Road Atlanta and Petit Le Mans

Enduring Classics

Ah, fall has finally arrived! A time of year I really look forward to, like so many others, for some great rides in my Porsche to the mountains to enjoy the pleasure of driving and to enjoy the colorful foliage change. Also a great time to attend some of the best IMSA races, and the Petit Le Mans 10-Hour race at Road Atlanta is at the top of my list. This is a race I have attended for many years. Since Road Atlanta has had a very interesting and fascinating history throughout the years, I thought it would be a great topic for this month's historian article.

In 1969 David Slayer, Earl Walker and Arthur Montgomery purchased a 750 acre plot of farmland in Braselton Ga. When a Can Am race had to be cancelled due to flood damage, the organizers chose Road Atlanta to replace it. The track then began to take form quickly, taking only 6 months to excavate, grade, and pave the 2.54 mile road course. The first race was held on Sept. 13, 1970, with "Quick Vic" Elf-ord in a Chaparral 2J [the infamous vacuum racer] taking the pole. Tony Dean in a Porsche 908/02 won the 300km Can Am event, and Stirling Moss was the Grand Marshall. Throughout the 70's top level racing series came to Road Atlanta, including Can-Am, Formula 5000, IMSA Camel GT

and the Trans-Am. The SCCA held their annual championship, The Runoffs, there from 1970 to 1993. The 1st road race in NASCAR's Busch Grand National Series history took place at Road Atlanta in 1986.

The track was sold in 1978 to Fort Lauderdale's infamous Whittington Brothers, Don, Bill, and Dale. The era of their ownership is a story of its own. Bill and Don both where involved in aviation in South Fla. Bill competed and won at the Reno air races from '78 to '83, and Don owned World Jet, based at Fort Lauderdale's Executive airport. They also loved all types of Auto racing, successfully winning the 1979 24 Hours of Le Mans in a Porsche 935 with co-driver Klaus Ludwig, who did most of his stints in the rain. Also in 1982, all 3 entered the Indy 500, the only trio of brothers to ever qualify for the same race!

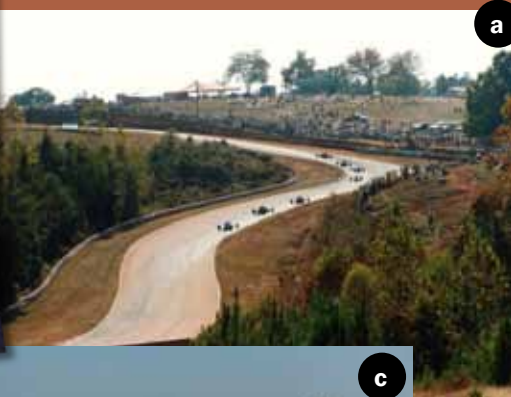
In 1984, Bill Whittington formed Blue Thunder Racing with fellow Indy driver Randy Lanier, competing at the infamous race a total of 5 times. Interestingly, most of the time their racecars where absent of any advertising or sponsorship, raising eyebrows including the federal governments! Rumors circulated that one of the purposes of owning Road Atlanta, was the back straight away was

doubling for a landing strip at night for marijuana and narcotics drop-offs to supplement the Whittington's expensive racing habits. Apparently there was some merit to the rumors. Don was implicated in drug trafficking in 1985, also pleading guilty to tax evasion in '87. Bill pleaded guilty to tax evasion and conspiracy in 1986. Also convicted were Randy Lanier, and fellow South Floridians and Porsche 935 racers John Paul Sr. and John Paul Jr. All became part of the IMSA drug smuggling scandal of the high flying 1980's.

By 1993 Road Atlanta had fallen into bankruptcy. A new partnership between business executives Frank Drendel, (Father of the late Carolinas PCA'er Matt Drendel) Jim Kanely, Eddie Edwards, George Nuse, and Bill Waddell was formed to purchase the track. The next 3 years were spent making gradual improvements to a facility that had not enjoyed the kind of care it deserved for at least a decade. New buildings were constructed, old ones renovated, the track was widened and re-surfaced, and grounds landscaped.

