

From the Driver's Seat

I've always thought how good it would be to regularly journal. My 3rd month into my new role and I'm starting to look forward to writing this column. This month, I have a lot of news to share with members about our Region's Annual Planning Meeting and our first quarterly Board Meeting of 2013. Both of these meetings had the unusual distinction of falling on the most dangerous driving days so far in 2013, with snow and ice appearing on both occasions. As with many professional organizations, it's vital to the health of the club to start off with a strong foundation each year. These meetings were chocked full of great discussions and new ideas. We had interesting, challenging discussions and approved new budgets and programs for this year. I'll try to summarize the changes, and hit the exciting new offerings we have in store this year.

First things first. I need to assure you that the region's financial condition is very strong. The cash balance is among the highest it's been in club history. We had an extremely successful DE program in 2012; high DE participation boosted the region's finances significantly. To establish a benchmark and ensure we're using sound financial practices, we set up a region Audit Committee in late 2012. The committee is comprised of Dave Lumpkin, Earl Roe, and Tammy Collins (our current Membership Chair). Dave served as both Treasurer and Vice President for PCA National and Earl previously served as the independent CPA for PCA National

Track Committee submitted budgets for 2 events at Carolina Motorsports Park, Atlanta Motorsports Park, and our yearend event at Virginia International Raceway (VIR). Based on suggestions at the planning meeting, the committee decided to give back to DE instructors by providing lunch tickets – a modest but welcome gesture to show appreciation to our highly-valued DE instructors, and Brian has some other for later in the season. If you're qualified as a solo driver, don't miss the opportunity to take advantage of a very special day on VIR's Grand Course for the Friday DE session this November.

I'd like to announce some exciting and special changes to our Autocross Series. Led by Sean Steinbrueck, the Autocross Committee received approval to invest in updated equipment that will allow them to lay out larger and safer courses and manage more participants within the tracking software. Now you might ask, where will we use all this new stuff? Sean has outlined a plan to hold 3 new events at the zMax Dragway in Concord, NC. This is a premiere facility and should provide us with the rare opportunity to actually get into 3rd gear! Some have called this the "Daytona of Autocross" and we expect that the increased challenge and excitement, being on a much more open track with longer runs, should stimulate more members to come out and give this growing sport a chance. If you have the slightest competitive streak, you need try autocrossing. Search online for "zMax autocross"

- impressive credentials. They focused on our current financial procedures and policies, as well as doing a sample audit on several random items. Their findings were extremely positive. Dave reported at our February Board Meeting, "Don (our current Treasurer) has implemented a bulletproof way of managing checks and has real-time ability to review and reconcile expenses." The committee recommended one improvement to ensure that we separate the deposit function from Don's current responsibilities reconciling the books. I want to thank Dave, Earl, and Tammy for volunteering their time to help ensure the region's financial practices are in top condition. We plan to implement a regular cadence to continue performing these audits in the future.

We'll end the year with two events in the Greensboro area, one of them part of the Triad's Oktoberfest celebration. Be part of the series, and see how you stack up against the region's best autocrossers!

Speaking of Sommerfest, you should find the registration details for our region's signature event of the year this Memorial Day weekend. Sommerfest includes activities for every taste and this year the event returns to the Upstate. We've partnered with a great hotel in a fantastic location that's offering reasonable rates with perks like a hosted Happy Hour and breakfast. Sommerfest 2013 will take advantage of exciting driving roads for the Rally, larger format autocross facilities, and a scenic concours location convenient to the hotel. This event will also be limited to a fixed number of registrants, so register early if you don't yet have Memorial Day commitments.

region's Board again voted to provide a charity match in an amount up to \$500 for each of the 8 area's selected charities in 2013. We also agreed to implement a test program to reimburse Board member's required travel to and from the 5 annual board meetings per our bylaws (1 planning meeting and 4 quarterly board meetings). Given the region's vast geography, we often meet in a central location, such as North Charlotte. Some board members travel 5 minutes, while others are spending up to 5 hours on the road, driving over 250 miles round trip in addition to the five-plus hour meeting time. It makes for a rather long day, as well as being very expensive for those traveling the furthest. The board approved a proposal that will reimburse board members at a rate that's one half of the Federal mileage rate for board meetings that are essential for the ongoing operations of the club. Keep in mind, all board members travel plenty "on their own nickel" to and from events, and receive no other benefits or discounts for their service to the club. So the mileage reimbursement simply makes sense in these specific cases to continue executing core business functions.

