We have an exciting year ahead – plenty of fun in store. Stay tuned and I hope to see you at an event in the near future.




New Ideas for Tobacco Roads

Just a quick update. As of 2/20/13 we have had 300 members choose to receive the "electronic only" version of Tobacco Roads. What does this mean ?? It saves us \$ 9,000.00 per year that we can put in the bank to offset other club expenses (ie, Autocross, Christmas Party, etc). As mentioned in other publications TR is the biggest expense, averaging 3.00 per copy.

We're announcing an exciting new option to receive your copy of Tobacco Roads - we'll be offering **"electronic-only" delivery.** This is truly a special publication and is used to transmit valuable information content across the region. However, the new "greener" option is to send this publication out via an email link to the Adobe PDF copy posted on your region website. For those members who wish to continue receiving the hard copy via USPS, no action is necessary at this time. However, if you wish to opt-out of future paper delivery, simply reply to **membership@carolinas-pca.com** with your name and area, indicating your preference to opt-out.

Presently, the largest single expense for the Carolinas Region PCA is printing and mailing costs associated with Tobacco Roads. Each monthly copy costs the region about \$2.00 per recipient. By opting out, you're allowing the region to divert more membership funding to help support events and other special member activities. You're also guaranteed to get the timeliest copy of the newsletter in color!

To an outsider, it might seem like we're all about Porsches all the time. But as you look closer at the Carolinas Region and specific causes some of the Areas undertake, it becomes obvious that cars are just part of the story of our organization.

The efforts our members become involved with raise awareness of issues affecting us in our own backyard. The following information details the charitable work done by various Areas. For the Carolinas Region, charity truly begins at home

Hickory

In the Hickory Area, PCA members work throughout the year to raise funds for several charities in the area, according to Hickory Area co-directors Vincent and Vallie Piccireilli. The funds raised in 2013 were used to support the Corner Table in Newton NC, the Humane Society in Hickory, and the Hickory Soup Kitchen.

"What we do as a club is only a small fraction of the support our local area members contribute to help the poor and needy." In addition to contributions through PCA, Hickory Area members privately provide assistance through their church and civic organizations.

MOUNTAIN

PCA members in the Mountain Area know how to combine a beautiful locale with their fundraising efforts. At the annual In Den Bergen (IDB) event, participants not only enjoy the mountains of western North Carolina, but through their participation, they also contribute to organizations that have a special place among Mountain Area members. Sarge's Animal Rescue in Waynesville has received a hearty donation from the proceeds raised from the registration at In Den Bergen.

According to Mountain Director Lauren Lopez-Boylston, many members of the area are veterans who consistently look for ways to support those who have served. They participate in the Saluting Our Veterans car show, which is also held in conjunction with Toys for Tots. Bringing an unwrapped toy is also part of the registration. Animals...veterans...children. They are all truly worthwhile groups that are a little better off thanks to the efforts of Mountain Area members.

UPSTATE

Members of the Upstate Area selected the St. Vincent De Paul Society on which to

focus their fundraising efforts. According to Area Director John Budinich, "We chose them as they distribute all funds raised directly to those in need. They do not take anything out for "overhead" or "administration" fees. They use the funds raised to help those in the Upstate Area that need help in paying their power bills, food bills, rent or other items based on proven need," he explained.

Upstaters raise money through a 50/50 raffle at their monthly meetings and an auction held at the Area Christmas party. "The items we auction at the party are donated by members or local businesses. All money raised by the auction goes directly to the charity. We also had a number of generous members that contributed additional funds over the cost of the items they purchased, a couple gave significant amounts, Budinich added.

Upstate Area members also supported Toys for Tots at the local Cars & Coffee of the Upstate event held in November. According to Budinich, over 200 toys were collected. "I would estimate that 20% of those were donated by PCA members, he said. Additional funds they raised through Area activities directly assisted 66 families in the Upstate over the holidays

In addition to the work done for St. Vincent DePaul by the Area, individual members also donate their time to that and other charitable organizations such as American Red Cross, United Way and Special Olympics. This year, the Upstate Area will have a number of members participating with their vehicles in the Greenville St. Patrick's Day parade supporting local charities.

