Touring PCNA

The Invitation.

What do the Brandenburg Gate (Berlin); the Petronas Towers (Malaysia); the Arc de Triomphe (Paris); the Taj Mahal (India); the Pyramids of Giza (Egypt) and the Porsche Experience Center (Atlanta) all have in common? Each of these is a great addition to your "bucket list", if not already there! Early last August I received a Zone 5 broadcast e-mail from Andrew Douglas with an invitation to the first of a series of PCNA "Willkommen" events for PCA members. This event was being held at the new Porsche North America Headquarters (aka One Porsche Drive/Porsche Experience Center-OPD/PEC) in Atlanta on 21 September at a cost of fifty dollars per person.

The visit would include a full facility tour and lunch at Restaurant 356. If you had additional time, and at an additional cost, you could also sign up for demo laps at an additional cost. My wife, Angie, and I had been talking about visiting the new PCNA facility, but since it is not technically "open to the public" the decision to sign up was a no-brainer and we did so immediately. The decision was a good one, as the responses from PCA Zone 5 members significantly exceeded the number of members who could be accommodated for the first visit. Based when sign-ups were received, participants were selected on a first-come-first-served basis. The overflow was then shifted to a second Willkommen event tentatively scheduled for 16 November. It was an excellent event and we are happy to have been part of the Inaugural Willkommen!

According to the invitation, the inaugural event would be conducted around the following schedule: 9:30AM – 10:15 AM PCA Club Members arrive and check in at the PEC desk next to the Retail Store in the main lobby

10:15 AM – 10:30 AM Basic OPD Introduction

10:30 AM-11:15 AM Classic Workshop Tour and Presentation

11:15 AM- 12:00 Noon OPD Tour

12:30 PM - 1:00 PM Demo Laps (If pre booked)

12:30PM - 2:00 PM Lunch in 356 Restaurant

2:00 PM Depart and/or Retail Store

Note: although there were some minor changes, the program ran as initially outlined.

Getting There

How else, but in a Porsche: our "Classic" 20 year old Guards Red 993 C4S! Angie and I packed a couple of overnight bags and headed south on I-85. For those not familiar with OPD/PEC, it's located on the Northeast side of Atlanta's Hartsfield Airport, just off I-75. We decided to drive down the day before, partly to avoid Atlanta rush-hour traffic, but also to take advantage of some fine dining in downtown Atlanta. Chatting with Rick Ratchford (Upstate member, PCA Carolinas), who drove down the morning of the Willkommen event, we concluded that we had made the correct, and defiantly less stressful, decision by spending the night at the Spring Hill Suites near the airport.

Downtown Atlanta has so much to offer that I would defiantly recommend taking the opportunity to experience the city in conjunction with any OPD/PEC visit! It was also mentioned during the tour that construction will be starting soon on a European style hotel directly across the street from the OPD/PEC.



Willkommen

Our decision to stay "at the airport" had been determined by the location of One Porsche Drive. It was only ten minutes from our hotel it was easy to arrive early and get a great parking spot on the upper deck (in order to see and be seen). We had checked in at the main gate where we had received our Visitor passes so we headed into the impressive and very modern PCNA HQ/PEC building. As befitting a Porsche headquarters, we were greeted by friendly Security staff and directed to our sign in location near the retail store. We were a bit early and the staff was still in the process of setting up the Willkommen sign-in table. Hmmm?? What should we do with the extra time? Another no-brainer, we headed directly into the retail store as any good Porsche fan would do I was like a kid in a candy store, and even Angie found a few things to admire. We came home with a Porsche Motorsport shirt that I had been looking for and a reprint of the 1970 Le Mans 917 poster from their outstanding selection of Porsche poster reprints.

We finished shopping just as the staff was ready to begin the signin process. We traded our generic visitor badges for personalized





Willkommen badges complete with very nice Porsche After lanyards. choosing our lunch selection were welcomed by Ray Shaffer, the PCNA Classic & Delivery Center Manager and Paul Gregor, PCNA Manager, Porsche Clubs North America. In addition to providing

a facility overview, they mentioned that, because of the facilities' ultra-modern design, it had been used in the filming of some recent, Marvel based, films. This beautiful ultra modern building had been Captain America's headquarters in the film, and Ray pointed out several specific parts of the building to look for when viewing the film.