Lastly, we also agreed to fund a new program, the brainchild of Tammy (our Membership Chair) to recognize and welcome new members to the club. This is partly in response to survey respondents who expressed difficulty getting connected with other club members at our events. More details will be forthcoming, but the idea is that we'll hold local area or cross-area events where some of the club's leader-ship will welcome new members and use the opportunity to explain the benefits of club membership. I also want to share my intention to visit one of your local area meetings or a local event in the coming year so I can meet active members in our local "chapters." I'll coordinate with your Area Director and will provide updates as I lock down the schedule. I'm always open to your comments and suggestions and thank you for your participation and support in the club.

Please take advantage of that Porsche and come meet us at one of these awesome events this year!



My Favorite Porsches

This is a new column debuting this month. It may not be in every issue of Tobacco Roads, but I hope it is a frequent feature. My vision is for us, the members of the Carolinas Region Porsche Club of America, to share some of what they appreciate about the cars we all love, part opinions, part fact, all that thing that makes us rubber neck at the sight of a certain vehicle passing. I hope to receive contributions from readers about Porsches (other cars will be accepted) they hold in their pantheon of hallowed cars for sheer beauty, guirkiness, performance, boldness or forward thinking.



Everything is in its right place with the Porsche 928. Only minor changes to the exterior of the car during the 18 years of production. Hopefully in the future my garage will include an early iteration of the 928.

One of my favorite Porsches is the 928. It has water cooling the motor. It has the motor in the front. It has eight cylinders. Most 928's are specified with automatic transmissions. The entire instrument binnacle tilts with the steering wheel. It has extensive use of aluminum throughout. It looks like a cousin to the AMC Pacer. It looks like a cousin to the AMC Pacer! These and many other things are probably what keep some of the general population from admiring this car.

The styling, despite the AMC reference, is one of the the reasons it is on my list of favorites. It would not have looked out of place if from Apollo 11 rolled a 928, head lamps up, ready to rove the moon's surface. That's how space age it looked when it first rolled on to the Geneva Car Show floor in 1977, sold as a 1978 model. And it still looks great today. Few cars' styling this bold or otherwise have stood against time with the grace of the 928.

AMC Pacer references are mainly due to the rounded shape of the rear end. A shape that lends kind of bulbous rear end, but also gives the car a very low coefficient of drag. That same sleekness extends to the, unique for the time, bumpers integrated into the shape of the body. Compare that to what BMW had to do to their masterfully styled 3 and 5 series bumpers that conveniently double as a work bench while detracting from the crispness of the shape and proportion. Porsche even managed to make exposed bug eye pop up lights look good....

While not the first front engined, water cooled car to wear the Porsche badge (the VW planned 924 came first) it has many advancements: aluminum 8 cylinder block without harder metal sleeves, passive rear wheel steering and aluminum



body panels. At one time it had the top speed of any production car available.

sion make it more of a grand tourer rather than a track day special. This is more than OK. It is an ultimately useable vehicle. The fact it is so

many things that the 911 is not might be what stands in the 928's way of wider acceptance. I would imagine if you asked the 914, the Cayman, or especially the Cayenne or Panamera that question, they would agree. But the point is, Porsche doesn't need to make another 911, they already make THE 911 and will continue to do so. Maybe that is the reason why the 928 is so good, because it was intended to replace the 911, but it was decided they were two very different cars and can coexist serving different purposes and tastes.

It's going to be an exciting season as we have a lot of changes coming this year to the Carolina PCA Autocross Series.

