

The tour started at 9:30 and the group of 15 people in 10 Porsches headed out for an enjoyable day on the roads of North and South Carolina. We headed from Greenville, through Travelers Rest and up 276 to our first stop at Caesar's Head to regroup, stretch our legs and enjoy the sights from the overlook. I was in the tail end position for this leg of the trip. I felt that I had the best view as the sight of the 10 Porsches all in line was impressive. I did make the comment that as being the only red Porsche in the group, I felt like the "Little Red Caboose" on the "Porsche Express". We left Caesar's Head and continued on 276 to the Blue Ridge Parkway. I had the lead for this leg of the trip and I was greeted by sweeping curves and numerous elevation changes. For a portion of this route, we were held up behind a couple of slow moving motorcycles. How's that for a switch. This gave the group the opportunity to enjoy the sights along the way and it kept the group together. Upon seeing the line of Porsches heading north, oncoming traffic greeted us with many waves and thumbs up. Except, that is, for the southbound Ferrari F430. I guess you can't buy friendly.

Once on the Blue Ridge Parkway, we headed to our lunch destination, the Pisgah Inn. They set up two long tables, back to back, that allowed all of us to be a part of the conversation. After a leisurely lunch, the group headed out to the parking lot for a group photo and to mount up for the next leg of the tour. We headed back down the Blue Ridge Parkway to continue on 276 North up to Waynesville, NC. Once there, we set a time to meet back by the cars and everyone broke off into small groups to explore downtown Waynesville. While most of the shops were closed, as they do not open on Sundays until after Memorial Day, there were still plenty of shops to explore. Most of the group ended the visit to Waynesville at the local ice cream shop.



The group then reformed for the final leg of the tour. As it was after 3:00 in the afternoon, two couples headed out on more direct routes home. The balance of the group headed back down 276 to the Blue Ridge Parkway. We took the Blue Ridge up to the Asheville area, got on Route 26 and headed back to South Carolina. That was the official end of the tour as half the group continued on 26 to the Spartanburg area and the other half headed down 25 toward Greenville and Anderson.

## 911 Extraordinaire

"I grew up on a 160 acre farm outside of Ablemarle, in Stanley County, tinkering on farm equipment, go carts and motorcycles. In the mid 50's my Dad, J.C., worked for Brown Motor Company, commuting back and forth in an early VW beetle," Terry Sossamon tells me as we talk and share Porsche stories. We are on the garage floor of his business, The 9-11 Shop, located at 6721 Orr Road on the northeast side of Charlotte. One of the first things I noticed in the shop are Terry's 2 immaculate black beauties – a 1987 Carrera, and his award winning 1967 911S, with 4 trophies sitting in the back seat.

"Brown Motor Company, once located on Morehead St., was the first dealership to sell VW/ Porsche/DKW in the Charlotte area and was owned by a fellow named Brown Magnum." Terry went on giving me a history lesson on early years of Porsche in Charlotte. "In the late 50's Magnum Motors was sold to Hendricks Belk [of the Belk family] and was re-named Henderson Motors and was located on Wilkinson Blvd. They were the dealership for most German margues, including VW, Porsche, BMW, Mercedes, Borgward, and DKW. "In the early '60s, J.C. decided to start his own VW repair shop closer to home in Ablemarle, so my older brother Gary and I, following my dad's footsteps, worked at his shop. I was 12 years old." Unfortunately the Sossamon family suffered a tragedy, when Terry lost his father to a sudden heart attack at the young age of 37. "I was only 16 at the time, and my older brother Gary was 18, but we kept the VW shop open. I would work after school and on the weekends, and was building VW's and an occasional 356 engine. I had a beetle at the age of 15, with a high performance engine equipped with Porsche 356 carbs, and could outrun my brother in his VW." Terry told tells me enthusiastically.


After graduating high school in 1969 at the June 2012 - Page 8

age of 18, Terry got married and also landed a new job in Charlotte at Autohaus, owned by Remi Rogers, located on Independence Blvd. Autohaus was the dealership at the time for Porsche, MG, and Austin. Terry went on to further explain that Porsche's, aside from routine maintenance were very reliable, but that was not the case for the disgruntled MG and Austin customers, who often returned with reliability issues! "I was the youngest mechanic at the shop to be sent to the various Porsche factory training classes, located either in Alexandria Va. or Jacksonville Fla.", he explained. This was the Vietnam War era, and after a working at Autohaus for a year and a half Terry decided to go ahead and enlist in the Air Force to avoid being drafted in the Army. "I worked on all types of ground equipment, was stationed in Guam for awhile, and worked for 12 months on bomb haulers. Later on, I was at McCoy AFB in Orlando, Fla. and was in charge of the Auto Hobby Shop for a year where the Enlisted G.I.'s could work on their cars themselves, and I would supervise and it was a lot of fun."

