# From the Driver's Seat

I can't believe summer is upon us and Memorial Day has already passed. This is the time of year to really get out and enjoy the fine Carolina roads in your car. On a personal note, I've been having a renewed love affair with my car over the past few months. I have an '02 996 coupe. It's got a little track prep going with coil-overs and adjustable GT3 anti-roll bars. Recently, I wanted to "spice up" the sound a little. I purchased a set of Fabspeed mufflers from our member, Dennis Knight, through Facebook. And I had a good time wrenching the old cans off and installing the (almost) new ones. No DIY job is ever that easy for me and like most of us armchair hack mechanics, it took me about twice as long as it should have – and I had plenty of bloody knuckles to prove it because I always forget to put my mechanic's gloves on.

So – yep, got the new cans in – and then had to "upgrade" the muffler tips – which actually cost me nearly as much as I paid Dennis for the mufflers in the first place! I think the tips were almost as tough to install, too. So here I am – enjoying a little more "growl" in the sound of my car – perhaps a couple HP extra, who knows. I think any one of us who's ever done some upgrades like this knows that this is just the beginning of a slippery slope. So here I am, surfing the websites and I find a "brand new offering" of a carbon fiber dual cone (Y-pipe) cold air intake. I didn't know if it was actually gonna produce any power, but I knew it should sound pretty nice and it makes the engine bay of my 12 year old car look like a real jewel box. So here I go with another several hundred bucks spent, and another several hours spent taking twice as long as it should have to do my install. But hey – these days, there's so little wrenching one can do on these cars post mid-90's... Too much computer stuff to do any old school wrenching – so I'm stuck trying to add some of the aftermarket "farkles" (as they're often called in the motorcycle community).

Okay – what were the results of my spent Benjamins and hours of toiling in the garage? Well, I've shared some pictures – but there's no substitute for the pleasure I get opening up the throttle and sailing through 4k rpms, then 5.2k rpms

when the adjustable valves really open up – and into the 7k range before shifting. My tame little 996 sounds beastly – I think it actually scared my wife the first time I demonstrated the transformation! It's not obnoxious, unless of course you're running at high throttle levels – and when you have the pedal down, I think you should know it! So then comes the question of am I getting any power, too? Heck, that wasn't my first reason for doing any of this. But I do happen to have a buddy in the club in Greenville who likes to run autocross with me – and I don't think he was willing to take any chances. So John Kelly installed the same cold air kit and had a before and after dyno performed. On a stock 996, 3.6L, the dyno showed roughly 20HP increase for the cold air kit. Holy cow was that a surprise! It feels good, but I would never have thought we'd be able to generate that much more power just by letting the engine breathe! I figured we'd be into ECU stuff, intake plenums, and the like – but low and behold – the website claims seemed about dead on with what John confirmed.

Anyhow – I wanted to share my fun over the Winter break and explain why, if you see me driving just about anywhere these days, I'll probably have the pedal at least half-way down just to hear the sweet sound of a flat six engine at it's finest! In the meantime – I hope everyone's

looking forward to a future DE, autocross, or our Sommerfest in Asheville in August!

# You Did What???

A true story by Howard Wasserman

**“HowwwArrrrrrrr!! Are you out of your MIND?”** That’s what my wife, my first wife I might add, shouted at me. Or at least that’s what I think she said. It was hard to hear over the roar of the 911’s 3.2 liter boxer engine as I downshifted and floored the gas pedal. But as any car person knows, the situation dictates the reaction and so I think you will excuse my driving as the story unfolds. My wife did . . . but not until we reached our home in San Diego several hours later.

It was 1993 and members of the San Diego Region were invited to test-drive the new 993 and tour the parts distribution warehouse at Porsche Cars North America’s headquarters, which then was in Reno, NV. The drive up was very scenic, once you get off I-15, onto US 395 (two-lane road for hundreds of miles) and passed through the Mojave Desert. There were picturesque towns and natural wonders along this route on the eastern side of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Among those were Devil’s Postpile National Monument (see photo), the eastern entrance to Yosemite National Park (open in the summer), Mammoth Lakes ski resort and Mt. Whitney, the highest peak in the continental U. S.