Autocross is for the Entire Family (Men, Women, and Young Adults). Minors with a valid N.C. Driver's License are welcome to participate, (Required Parental Waivers to be signed & Minor Drivers Waivers to be signed)

We have dropped Charlotte Knights from our Schedule and added Z-Max Race Way Parking lot, located Across from CMS.

This place is huge. 700' x 2400 ' (Nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ mile long) over 1,680,000 sq ft. of asphalt compared to CKS was 250,000 sq ft. By comparison about 650 % LARGER then Charlotte Knights.

This is the same Parking lot that SCCA uses. The courses are usually 2nd and 3rd gear and Over 60 seconds. The demand for this location is very high. So we expect registration to fill up quickly.

We are going to keep it around 100-110 Drivers. So it's going to be a busy day. Unfortunately, that means, we cannot do DAY OF Registration.

Many of you are probably wondering, if we just doubled the amount of drivers, how are we going to be able to finish at a decent time like we are all used to. I have talked to many other PCA Autocross Chairs around the Country and got some good ideas.

For Starters,

The Z-Max events, will be PRE-REGISTER ONLY. And Registration will close 10 Days prior to the event.

The Schedule for the Day of event has been changed a little as well. Please take note of the new times.

We are starting about 15 min earlier. The course will be setup earlier.

We are no longer going to stop for lunch. (don't freak out...yet).

We are getting newer equipment and Timing Software that should make everything run smoother and faster.

We will have 3 run groups (approx. 33-35 drivers per group)

Group 1 will drive first. Group 2 will Work Corner Stations. Group 3 will be "Free Time" (hang out, watch, socialize, eat, go to restroom...etc)

After Group 1 gets their first set of 3 runs, we rotate. Group 2 will now Get to Drive. Group 3 will Now Work Corner Stations. And Group1 will now get Free Time (hang out, socialize, watch, eat..whatever).

Once Group 2 gets their first set of 3 runs. We rotate again. And we do this full rotation Twice, so that everyone gets at least 6 laps. Everyone works the Corner stations Twice. And Everyone gets Free Time twice. Thus, no need to stop for lunch, as everyone will have plenty of time to eat during their "FREE TIME".

Logistically, for the ZMax events, we are asking you to bring your own a bagged lunch, so you can eat when you want to eat.

Since we are never stopping for lunch, that's the best way to do this. We WILL of course of plenty of Bottled Water for everyone.

If you want to get the Same Number you had last year, try and register as soon as you can.

Remember, the Z-Max events, are PRE-REGISTER ONLY. And Registration Closes on March 2

REGISTRATION:

For 2013 drivers will register in the car class they choose. It is up to the driver to make sure they are registering in the correct car class, according to the rules/classes provided. Any Questions, Help and guidance from the Autocross committee prior to your registration is encouraged. If you are not sure, please feel free to ask. We are here to help.

Autocross Event Rules:

We cannot run the event without the Participants help as volunteers.

So, All Drivers are required to volunteer between their run group Sessions. If drivers do not volunteer their help in between runs, OR leave early Before the event is over and the course breakdown is completed, then they will not get credit, or points or awards for their runs. The exception is if the Driver has equal times volunteering with equal Run sessions. Example (You ran 1 session, and then volunteered 1 Session, and then you had to leave). In this case you would get Credit for your 1st runs.

Drivers are expected to be honest and truthful with their class registration to the best of their ability. You are expected to read over the Class Rules, and familiarize yourself with them. Please ask anyone on the Autocross committee for further explanation if you are not sure on any of the classification rules.

PROTEST:

If any driver feels someone in their class should not be in there, or has modifications that would Disqualify them, that driver is allowed to make a formal protest. The Autocross committee will then review/ investigate the protest, thoroughly look over the car and compare the information with the PCA Rules set forth. If it's deemed the car was not classified correctly, or had illegal modifications, the driver will be disqualified and no points awarded.



NASCAR Day for the Porsche People!