In 1996 the track was sold once more to Don Panoz, who would make Braselton the base of operations for his motorsports ventures. Panoz, also the founder of The American Le Mans Series, introduced the first major changes to the track, removing "The Dip", and creating a chicane at the end of long back straight. These changes brought the track up to FIA standards, so that international events could be held. A new pit and paddock area was also constructed on the infield side of the track, allowing for larger events and a 10,000 seat terrace area around turn 10 completed.

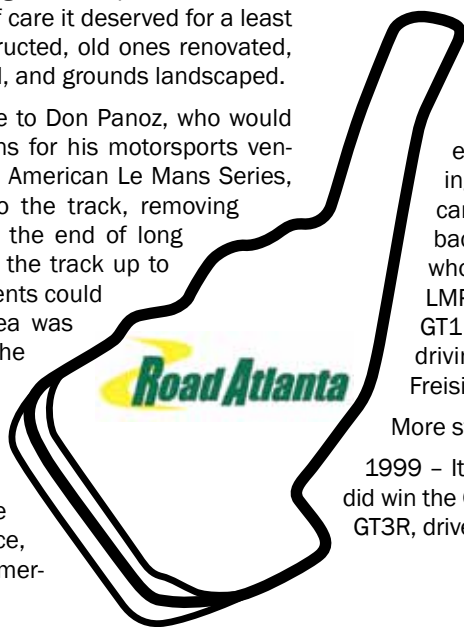
In 1998 major racing resumed with what would be the first edition of the Petit Le Mans 10-hour endurance race, serving as a preview of new for 1999 Amer-

ican Le Mans Series. Petit's 1000 kilometers became an important part of the Big 3 events for worldwide endurance racing, joining the 12 Hours of Sebring and the French classic 24 Hours of Le Mans. Petit had close ties to the 24 Hours of Le Mans, and an added bonus to the winning teams was a guaranteed entry into that great French race.

Road Atlanta's new endurance race attracted attention worldwide, and 1998's entries included the Le Mans winning prototype Porsche factory team. I attended that first year and was witness to a spectacular accident about half way thru the race. The factory entered GT1 Porsche piloted by Yannick Dalmas, racing down the back straight away with a 2-lap lead, became airborne just after "the hump" and did a complete back flip landing on the rear suspension shattering the whole rear section of the car. A Ferrari 333SP won the LMP class. Porsche still collected three first place wins – GT1 with Bob Wolleek, Thierry Boutsen and Ralf Kelleners driving for Champion Porsche; GT2 by the German team Freisinger Porsche; and GT3 with A.R.E. Racing's 911 RSR.

More strong results for Porsche followed:

1999 – It was Panoz Racing collecting top honors, but Porsche did win the GT2 honors with German team Manthey Racing's, 911 GT3R, drivers Dirk Muller, Cort Wagner, and Sascha Massen.





2000 – Team Audi Motorsport in the new R8 was the top LMP1 winner, with drivers Alan McNish, Dindo Capello, and Michele Alboreto. A BMW V12 LMR repeated the back flip on the rear straight just as happened in '98, and again a Porsche was able to collect GT2 honors with Bob Wolleck and Sascha Massen once more.

2001 – Audi continued its LMP1 dominance, this time with driver Emanuele Pirro, and Frank Beila. Although this time Porsche had no class wins. BMW was the GT2 class winner with Hans Stuck, and Boris Said at the wheel.

2002 – Factory-backed Team Joest Audi took the top 3 endurance races that year, Sebring, Le Mans and Petit Le Mans – with Tom Kristensen, and Dindo Capello in 1st. Alex Job Racing's 911 GT3RS took 1st in the GT2 class with drivers Sascha Massen and Lucas Luhr.

2003 – Audi yet again tops honors with Champion Racing's ex-F1 shoes JJ Lehto and Johnny Herbert. And, you guessed it, another GT2 Porsche win by Alex Job Racing and drivers Timo Bernhard and Jorg Bergmeister.

2004 – Another Champion Audi dominating win with JJ Lehto and Marco Werner. GT2 repeated winners, Alex Job's team with drivers Timo Bernhard and Jorg Bergmeister yet again.

