ALMS at VIR

Many PCA members follow those other forms of racing, i.e. the ones that turn left AND right. Last year when we found out that Grand Am would not return to VIR, a lot of you were disappointed, as was I. But when I found out that the ALMS was going to take its place at VIR, the thought of the speed that the P1 prototypes would reach left me a bit giddy (the Muscle Milk HPD ARX-03a lapped VIR at 1:35.434 (123.352 mph) which beat the previous record of 1:36.3 clocked by an ex-Benetton F1 car in 2004).

Accordingly, plans were made post haste to attend.

As I have chronicled in this monthly article, my son Cooper has been attending many PCA events over the past couple of years. I have tried to match the length of events, as well as distance, to his level of endurance. He went with me to 'In Den Bergen' this year, which entailed a 3 hour ride to Waynesville. So I figured a 2 ½ hour trip to VIR would be safe, knowing that we would have to leave the race early (the race start time was 2:30PM). So after buy off from Mom, plans were made and tickets bought.

Cooper has always been a trooper when travelling in the Cayenne, even though it does not have a DVD player as we have in the Family Truckster (aka Honda Odyssey). He enjoys looking at the passing scenery, singing songs and making astute observations ('Daddy, that man can't hear you'). Put it this way, he is better behaved than some past adult travel companions ... and less opinionated ... so far anyway.

Both Cooper and I had a great time. We met up with Rob Purviance and his son, as well as Bob and Nadine Saville, Hal Michael, Tom Morgan and many other Carolinas Region members. We walked the paddock and chatted with the Flying Lizard Team. Cooper got his Flying Lizard T-Shirt signed by all the drivers and got a picture with Patrick Long and Jörg Bergmeister. Both were very gracious with their time and patience.

My Dad started taking me to races when I was around 6 and I have always had fond memories of those days. I am hoping to pass on similar memories to Cooper. The next generation starts now.



In Den Bergen 2012

'In Den Bergen' continued its strong year over year growth in 2012 with 142 registrants participating in the fourth annual event on August 10-12. It's not a surprise. The low key atmosphere of a People's Choice Concours and the beautiful setting in the mountains at The Waynesville Inn Golf Resort and Spa results in a laid back atmosphere for Porsche people to enjoy their cars.

What began as one person's idea, Mountain Area member Ron Becker, to share their passion for Porsche cars with the local community and raise funds benefitting a local charity has firmly established itself as one of the top events in the Carolinas Region and Zone 3. The involvement of Sarge's Animal Rescue Foundation adds to the event and provides the Carolinas Region and Mountain Area, in particular, an opportunity to give back to the community in which they live.

Sarge's volunteers circulated with adoptable pets during the event and put on view its mini dog house collection box for donations. "This is the fourth year that the Carolinas PCA has promoted Sarge's at this event," said David Butler, Mountain Area Director and event chairman. Sarge's receives all proceeds from the raffle of donated items as well as donations received from the public and PCA entrants. With donations, onsite fund raising activities and the Carolinas PCA matching charitable donation, the event raised \$3500.00 for Sarge's. A check was presented to Gary Smith, President of the Board for Sarge's on August 30. "It's a pleasure to present Sarge's Animal Rescue Foundation a check to support the services they provide", said Butler.

"Sarge's is very grateful to the Carolinas PCA, Mountain Area for raising this money to help with the expenses involved in the rescue of animals from the local shelter," said Smith. "In August, Sarge's adopted out 49 dogs and cats. This ties the record for the best August ever (set last year). Plus we transported 54 dogs to Northeast rescue shelters where they are more rapidly adopted. The donation will go a long way to provide needed medical treatment and fuel for transports."

This year's 'In Den Bergen' registrants displayed 74 Porsche cars on the first fairway of the Carolinas course at The Waynesville Inn. Event registrants included PCA members from Florida, Louisiana, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia. The People's Choice Concours winner was Chip Perry of Blowing Rock, NC with his beautiful 1958 Meissen Blue 356A Speedster. Class winners are listed on this page.

Autocross:

Don't Always Believe The Weather Forecast.

Sunday Sept. 16, was a strange day. This would be the first time, that I can remember having a potential rainout at an Autocross event. Cari and I have been doing Autocross for 4 years now. Approximately 22 events. Up until today, we had never had it rain at one of our events.