Saturday, February 2nd dawned clear, but cold, in the Triad Area of the Carolinas Region. With temperatures starting off in the upper 20s to low 30s, about 55 of the Carolinas Region faithful gathered at 10 AM in Welcome, NC, for a highly informative, behind the scenes tour of the Richard Childress Racing (RCR) Race Shop.

Upon arrival, our Porsche folks took advantage of the warmth of the RCR Museum, managed by Steve Ramey, to get out of the cold, get organized, finish cups of hot coffee, sign the Porsche insurance waiver, and make a 'pit stop' before taking the short walk across the street to the RCR Race Shop for our tour. For those of you who have not toured the RCR Museum, I encourage you to do so. The 47,000 square foot Museum, originally the Race Shop for the #3 car of Dale Earnhardt, is open 9-5 Monday through Friday and 9-3 on Saturday.

Upon our arrival at the RCR Race Shop, we were met by our host, Mike Dillon, Vice President of Competition for RCR, the son-in-law of Richard Childress, and the father of Austin and Ty Dillon, outstanding young drivers in the NASCAR racing series. Austin drives predominantly in the Nationwide Series and Ty in the Truck Series. Both plan to have seats for several races in the Cup Series in 2013.



Mike began our tour of the Sprint Cup Shop and RCR auditorium with a welcome and brief overview of the history of Richard Childress Racing and the development of the RCR Campus in Welcome. Then, we were off for an in-depth look all phases at of the RCR Cup operation. Our tour started with a walk along the public catwalks that provide an overhead look at several of the Cup shops. At the

conclusion of the public walkways, we were escorted into the non-public areas of RCR. walked We through the RCR Auditoriums. which can seat up to 1,100 guests for a sit down dinner. show, or business meeting. We visited the enormous gym and cardio / weight facilities



gh the Auditok, which eeat up to b guests sit down rr, show, business ing. We d the nous gym cardio facilities



used by the Pit Crews and other team members for physical training in support of their work mounting four 80 pound Cup tires and filling the Cup cars with gas from cans loaded with approximately 16 gallons of fuel; all in 11 seconds or less. We passed through the photography studio, where cars, such as Ty Dillon's #3 Bass Pro Shops truck, are positioned for publicity photo shots. We headed downstairs and outside to an area on the rear tarmac, where the Pit Crews practice their craft over and over in a real world environment. Then it was back inside to see where chassis from the RCR Chassis Shop enter the Cup Shop to begin the process of becoming a Cup Cars. Every detail of Cup Car fabrication in this immense facility is managed in a highly technical and professional manner. Numerous NASCAR templates hang from the overhead for use by the crews in shaping and forming body panels to comply with NASCAR mandated contours. Ground clearances and spoiler positions are measured to the nearest millimeter. Each phase of the operation is managed by technicians who are expert in their portion of fabricating the Cup Cars that we see on the track every week throughout the season. Throughout the tour, we had the opportunity to be hands-on with all aspects of Cup Car fabrication; from chassis entry to the application of the many sponsor decals, after the cars are painted or covered with a thin laminate to give them their distinctive colors. We were also given the opportunity to ask as many questions as we wished. It was exciting to see the rounded shape of the new Gen-6 cars now under construction, to be introduced for the 2013 season at Daytona. The new cars will look much more like the street cars we see every day, rather than the 'cars of tomorrow' which NASCAR has run since 2007.

Near the end of the tour, we walked through a couple of the brightly decorated and impeccably clean haulers that are parked in the infield of the NASCAR tracks while the drivers are doing their thing. Our, group was then visited by the man himself, Richard Childress, who welcomed us to RCR and made a couple comments about the process of Cup Car fabrication.

Following our tour, a large cadre of our group headed over to Cook's Bar-B-Q in Lexington for some of that special North Carolina pork and some great Porsche camaraderie. We extend our special thanks to

Mike Dillon and all the folks at RCR who were so kind in providing the Porsche folks with a really special NASCAR Day!