"I think Greg will be able to come up with new ideas, and we will work together on this," Collins added. It is his hope that with Greg's assistance the Area can step-up its charitable work this year. "Look for more from us in 2014," he added.

SWAP MEETS by John Meek Part 2 of multi-month series about swap meets

The positive response to the Porsche Swap Meet article in last month's January 2014 Tobacco Roads confirmed that most PCA members appreciate the opportunities swap meets provide for buying and selling new, new/old stock and gently used low mileage Porsche accessories, maintenance items, replacement parts, tools, wheels and tires. Most really enjoy the treasure hunting and negotiations presented at these events.

Additionally most swap meet attendees are favorably drawn to the various types of Porsche Memorabilia also presented by swap meet vendors. Many excellent questions were asked regarding posters, models, lapel/hat pins, literature, toys and other popular Porsche related items. This article on Porsche Factory Posters starts a series that will attempt to briefly cover some of the basic key issues to assist with our search, acquisition or sale of various types of the most popular memorabilia.

Enthusiasts have long enjoyed collecting Porsche posters for decorating the walls of their race car haulers, garages, dens and offices. As a 29 year old bachelor, owner of a seven year old 1971 911E and new member of Chesapeake Region PCA, I was enchanted by the shapes, sounds and performance of Porsche 935 turbo race cars winning International endurance races at Daytona & Sebring. After seeing several fantastic 1976 & 1977 factory racing posters featuring flames belching from the turbo pop off valves (I call them afterburners) on the Martini 935s, I had to find some for the walls in my home & office. A local dealer swap meet provided good access to factory Porsche posters.


A year later my young bride Mary introduced me to higher quality wall art for our living room and bedroom walls. We had met on a blind date at the 1977 Watkins Glen 6 Hours race. Even though she was a genuine Porsche enthusiast, my Martini 935 Porsche posters were relegated to my office as our small home had a carport not a garage. Over the years Mary helped me locate some also very rare Sebring, Watkins Glen and Monterey Historic race posters featuring Porsches. Interestingly during a recent trip to Charleston she pointed out several 1950s 356 & 550 Spyder and 1960s vintage 911 framed factory racing posters selling for high prices in a Queen St. art gallery.

Only four years after the first Porsche 356 was road certified in 1948, racing victories were already becoming a common experience including an excellent class win at the 1951 LeMans. Ferry Porsche recognized the extent racing operations experience had on production vehicles. Porsche commissioned graphic artist, Erich Strenger to design posters to promote these racing victories. The slogan "Win on Sunday - Sell on Monday" applied to Porsche racing success which helped capture the hearts of sportscar enthusiasts world-wide.

A great resource for understanding Porsche factory racing posters is "Porsche die Rennplakate" an excellent book featuring both German & English translations by Jurgen Lewandowski printed in Germany in 2008. This second edition book covers most factory racing posters from 1951 to the American Le Mans Series in 2008. Another great resource is www.vpracing.com which includes a posters archive for some but not all Porsche factory racing posters from 1951 through the 1998 LeMans overall victory plus a poster store for sales.

After finding other factory poster related websites, you will notice that few original factory posters were produced in the 50s, more in the 60s, 70s, 80s & 90s and many after 2000.

Production numbers, age and popularity create a wide variety of values placed on "original" Porsche factory posters. All 1950s and most 1960s and 1970s vintage

mint original factory posters are rare, hard or impossible to locate and expensive. The VPRacing poster store offers no 1950s, few very expensive 1960s and a few expensive 1970s. Vintage original posters are sold by many vendors at the LA Lit and Toy Show (www.lalitandtoyshow.com) on Saturday, March 1, 2014 that I mentioned in last month's swap meet article.

You can also find "original" factory racing posters on eBay with starting bids from \$10 to over \$700 depending on their production date, race, rarity and general availability. I entered "Porsche factory racing posters" into eBay search today and found 53 listings. Then entered "Porsche factory posters" and found 249 listings with many additional factory racing posters over those initial 53 listings plus some factory "showroom" street car posters. However, the buyers must really beware on eBay and other auction sites. Many Porsche factory racing posters listed on eBay are low cost smaller reproductions not originals.