At 6:00 a.m. Sunday morning the Doppler Radar showed it was raining down at Charlotte Knights Stadium, and the weather forecast was 40-50% rain all day. Neither of us really wanted to putt-putt around in the rain. So we made the decision to leave the car and trailer at home, and just bring all the timing equipment down and run the event. Rain or shine. Right?

By the time we got there at 7:00 a.m. the rain stopped. Checking the weather again still showed 40-50% rain. At about 8:00 a.m. the sky was almost all clear. Weather forecast still showed 40-50% rain all day.

Another hour goes by, and we are getting ready to start the event. Still clear sky, and all of a sudden weather forecast shows 0% chance for the next 3 hours. BUT 60% chance around 1 pm.

So, now Cari and I have to make a decision. Does one of us run back home and get the car & trailer or not? We both come to the same conclusion & Cari takes off to get the Car, while I start running the event.

Now, we are in a time crunch. We know it's almost certainly going to rain in the afternoon. So I push to get as many Dry runs for everyone as possible before lunch.

Knock on wood, we did okay. Everyone got 5 runs in before lunch. Never before have we had an event where we got both run groups 5 runs, BEFORE lunch. And as luck would have it, just after we finished lunch and started the event back up, the rain came. Unfortunately, we didn't have enough Umbrellas for the corner workers, and they were getting soaked. So, we

called it a day after the first group was going on their 7th run.

Everyone seemed pretty positive that we made the best of a potential crummy day. Getting 5 dry runs finished on a day that began with rain and ended with rain, wasn't too bad.

A few interesting notes for this event:

We had a new couple join the autocross this weekend. Joan Carney and her husband Kevin brought out their Red Cayman S. Since this was Joan's First Autocross, Walter was in the car coaching as she navigated the course. The First Lap, she was taking it easy. Then she decided to let Walter driver her car, with her as a passenger, to get a better feel for the course and to see what her car was capable of. He threw down a very fast lap time of 52.5 seconds. After they switched back, on her very next run she dropped 13 seconds off her previous lap. By the end of the day, she dropped 30 seconds from her first run. Outstanding. The best part was the grin she had on her face after each run. That is what Autocross is all about.

Wayne Capwell, Ken Clayton and Andy Rutledge were dead set on breaking my FTD winning streak this year. Wayne set the bar almost immediately, with a 49.465 on his 2nd lap. Ken then one-upped Wayne with a 49.058.

On Wayne's last "DRY" run, he was able to knock a little more time off and finish with a 49.014, which again, appeared to be the Fastest Time of the Day.

Unfortunately, for Wayne, there was one driver who was also gunning for FTD. Gregg Henderson joined our autocross event for the first time in his "Very Well Prepped" Miata and finished the day with a blistering 48.966. Taking the Men's Fastest Time of the Day (FTD).

...Oh Yea...

Cari wound up making it back with our car and trailer around 11:00. We unloaded quickly and she got in line to grab a few runs before the run group switched. Neither of us had much of an idea of the course layout because of all the chaos in the morning. But, we each managed to squeeze in 3 dry laps before the sky fell.

Cari pushed hard enough to get down to a 52.132, in just 3 laps, and secured the ladies FTD... "Nice job, Honey."

I wasn't so fortunate. My morning wasn't going well to start, because of the stress of a potential wet event, trying to get the event setup quickly, trying to get everyone as many runs as we could before the rain, "what time was the pizza coming", would it get here before it rained, leaving the car at home (Why did I do that?), and of course hoping Cari remembered how to hook up the trailer correctly while being in a hurry to get back. My mind just wasn't in it. I DNF'd my first two runs. Then on my 3rd run, I got a 50 sec lap but, + 1 cone which came out to 52.726. Uggh.

I wished I could have gotten more runs, because, I started to settle down after the 3rd run. And get my head in the game. But, alas, it was my own stupid fault for leaving the car at home.

So, the moral of the story is; Bring your Car. RAIN OR SHINE. Because, the weather forecast is not always accurate. Actually, it's usually wrong, about 75% of the time. Man, I wish I could work where I only had to be right 25% of the time, and still keep my job.

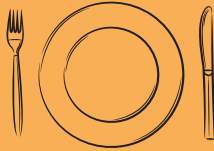

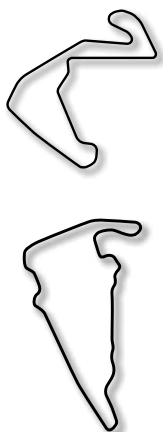

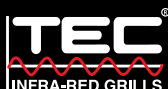