The Tour

The PEC tour conducted was as outlined in the schedule shown above. All of the key elements of the PEC were visited: The Business Center; Driving The Simulator Center (DSC); Porsche Exclusive Personal Design Studio: The Porsche Heritage



Center and Classic Gallery; The Classic Center Workshop; Restaurant 356 and The PEC Retail Store. A highlight of the tour was the Classic Center Workshop. Ray Shaffer presented an overview



of the workshop operation, introduced key members of the Workshop staff and explained criteria that the is considered for each vehicle that inducted for is work. After his remarks, the group was allowed to walk around the shop and talk with Workshop staff members who were eager to educate us about their specialty and the projects they were working on.

The tour then moved to the Porsche Heritage Center (via a great Worldwide Porsche Club badge and members car display) to view several noteworthy Porsche prototypes as well as a fantastic collection of Porsche race cars, all in beautiful red Coca Cola livery (after all, we were in Atlanta)! Another highlight of the tour included an overview of the Porsche Exclusive operation. Here we were treated to a viewing of the spectacular and very creative 3D sculpture hanging from the ceiling that, when viewed from below, showed the key structural elements of a Porsche 918. We then moved on to the outside observation deck where we watched all kinds of Porsches being put through their paces on the track, wet skid pad and kick plate. Our last stop before lunch was in the Drivers Briefing Room where Geoffrey Lowdermilk, Assistant Chief Instructor - PEC, went over the various elements of the PEC that we had just watched.

The tour ended with a fine lunch at Restaurant 356. Our choices had been a soup or salad to begin and either a Hamburger or Roast Chicken with polenta for our main course. All of the courses were delicious and elegantly prepared, topped off with an outstanding service presentation. if you go to the PEC, don't pass up the opportunity to dine at 356.

Conclusion

The Willkommen event and the OPD/PEC really impressed Angie; so much so that she is planning to return to the PEC for a driving experience that will help her master our old 993.

Keep your eyes on your PCA e-mail in the coming months as more OPD/PEC Willkommen events will be announced. Don't hesitate to sign up: these events fill up quickly. If you do accept the Willkommen invitation, you will not be disappointed

The Journey is the Reward:

My Porsche Summer..... Part 3

On Monday, August 15, I drove Ann to the Eagle/Vail airport, six miles away, by 6:45 am for her return flight to Charlotte via DFW. I bought gas at Costco (yes, the Vail Valley has a Costco, a Home Depot, Target, etc.) & returned to Scott's for my luggage as Ann was transporting hers plus thrift shop purchases & baby boy gifts.

At 7:45 am I departed Eagle, CO, on August 15 with 4,500 miles already added to the C4S on this trip. It was just 54F, so I wore a pullover windbreaker even with the top up. Another 2,700 miles of amazing America would be added by August 19. I headed east on I-70 to Walcott & CO 131 north to Steamboat Springs. Then, it was CO 40 west to CO 13 which became WY 789, a straight, smooth, lonely road just begging for triple digit speeds.

Between Baggs & Creston Junction, WY, on WY 789 all traffic was stopped by construction for 20+ minutes. By now, it was 74F, but a stuck zipper prevented the overhead removal of my windbreaker. I could not see the problem. What to do?

I asked the kind lady ahead for assistance, but she was unable to free the snag.

When I suggested trying the gent ahead of her with a toolbox, her husband pulled out his multi tool with pliers. Maybe three minutes later they succeeded. Hooray! They & their dog were headed home to Oregon. Behind me, a weather-beaten, wrinkled, solo Harley rider was returning north of Vancouver.

After 310 miles I filled up in Rock Springs, WY, off I-70 for the last time. WY 191 took me north to scenic Jackson, WY, by about 4:00 pm. The last 20 minutes were in a summer shower. The Shell station had an excellent self spray car wash with a soapy, foaming brush which I used carefully to remove 10 zillion bugs from the windshield, bumper & mirrors; this was the 7th car wash since July 24 departure. By rolling 438 miles, including a few in rain or at high speeds, the car gets dirty & eliminates thousands of insects.