Although early factory racing posters varied in size, most originals from the 1960s, 70s, 80s, 90s and after 2000 are large 30" x 40" dimensions including what is usually referred to as factory "showroom" posters featuring Porsches sold in the late 80s, 90s, and after 2000 up to current 2014 models. Additionally there are some good 1950s, 60s and 70s factory racing posters reprinted under license of Porsche AG published by P.A.R.C. Germany in smaller 19" x 27" size co-distributed in the USA by Auto Trend Graphics. Go to www.parc. de and click on P.A.R.C. Reprints Porsche in the Quick search box on the home page for a complete listing of those currently available for only 10.00 Euros each plus shipping. Some eBay sellers list these as "Rare" factory racing posters with starting bids from \$25 to \$35 plus shipping.

Ultimately you must decide what type and price range your poster acquisition

budget allows in order to focus your search efforts. For instance, you may want factory racing posters for the walls of your car hauler or garage and will accept original large 30" x 40" factory racing posters with slight defects like pin holes, corner tape or edge damage from prior wall mountings by previous owners that are available at much reduced prices versus mint originals. Be aware that most original factory posters present the race cars across the full width with backgrounds the full length of the poster which does not allow much if any space for trimming. You may want factory racing posters from the 1950s, 60s or 70s with originals that are very hard or impossible to locate and very expensive which may make the new 19" x 27" reprints very attractive due to availability and much lower costs.

I have four of these Porsche licensed reprints with one featuring a 1956 550 Spyder, one of a 910 at the Nurburgring, one a Gulf 908/3 Targa Florio winner and the winning Martini 935 from







the 1977 Watkins Glen race where I met Mary. Most of my garage posters are simple framed original 30" x 40" racing posters from the 1980s, 90s and 2000s. My office posters are professionally framed rare Martini & Brumos 935s and one very rare 30" x 40" Brumos dealer poster celebrating their 911 Carrera RSR overall victory at the 1973 Daytona 24 Hours.



<u> Two Old Friends Meet Again</u>

By now, many club members have made the trip to Raleigh to see the" Porsche by Design-Seducing Speed" exhibit at the North Carolina Museum of Art.

My husband Vince and I traveled to the exhibit before Christmas; both looking forward to seeing some great cars, but with little knowledge of the exhibit content.

It was a great surprise to see Steve Mc-Queen's 1958 black Speedster proudly on display. But it was a particularly surreal moment for Vince, who regularly serviced and drove the car as a Premier Porsche mechanic for Bob Smith Porsche in Hollywood California. A professional mechanic since 1970 and a serious Porsche enthusiast himself, Vince spent 19 years at Bob Smith.

Part of the "maintenance" he performed on the Speedster was to drive the car home to ensure that it was exercised on a regular basis. As we admired the car at the exhibit, he talked about the experience of being behind the wheel. Driving the car to and from work on the L.A. freeways was not a deterrent for Vince. "I really didn't focus on who owned the car, but was careful with it. Being small and low, it could be difficult to be seen by other drivers, but it sure was fun to drive," he said.

In addition to the Speedster, Vince also regularly serviced and drove McQueen's 911S. The actor stored both cars at the Smith dealership, and would drive them on occasion. But it was up to Vince to ensure that they were running well and ready to go at a moment's- notice. "They didn't require a tremendous amount of upkeep, however from time-to-time, McQueen would request work be done such as removing all the chrome for re-plating, and pulling the motor to repaint the sheet metal," Vince explained.

Vince hadn't seen the Speedster since the late 1980's. Both Porsches remained at the dealership for some time after McQueen's death. His reaction to seeing a former "client?" "It's kind of neat to think that this car is almost 3,000 miles away from where it

used to be. I'm looking at it and it looks identical to when I used to work on it," he said. "One of the things I remember about the Speedster was the rare option of true knock-off wheels. And the 911S was really quick for its era," he added.