But the most interesting and unique attraction was Mono Lake, a shrinking lake on the eastern side of 395 heading north, as you approach a stretch of great driving road (beware the RVs!) before crossing into Nevada. Set in the heart of the arid Great Basin in the Eastern Sierra of California, the incredible Mono Lake is home to a vast community of flora and fauna. The most startlingly feature of the lake are the mineral pillars seemingly growing out of the lake. Think of stalagmites without the surrounding cave. The scene is what you might imagine for a desolate but strangely beautiful, not totally arid planet in another solar system. Unless they subsisted on briny shrimp, algae or alkali flies, an expedition from another world, landing on Earth at Mono Lake, would scratch us off their list of worlds to visit—that’s inhospitable but hauntingly beautiful Mono Lake.

After two nights and one and a half days touring Reno (ugh! I am NOT a gambler, at least not in a casino or horse track) and the Harrah’s Automobile collection (before it was sold off), we headed back to San Diego, anxious to get home but facing a 550-mile, ten-hour drive, not counting stops. Frankly I do not remember what month it was but I do recall it was very HOT once we came out of the Sierras and down into the Mojave. The seven-year old cabriolet was triple-black and mid-80s Carreras were never noted for the efficacy of their air conditioning. So, we were in the desert, it was broiling hot out, the car was serving as a heat-sink, the A/C was not that good and then the traffic slowed to the speed limit, 60 mph I believe. We had 200 miles to go, we were on a straight road—one lane plus a wide shoulder in each direction—just begging for speed, nothing but sand and distant hills in every direction, behind a line of indeterminate length made up of RVs, weekenders and tourists. See if you can find anything but sand and rock in the photo of the “offending” stretch of road. Yes, that thin black line is US 395. Did I mention 395 was straight?

# Porsche and Wooden Boat Show 4.12.2014

As Porsche owners, we appreciate classic lines, timeless design and exceptional engineering. With this in mind, it was a natural fit for members of PCA to join members of the Blue Ridge Chapter of the Antique and Classic Boat Society for the 3rd annual combination Antique Wooden Boat & Porsche show. The show took place on April 12 at Hartwell Marina in Hartwell, Ga.

Lake Hartwell is a man-made lake, covering 56,000 acres with 962 miles of shoreline in South Carolina and Georgia. It is one of the biggest and most popular lakes in the southeast. The Antique Wooden Boat show has been one of the major events on the boat show circuit since 1993. This was the third year that members of the Carolinas and Peachstate Regions of PCA were invited to participate. The main event was held on Saturday, and started early as PCA members from across North and South

drive down from Galax, VA. While the PCA group was gathering, Hartwell marina became the home for 40+ antique and classic boats from Chris Craft, Gar Wood, Arista Craft and other manufacturers.

At 9:30 am, the Porsche group formed up for the drive to the marina. The show organizers arranged for a police escort down the main road in Hartwell, through the town square and into the marina. It's not often you get to see and hear 40+ Porsches roaring down a two lane road with a police escort. Many thanks go out to the Hartwell Police for their assistance in keeping the parade together. At 10:00 am, the show officially opened to the public. The Porsches were arranged in front of the marina building for the "land" portion of the "land and sea" display.



**Boats on Display**

Carolina gathered for breakfast in Anderson, South Carolina. We then drove along some interesting two-lane roads of western South Carolina and around the eastern edge of Lake Hartwell in Georgia. It was a great way to get the "Porsche" juices flowing for the big day ahead.

We met other members of the Carolinas and Peachstate Regions of PCA in the Belk shopping center parking lot, two miles from the marina. Members from as far away as Greensboro, Charlotte & Asheville North Carolina, Athens & Atlanta Georgia, and Columbia, Spartanburg and Greenville South Carolina made the drive to participate in the celebration. We even had one member

Over the course of the day, there were the Antique and Classic boats to view, Porsches of all years and models to check out, two vintage restored Airstream trailers on display and PCA members and boat owners to meet. Other activities included a youth cardboard model "Float-a-Boat" challenge, youth judging of antique boats, radio-controlled boats for kids of all ages to test their watercraft skills (provided by Southeast Modelers), food vendors to sample and boat rides on the lake. Due to some confusion, the marina operators were not able to provide the pontoon boats for PCA members as they did last year. That being said, PCA members were offered rides on a number of the antique & classic boats in the show. The boat's owners showed members

how well the boats performed and provided an opportunity to step back in time on boats from the teens through the 50's. There was even a boat cruising the lake that was built in 1903. When not on the water or on the docks answering questions, many of the boat owners were in the display area in front of the marina examining the Porsches and asking owners about their vehicles. While not quite as old as the boats in the show, Porsche was well represented with 42 examples of the marque ranging in years from the 1960's through 2014. Almost all models of Porsches were represented and we heard lots of positive comments from the boat owners and show attendees, whether they were talking about one of the 914s, 911s, 944s, Caymans, Boxsters, Panameras or Cayennes on display.