Without Ann my lodging drops to two stars with lower prices. From the Antler's Inn I walked to the renown Wort Hotel, celebrating its 75th anniversary. The Silver Dollar Bar & Grill was just right for a cold draft beer, cup of chili, meatloaf & mashed potatoes. I walked the streets along old town for 60-90 minutes. The Town Square has four huge entry arches of elk antlers. Pretty unique & memorable!

Tuesday, August 16, was to be a top five all-time Porsche day, maybe my best ever! I departed Jackson at just 44 degrees F before breakfast on WY 191 north to Teton Park Rd through Moose Village & Jenny Lake, then drove to the top of Signal Mountain Rd where stunning 360 degree views are captivating. A young family arrived after I'd taken my photos; with their telephoto lens the father showed his boys & me a small group of pronghorn deer far below in the valley & invisible to the naked eye.



Back on Teton Park Rd I stopped at Signal Mountain Lodge. Operated by the National Park Service, the restaurant brought me an excellent breakfast of blackberry French toast, a scrambled egg, bacon & coffee. Admittedly, I had to ask the college kid waiter for every need, but he looked pretty sleepy. The Tetons are spectacular with their jagged peaks & snow covered cirques where the sun cannot reach.



My senior pass saved me another \$30 entering Yellowstone. I took many photos at pull offs in this vast park. I saw the steam rising from many fumaroles, hot springs & geysers, but did not stop to avoid the crowds. In the distance grey/black smoke was visible from the forest fire that had already claimed 35 square miles.

Just north of the park I sat outdoors for a burger lunch in rural

Cooke City, Montana, on scenic Beartooth Highway 212. What an amazing road! OMG! I'd compare it to Going-to-the-Sun Rd in Glacier NP, Trail Ridge Rd through Rocky Mountain NP near Estes Park or CO 550 Ouray to Silverton (where 27 snowplow drivers have perished). The temp had dropped by 24 from 82F in Yellowstone's low meadows to 58 degrees F at the Beartooth peaks.

Between WY & MT the Beartooth 212 meanders among lakes, mountains, canyons, ridges & valleys with numerous pull offs to ponder its magnificence & relax from driving switchbacks frequently absent of protective guardrails. Only sissies need guardrails, but they are comforting, especially when the drop shows only air.

I had no choice but to stop for 20-30 minutes while a herd of 70+ buffalo grazed along & in the road oblivious to human interference. At another point I drove slowly between two groups of 3-4 cows in open range

(where fences do not exist).

At one pull off I saw a pro photographer launch his drone with a Go Pro camera to film over switchbacks as motorcycles & cars climbed up & up. Pretty cool.

For every reader I strongly recommend the scenic Beartooth Highway 212 along the WY - MT border between Cooke City & Red Lodge, MT.

The Comfort Inn on 212 in Red Lodge, MT, provides a hose & wash cloths for motorcyclists

& drivers to clean their vehicles. This was the 8th & final washing for the C4S before beelining for home. I walked 7,024 steps to photo spots & along Broadway (MT 212) for supper at the Foster Tavern of a Stella draft & Mediterranean panini for which I waited forever. Fortunately, my barstool neighbor was a Porsche guy; he was towing his Harley with an older 4Runner from Denver to Seattle, but needed to depart Red Lodge by 3:00 am to reach Seattle the next day. Oops.

By 6:00 am I departed Red Lodge, MT, to Little Bighorn Battlefield where the Lakota Sioux, Northern Cheyenne native Americans ended the lives of Lt Col George Armstrong Cutter & his 250+ soldiers, European Americans, if you will. Yes, my senior pass saved me another \$30 here. The excellent video was followed by an outstanding ranger presentation clarifying the clash of cultures here of June 25-26, 1876. Here is the world's only battlefield where markers indicate the exact location where every soldier died. (I've already read Custer's Trials by Stiles; as recommended by the ranger, I bought Louise Barnett's Touched by Fire (1966). To think that this was just 140 years ago.