Because the dealership was located in the heart of Hollywood, its clients included many in the film, music, and television industries. In addition to servicing the McQueen vehicles, Vince also worked on Porsches owned by Paul Newman, Robert Redford, Candice Bergen, Otis Chandler (publisher of the Los Angeles Times), Berry Gordy, and Cher, just to name a few.

However, McQueen's enthusiasm for the brand, along with his driving and racing skills, made his vehicles a favorite of Vince. "To see the Speedster again is really a thrill," he said. "If you were a real enthusiast back then, the Speedster and 911S were two of the best cars to work on and drive."

1954 Porsche Factory Sales Brochure

1954 was a pretty good year. A few of us actually remember it. With some help from Wikipedia...Ike was a popular president;color TV introduced by RCA; Marilyn married the Yankee Clipper; 1st Tonight Show aired; mass vaccinations for polio began; inflation was 0.3%; a gallon of gas was \$.22;the average new home cost \$10,000; the Dow closed at 382; Mercedes introduced the 300SL Gullwing and Porsche won 270 international competition events!

The 356 was in its first full year of steel body production after being introduced in the U.S. a year before as the Continental. 1954 was the first year for the Speedster. Two hundred were produced for the US only thanks to Max Hoffman. You may have noticed in January Pano a restored 1954 Speedster (not Carrera) was advertised for \$450,000. It was also the first year a 550 Spyder could be purchased in the US for street use. Factory Spyders took 3rd & 4th place overall and won the under 1500 class at the Carrera Panamericana race in Mexico in 1954; and they raced well at Monte Carlo and Le Mans. You can't touch a Spyder in decent condition for less than \$1 Million.

The pictures included are from a 1954 Factory Sales Brochure that Phil Notestine kept as a momento of his association with Porsche. In 1954 Phil had been working as a salesman at Continental Motors in Plainfield, New Jersey for two years. Continental sold new and used Triumph, Alpha, BMW and Porsche brands. TR3 and TR4 were the most popular cars; selling 4-6 per month, while Porsche attracted about one buyer per month. Phil ended up owning a 1956 1300 N Speedster with "engine issues" taken in on trade

from a Bell Lab scientist . Continental's mechanic repaired the valves on the car and Phil's total investment in the Speedster was \$800. Another Porsche customer Phil remembers was a Roman Catholic priest and headmaster at a prestigious girls school.

Continental Motors lost the Porsche brand because Max Hoffman in-

sisted that Porsche dealers give up selling competing brands. Phil took a job at NJ Bell, part of the AT&T, and stayed with Lucent Technologies when it was spun off from AT&T. It ended up being a great career of 31 years.

Today Phil is my friend and neighbor in Pinehurst. We met through another Pinehurst neighbor, Ted Mataxis. Ted is a PCA member and active in our Sandhills Area events. The three of us retired from U.S. Army. I learned of Phil's association with Porsche when Ted arranged a trip to the Porsche By Design exhibit at NCMA. This was a members only "Hoods Up" exhibit last December. Those of you who visited NCMA saw a 1955 356 Continental was on display.

On the drive to Raleigh, Phil and I exchanged Porsche stories about New Jersey. My first PCA region was Northern New Jersey and purchased my first new 911 in New Jersey. Phil told me about selling 356s and how he managed to save the 1954 factory sales brochure.

Of course, I had to see it and share it with all of you. The images here are just a small sample of the thirty-eight black and white glossy photos in the actual brochure. (More photos are on the TR web site). All the photos and spec sheets on the three models offered in 1954 are in excellent condition; as is the binder itself. However, the thin plastic sheets covering each page are showing their 60 years of age. As you would expect from Porsche, they even

made their sales materials efficient and durable! Really, an incredible piece of early Porsche history. I'm sure if Phil took it to the Los Angeles literature swap meet in March a collector would pay a nice price for it. Good excuse for a road trip?

Many thanks to Phil Notestine for saving the brochure and sharing it with us. Thanks to Ted Mataxis for bringing us together, and to Gary Krasicky for help with scanning the brochures' contents for TR.


