of the tunnels by placing spring/shock units above the carefully designed under trays. Water radiators, and intercoolers where behind the cockpit doors in the car's side pods, with a ramp designed to feed air to them in an efficient manner.

The engine was a 2.6 liter taken from original design for the cancelled Indy Car program, and was later used successfully on the 936. This motor used Bosch Motronic injection for the European Group C Series, which imposed a maximum fuel allocation during a race. The 956 design went on to be very successful, winning 5 consecutive World Sports Car titles from '82 to '86.

The Porsche 962 first appeared on American soil in 1984, featuring a revised 956 chassis that is 102mm longer than it's earlier sibling 956. Developed to conform to IMSA head John Bishop for safety regulations which required the driver's feet to be behind the front axle/suspension. The additional length was added between the area behind the front tire and in front of the driver's door, and is the quickest way to visually distinguish the 2 cars. Another difference required by IMSA was that 962 have an air-cooled, 2-valve engine, compared to the 956's 4-valve, "water boxer".

The first time a 962 raced in American was in 1984 at the season opening Daytona 24 Hours, driven by Mario and Michael Andretti, where it failed to finish with engine and gearbox problems. Also discovered was that 2.8 liter engine was inadequate against Group 44 Jaguars, and Chevy powered March's. (An interesting tidbit, was that the privateer Porsche teams where surprised and upset, thinking that they where to have exclusivity to the 962's being delivered and raced

in IMSA. However, it turned out that the Andretti's where the only ones to ever race a factory backed 962's in the IMSA series)

It was not until the mid-summer that Holbert Racing, with the famed Lowenbrau sponsored 962-103, would utilize a 3.2 liter, mechanically injected engine from a 935 along with the 956 "short tail" body work, that it would become a consistent winner. For the next several years in IMSA, it would be a Porsche 962 show, with 4 straight Daytona wins, 2 straight IMSA titles for Holbert Racing and 50 overall wins during it's 11 year history.

"Have a Coke and a Smile"

The 962 featured in this month's article is chassis #962113. Once again, Dave Brown from RennGruppe Motorsports in Lexington was gracious to invite me up to take a look at it while it is disassembled so that I could do a TR article from this unique perspective. It is being re-freshened for the Amelia Island Concourse in mid- March. This is one of the "early series" production cars, and was one of only 19 produced at the factory. It features a 5052 aluminum monocoque chassis with solid rivet construction, a steel roll cage riveted to the monocoque, and various machined steel bulkheads with suspension attach points. The car is built very much like aircraft construction of the same period, including aircraft electrical connectors and cannon plugs. Another feature is the 2 piece, ground effects undertray, consisting of a 3-foot aluminum section, and a 3-foot Kevlar section which connect in the front to the flat bottom monocoque tub. The tunnels continue under the rear suspension to the back end, creating the negative down force these cars are known for.



The engine is a 3.2 liter, air cooled with intercooled single KKK turbo, and a 5-speed manual 962 transmission. The brakes are an 8-caliper, 4-piston design, with

conventional iron rotors. This car was originally purchased in 1985 by famed racer/owner Bob Akin to replace chassis #962-002, which was heavily damaged at the Road America race during the middle of the '85 race season.

This very successful #5 car was raced from mid-1985 thru 1987 under the sponsorship of Coke-Cola and Dominos Pizza. It competed in a total of 25 races, with 16 finishes, 9 retirements and 3 podium finishes including the overall win at the 1986 Sebring 12 hour, with drivers Bob Akin, Hans Stuck and Jo Gartner. (Unfortunately Jo Gartner later lost his life at Le Mans the same year when his Kremer 962's right rear suspension broke at speed on the Mulsanne Strait)

Notable finishes in 1985 include 5th place At Sears Point, 5th place Columbus, Ohio and 6th place at the Daytona season finale. In 1986, #962-113 competed a full season, it's best finishes include: 3rd place Miami Grand Prix, 1st place Sebring, 4th at Riverside, 2nd at Charlotte, 6th at Lime Rock, 4th at Watkins Glen and 4th at the Daytona season finale.