In 1974, after 2 years and 10 months, Terry was able to get an early discharge from the Air Force, and returned to work once again at Autohaus. "They had moved to a larger facility, in what is now the Hendrick Mercedes dealership on Independence Blvd. This was when Porsche introduced the CIS fuel injection on the 911's and early on had all types of problems with it. Much of the issue's were related to backfiring, which would break the plastic airboxes . I remember replacing 3 airboxes on one 911 while still under warranty," Terry explained. Eventually the fix was to install a "pop off" valve to prevent this.

In 1976, Terry decided to start an independent repair business with, then partner, Wallace Watson. They called it German Automotive Inc., with the shop located on Central Ave. across from the Little Italy Restaurant in Charlotte. "We mostly worked on Porsche,

Audi, and watercooled VW's. "There were a lot of issue's with the Audi 100 back then and they kept us busy. Sometimes partnerships can be tricky so I bought out Wallace after 18 months and remained at the Central Ave. location for another year." Terry's business had grown and he now had 3 full time mechanics working for him and needed more space, so he moved the shop a few miles down the road to the Plaza and 36th Street.

"It didn't work out quite like I thought it would. Over time we had some zoning issue's with the city of Charlotte, because we were doing a lot of engine overhauls, and for this type of work the city required full industrial zoning which we didn't have. So once again in 1980, I decided to make a fundamental change to the business, downsize and focus on my true passion - the Porsche 911. This time the business was moved Mooresville, on Hwy 150, right next to Ralph Brawley's Coach Craft shop. Ralph owned the adjacent building (which later became Stuttgart Haus of Parts). I had known Ralph for a long time prior to this. The Porsche community was small enough back then. We all knew each other. I re-named the business The 9-11 Shop. When I downsized I got rid of a lot of stuff, including a ton of 356 parts. There wasn't much interest for them back in the late '70's and early '80's, and the parts were practically worthless at the time. If I only had known what I do know about resurgent interest in them!" Terry laughs. The new business plan worked out well, Terry worked on the cars he truly loved, and being next to Ralph, they complimented each other. Terry would give Ralph all the referral work for metal and bodywork, Ralph gave Terry much his mechanical work. Another well-known Porsche figure back then was Bill Funderud. "Over the years I have done a lot of work for Bill, he always had another car in the works for me to fix." Actually, that reminds of last October's article. Didn't Bill own 42 Porsches?

Business was going well for Terry. In 1985 he bought some property back in Charlotte, and built a completely new facility in the current location at 6721 Orr Rd. "I wanted to be more centrally located for my customers." He explained to me. Over the years Terry has built a very loyal customer base, many who been going to Terry for 20 or 30 years and a few more than that! "I have also on occasion had some of my loyal customer's other cars at the shop, and have worked Ferrari, Lamborghini, and Maserati. My favorite remains as always the aircooled 911, although I do work on the newer watercooled Porsche's." Terry builds 911 engines of all sizes, including stock engines and club racing engines such as 2.5, 2.6, 2.8, and early turbo engines. Also Terry is a specialist in transmission overhaul for the 911, including early 901, 915, g-50 types. There good reasons for Terry success: First, his very personalized service – He meets his customers and his hours are based on appointment only basis. Second, is his enviable reliability record of his engines that he has built, because he insists on using only factory OEM engine parts and will only do it one way - the right way. "I have turned customers away on occasion because they wanted to use aftermarket engine parts or a questionable practice's on a rebuild that would affect the reliability. They could take it somewhere else to do things that way, but not here."

The other thing Terry is passionate about is his fishing. He has been doing that since his childhood days in Stanley County. Over the years he has entered tournaments and has trophies for Sailfish, Grouper, Red Drum, and Black Drum. Most of his time on the weekends is spent at his place in Oriental, or Holden Beach.

So if you are in the Charlotte area and you own a air cooled 911, if you want the best care for it, Terry Sossamon is the man to visit at The  $9-11\,\mathrm{Shop}$ .

# 918 Spyder prototypes commence trials

#### **Development of the Porsche super sports car enters next phase**

Stuttgart. The Porsche 918 Spyder is on the road: Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG, Stuttgart, has taken the driving trials of the super sports car of the future a step further with completion of the initial prototypes. The 918 Spyder will go into production at the end of September 2013 as planned, with the first customers receiving their vehicles before 2013 is out. "What we are doing with the 918 Spyder is redefining driving fun, efficiency and performance," said Wolfgang Hatz, Member of the Executive Board Research and Development of Porsche AG.

The prototypes, their camouflage harking back to historical Porsche 917 racing cars, signal the final touches to the 918 Spyder. The focus is on the interplay between the highly sophisticated individual drive components. The combination of combustion engine and two independent electric motors – one on the front axle and one in the drive line, acting on the rear wheels – poses completely new demands on the development of the operating strategies. "They are therefore a critical component in this vehicle into which we have put all of our expertise and capacity for innovation," said Wolfgang Hatz. These operating strategies and the development of the software to go with them