My next stop was Devils Tower, WY. Low on fuel & needing a bathroom after sprinting 205 miles, I pulled out of line at the



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entrance to use the facilities at the adjacent restaurant. The restaurant was closed by some undefined equipment failure. Oh well, I saw the

Tower for two quick photos, met a young family from Gardiner, NY, about 15 minutes from my 1971-76 residence in Pine Bush, NY, (small world, indeed!) & departed for the Badlands N. P. in South Dakota, which were 165 miles away.



I considered driving Main Street in Sturgis, SD, but decided not to delay my progress. I stopped in Rapid City off I-90 thinking about an early supper & overnight rest. However, I recovered when the visitor's center rep said that I could drive through the



Badlands N. P. & continue east.

There Badlands are incredible, other worldly. I took many photos at pull offs, as well as a family of three mountain goats through the Porsche windshield. This 34 mile drive through the park was conveniently west to east, so I returned to I-90.

By day's end I had covered 582 miles, including two national parks & one national monument. However, this was my most unfortunate & poorly planned stop, another sad example of a husband's stupidity in the absence of his wise counsel wife. It was in Tacoma, SD, that I finally stopped for fuel at about 10:15 pm. Night driving on I-90 had plastered the C4S with insects, Ugh. I'd skipped breakfast, then had a meager burger & cole slaw lunch just west from Devils Tower about 8 hours back. The gas station attendant guided me 4 miles to the only open restaurant, a Mc Donald's in Chamberlain over the Missouri River.

The Best Western there had "No Vacancy" posted prominently. A family of eight Latinos entered the Mc Donald's just ahead of me. Each child needed what seemed like 40-5 minutes to place his or

her order. By 11:00 pm I had had my fish sandwich, onion rings & milkshake. I returned west to the seedy Days Inn in Oacoma where \$124 was required for my single room. "Left over rate from Sturgis last week," said the desk clerk. I almost got back in the car.

August 18 was purely a stretch for home. From Tacoma, SD, to Indianapolis, IN, the C4S rolled 882 miles. At my Dairy Queen lunch in Iowa I called ahead to reserve a Comfort Inn in Indianapolis, IN. As a reward for hammering I-90 so relentlessly, I enjoyed an excellent supper at Landmark Cafe, Galesburg, IL. Unfortunately, what looked to be on my route on my iPhone required 24 miles on a two lane road to I-65 south. My head hit the pillow by 11:00 pm again. Oops.

On Friday, August 129, I was on the road by 6:00 am. My loyal C4S advanced smoothly through IN, OH, WV, VA & into NC. Excellent meals & service is available in Charleston, WV, off I-77 at exit 95. As we might have expected my only traffic snag in 7,240 miles was on I-77 at exit 30 in Davidson, NC. All traffic crawled for 50 minutes while an accident was cleared. I was home for supper ... after washing my faithful C4S, which will be serviced August 30 at

Hendrick Porsche at their new location, 6800 E. Independence Blvd, Charlotte. (Recall, the previous service was July 27 at Porsche of Colorado Springs, a quick 5,000 miles back.)

The faithful Porsche delivered 25.6 mpg over 7,240 miles, attaining 10,000'+ elevations & triple digit speeds numerous times, yet never needed oil added, never lost tire pressure, never failed in any manner. Like every other, it has been engineered & built to the highest standards with the highest quality components.

In WY it lost the LR wheel's painted center cap, two of which were lost traveling to Vermont for Parade. The center caps are attached only by glue for the 996 series; this seems very un-Porsche like to me. The new center cap, plus a spare, have been ordered for Tuesday's service.

Full speed ahead ...

Now, I'm prepared for Treffen with Fast Lane Travel September 14-24 from Stuttgart, including Germany, Austria, Porsche family compound in Gmund, Porsche & Mercedes museums, Porsche factory tour, Oktoberfest, etc. with Carolinas Region Bob Stuckey as my PCA roommate.

Summer 2017: Parade in Spokane, then PCH 1 from Seattle to Yosemite to Monterey for Werks Reunion 3, then on through Big

Sur to San Diego. Who has interest?
