

Your Porsche!

Swamp Thing goes to the Swamp for Science by Robert Rainer



There were two events in my life where I decided I wanted a Porsche. The later event was when I got my early 911, and I was impressed by the quality of the components. However, several decades prior to that, I saw my first 928. I had just graduated High School when I saw the car, there was nothing comparable at the time. The styling and shape was just so unique. Shortly after sighting that rare beast in wild late in '79, I also saw a 944 and I thought that was also one of the cooler cars out there. Prior to that, I really had not heard much or knew much about porsches.

Fast forward a couple of decades, and I have pretty much completed my 911 project, and I was looking for my next car. On a whim, I go to Ebay and I see this car that is local that was an abandoned deal and relisted. The car was an 1988 guards red 928 S4. That meant nothing to me, I knew nothing about these cars, but I offered the seller \$1,500. The car was listed as rough at right at that boarder-line between a parts car and a project. Needless to say, the raw roughness of this car did not disappoint.

Well I pretty much bought the car sight unseen. It ran, but very

rough, it was also clear the car was parked because of a bum transmission. So I was faced with a dilemma, here was a project car, and I knew my wife would not approve. While I am happy to spend 7 years restoring a car, she is not that patient with my hobby, so



I brought the car over to a friend's house where I could work on the rough stuff and get the car running and drivable. Upon close inspection, it became obvious, the car spent some time outside, and further investigation in the history of the car showed it was a Georgia car starting out in the ATL and then moving into the country. The layers of dirt were impressive, and my friend christened the car as "Swamp Thing."

So Swamp thing needed new rubber in the engine bay, and a front-end engine rebuild. You know timing belt and water pump. That is a must on these cars. I also did the ignition system and the fuel system, because I learned that they have a rear engine fuel line that likes to crack and cause engine fires. All of that was not

too bad, I just paced myself, and after a few months, I got the car drivable. The transmission was hurting, but if I babied it, the car would get me where I wanted to go. Still I was not committed to the 928 it was fragile, and not at its full potential.

Next was the interior. As luck would have it Mark Benton

opened up 9Source in my home-town of Spartanburg, and he was trying to broker a used 928 business. It was awesome to be able to source parts. I did a good it of interior work on the car. I went as far as taking the linen carpet out of the car and removing



the factory backing to place the carpets in the washing machine. WOW when they came out, they were like new. Talking with Benny who worked with mark, I found a rubber backing material that was perfect, and hand sewed the backing material. I also picked up a set of seats that were not sun baked like mine, and redyed them with the lethertique products. This was all a first for me, but I learned a good bit.

Finally I was ready to do the transmission. It turns out that

Porsche worked with Mercedes on the 928, and they used a bunch of Merc parts. The transmission is just a 722.3 transmission repackaged. So did I mentioned I hate automatics. While I so much prefer manuals, 80% of the 928s are automagics. If I knew more in the beginning, I




would have searched for a manual 5 speed, but at least I did find a model without rub stripes, that was a good thing. So I dropped the transmission and sent it away to be rebuilt. While that was out, I rebuilt the torque tube and installed a clamp to hold the flex plate in place. That is another feature of these cars, the drive shaft will push the flex plate forward and cause the thrust bearing to move forward and allow the crank to eat into the Aluminum block. Again not a big deal if you do the maintenance.

So the car is finally in decent mechanical shape. I decide to take



care of faded burnt paint. Don't be a hater, but I took it to Maco. I have to say several years later, I am still quite happy with that decision. They did a great job. I did all the prep work, and taping. I learned how to do this when I painted my 911. About this time, I took






a position in Orlando Fl, and drove the car there to use a daily driver. Needless to say, the 928 did well, but the job only lasted a year and ½. Luck me ran into a Deloitte flame-thrower during a reorganization. With my family still in Spartanburg me and the 928 returned home.

The next big project was for me to tackle the electronic gremlins.

The 928 is a complex beast: First generation computers, and old school vacuums. As it turns out, the electronic modules solder connections oxidize and they need to be reflowed. Not a hard job, but buying a temperature controlled soldering iron really helped. I also had



to undo the improvements the previous owner made to the wiring harness. Also the central electric panel is lest say impressive. It has harnesses A-W with 10 wires going somewhere per harness.



Lots of big projects here, but my favorite was when I got the Central warning unit back to life. My dash lights lit up like a Christmas tree. I got them all fixed ②.

Next it was onto the underside of the engine and the front suspension.

Steering rack rebuild with an RnR of the hydraulic hoses, a silicon oil pan gasket, and new motor mounts as well as upper A-arms and lower ball joints. All this because my springs failed, and the car was hitting things. This was one of my favorite set

of work that I di don the car. I learned a great deal, and the result was very satisfying. Now for the bad news, my transmission was going bad again @.

So lots of slippage, but when it warmed up, the car was very drivable, so

I did go on some tours with the 928. My favorite one was last year when our area went to the outerbanks of NC. The car actually did very well, and I thoroughly enjoyed the trip on land and over water on the ferry. The 928 is a grand tourer. It really shines on long trips and I have discovered the harder I push it, the better it does. These cars have deep reserves in the performance department.

So I have the great fortune of being able to go into semi retirement at the age of 55, and to celebrate, I