As for 1987, Bob Akin ran a reduced schedule, but was able to get some notable results including 6th at Sebring, 6th at Dayton, Ohio,

8th at Columbus, Ohio. At the end of the year #962-113 was retired for a newer 962 series chassis.

Due to the 962's dominant racing success in IMSA's GTP class in the mid '80s, series founder John Bishop attempted several times to limit the Porsche's performance by either reducing the engine size, adding engine inlet restrictors or by adding weight. In the beginning in 1984, the maximum turbo engine size was 3.57 liters, with a minimum weight of 900kgs.

In 1985 maximum engine size was reduced to 3.5 liters. 1986 engine size was reduced to 3.2 liters and minimum weight was raised to 943kg. For 1987 the engine size was once again reduced to 3.0 liters, but the weight was also reduce to 930kg. 1988 saw the engine inlet restricted to 57mm, positioned within 50mm of the turbo charger. In mid season there was a revision for the air-cooled, single turbo cars, reducing weight to 924kg. By this time the "water boxer" 962 was also racing in the series to combat the new Nissan and Jaguar threat. These cars had a twin turbo 3.2 with 36mm restrictors.

By the late '80's many of the privateer 962 teams continued to improve, and modify, their cars to remain competitive, including revisions to aerodynamics, bodywork, and mechanical improvements. Some teams went as far to build entirely new chassis of various materials such as carbon fiber, aluminum honeycomb, and stronger machined sections to improve rigidity. Those teams include:

 Joest Racing heavily modified a pair of 962's to compete against Jaguar in IMSA, winning the 962's final sprint race victory at Road America.





- The Kremer team built 11 carbon fiber tub cars, the 962CK6.
- John Thompson built 8 cars for Brun Motorsports, helping the team take second in the World Sports Car Championship 1987.
- Thompson also built 2 chassis for Obermaier Racing.
- Richard Lloyd Racing's GTI engineering built 4 962 GTI's, with an aluminum honeycomb chassis.
- Former factory driver Vern Schuppan, would also build 5 chassis, known at the TS962.
- Jochen Dauer, built a 962 street legal version, that qualified in the GT1 class and went on to win the 1994 Le Mans 24 hour.

The same was happening in America:

- Holbert Racing was making modifications to their chassis, renaming them 962HR series.
- Jim Busby contracted to Jim Chapman to build a more robust 962 monocoque.
- Dyson Racing used a Richard Lloyd chassis used for their 962DR-1 car.

Today the 956 and 962 live on, receiving legend status at historic racing events though out the world, providing the fans and owners with the kind of excitement often missing from today's mundane sports car series. As time goes on that legend will only continue to grow.



Next, we have finalized our 2012 new car classes, adding in the new Porsche models that have recently been released, as well as adding Showroom Stock Class for those of you who have a 100% bone stock late model Porsche with absolutely NO MODIFICATIONS. It must be same as driven out of the dealership. Meaning your tools, jack, air compressor, spare tire (if applicable), floor mats, etc. All must remain in the car. Stock wheels. OEM spec tires, etc.. This class is normally only used for Concourse events. But since we have enough cars that seem to fit, we are going to try it out this year.

You will also notice, we don't list the "Modified" Class this year. That's not to say we won't use it... if applicable.

But the new 2012 PCA National Rules allow the "Improved" Class to do just about any modification, save "removing headlights, and taillights" and weight reductions. So we will just stick with Improved this year, unless someone shows up in a full racecar, with headlights or taillights removed, and/or falls BELOW the minimum weight requirement of "Improved" Class.

Also new this year is that drivers will register in the class of their choice. This is the same way Porsche Parade does their registration. It's the driver's choice, and driver's responsibility, to read the rules, understand them and register their car accordingly.

Of course, the Autocross committee is always here to help if your not sure, or need more clarity on the rules before registering.

a great variety of tasty food. I can assure you no one went home hungry.



Cars and Coffee was a big hit as usual this month maybe because of the nice weather.


The DE Seminar at CMP was well attended and well presented. We will have some new track rats come out of this.