**Parade into Event**

Now let's talk about some of the "Stars of the Show". From the boat side, once again the "Miss America IX" was on display and plying the waters of Lake Hartwell. This mahogany Gar Wood boat was built in 1930 and was the first boat to break the 100 mph barrier - in 1931! The boat was built and driven by Gar (Garfield) Wood himself, over a measured mile course in two directions. Current owner Charles Mistele, who has owned the boat for 44 years, explained how the record was set using two experimental twelve-cylinder Packard engines making a total of 2200 hp. The boat now sports two GM motors making a total of 1100 hp, because the Packard engines were appropriated by the US Government and used as prototypes for the PT boats in World War II. Those motors were not returned after the war but the boat is still very fast to this day, capable of hitting triple-digit speeds. When Charles started it up and took it out on the lake, the sound could be heard and felt throughout the marina.

Another beautiful example of fine craftsmanship was the Holiday 25 on display. This boat displayed exceptional woodwork, including the compound curves present in the roofline of the all-wood cabin. It also had multiple inlays of various colored woods in the main cabin area and on the table in the aft section of the boat. I cannot imagine the number of man-hours it took to assemble this stunning craft.

From the Porsche side, every one of the vehicles in attendance was special. Charlie Grant led the group into the marina in his nicely restored red 911 Carrera. Charlie owns a restoration shop in the Hartwell area. Bill Suite, out of Galax, VA, made the trip again for the second year running in his 911 Turbo. Mark Feightner made the trip from Asheville in his recently finished 914. The GT3s, Turbos, Boxsters and Caymans on hand, drew many positive comments for their sleek lines that mirrored some of the lines of the boats on-hand. I would like to personally thank all of the Carolinas and Peachstate members for bringing their Porsches out to the show and answering all

the questions the attendees had about the cars.

All in all, the event was another great success from both the boat club and PCA perspective. The weather was perfect and Mother Nature even cooperated by providing enough rain in the months prior to the event to ensure lake levels were full and the boats could "strut their stuff". The Porsches and boats were a perfect combination and as I said in the opening of this article, both appealed to the same basic inter-

ests. Almost every PCA member in attendance said they would be returning for next year's event and they would be spreading the word to other members. The officers of the Blue Ridge Chapter of the Antique and Classic Boat Society feel the combination of their boats and our Porsches are a perfect mix. They have asked us to make this event a permanent addition to our calendar.

If you are in the area of Hartwell, Georgia next April, look for this multi-region event on the Carolinas Region, Peachstate Region and Zone 3 calendars. The combination of engineering excellence, graceful lines and timeless design applies equally well to the Antique and Classic boats and to our beloved Porsches. 

## Placing a classified ad: how does it work?

The Carolinas Region has a classified ads coordinator who handles all incoming ads. Once the coordinator receives your ad, it is formatted and checked that it includes all of the essential information. The most common reasons for rejection are forgetting to include location (city and state) of the car or parts, forgetting to include your PCA membership number (which doesn't get printed in the ad) and forgetting to include an asking price. Other formatting includes fixing obvious typos and trimming both ad copy if it's too long and resizing pictures to 800x600 pixels. Note that only a single picture is published, and only in the web version. Be aware, too, that you will not typically get

a confirmation email or postcard in return. Your notification will be seeing the ad in the next edition of Tobacco Roads and on the web.

Before the end of the month, the coordinator sends the formatted ads and pictures (zero or one per ad) to both the Tobacco Roads editor and webmaster for inclusion. Because Tobacco Roads is a monthly publication, and because there's some prep time required for that, there is a lag between when an ad is received and when it gets published. To avoid making a mess of ad tracking, the publication of web ads and the Tobacco Roads ads is synchronized so that they both appear at

close to the same time.

The process works well and efficiently, powered solely by the volunteer efforts of your fellow club members. If you try to pattern your ad after the example printed in each month's issue of Tobacco Roads, and if you include all of the required information and email or US mail the ad so that it arrives before the 15th of the month, you'll have the shortest possible duration between when you decide to sell your "baby" and when the ad appears in both Tobacco Roads and on <http://www.carolinas-pca.com>.

- 7) All pictures submitted should be in .JPG format and no larger than 800x600. One picture per submission.
- 8) Pictures will run on the website only.
- 9) All ads will be subject to editing for consistency and length.
- 10) Ads should include:
  - a. An accurate description of the item or items (including VIN preferably if applicable).
  - b. Price (Ads will not be accepted without pricing).