2005 – This time Team Audi Sport North America/Champion Racing was in the winners circle with driver's Frank Beila, and Emanuele Pirro. GT 2 honors went to White Lightning racing a Porsche GT3RSR with drivers Patrick Long and Jorg Bergmeister, Alex Job Racing took 2nd place, 1 lap down.

2006 – Team Audi Sport N. America repeated, but this time with their new TDI diesel V12 powered R10. Alan McNish, and Sascha Massen were the winning pilots. LMP2

was won by the new Penske Racing 3.4 V8 powered Porsche RS Spyder and drivers Timo Bernhard and Emmanuel Collard. GT2 was once again White Lightning Racing a 911GT3 RSR, with road aces Jorg Bergmeister, Patrick Long and Nic Jonsson.

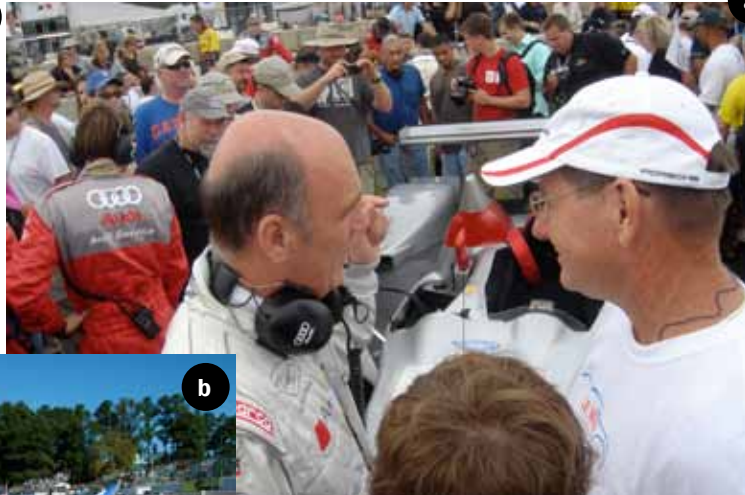

2008 – In LMP1, Audi was toppled this year by Peugeot Sport's new diesel, Penske Racing repeated in LMP2 with the Porsche RS Spyder, and GT2 class was won by the Risi Competizione Ferrari this year -Jamie Melo driving.

2009 – A very unusual year. The race was stopped after 4 hours because flooding caused by heavy rains, it did NOT restart and the results were determined from final lap prior to stoppage: LMP1 - Peugeot Sport; LMP2 class – Dyson racing; GT2 went again to the Risi Competizione Ferrari.

2010 – There where 2 new entry-level classes added – LMPC and GTC. For the headlining LMP1 class, again it was the Peugeot. The only class with a Porsche to win was GT3 Cup based GTC, with TRG at top honor.

2011 – LMP1 yet another win by Peugeot, the GTC class was won by Black Swan racing's 911 GT3 Cup.

2012 – There was change in the sports car racing world this year. The World Endurance Championship did not include Petit Le Mans on its 2012 calendar as it had in 2011, so the factory teams of Audi and Toyota did not attend. This opened the door for the Swiss independent Rebellion Racing's LMP1 Lola Toyota to win overall with Neel Jani, Nicolas Prost, and Andrea Belicchi the drivers. Porsche's only win was in the one-make GTC class with NGT Motorsports taking first.

The 2012 race also saw the North American debut of the Nissan powered DeltaWing entered by Highcroft Racing. Running unclassified, the revolutionary car easily turned lap times that were competitive with the LMP2 cars and finished sixth place overall.

All told Road Atlanta has been a great place for Porsche, standing on top of the podium 16 times in various classes in the 15 years Petit Le Mans has existed. Road Atlanta is great place to spend a weekend in October. Hope to see you there in the PorschePlatz!!

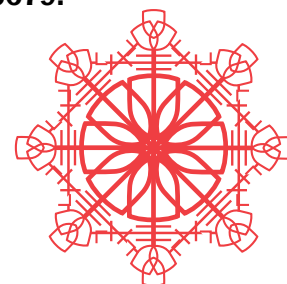

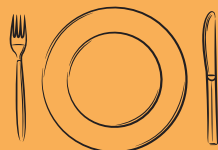
