

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

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Germany from the Passenger Seat By Linda Price

My husband Jeff & I took the Fastlane Travel Spring Treffen the first week in May. Our tour took us through beautiful Southern Germany and the Austrian Alps. The trip started with a flight from Atlanta to Stuttgart, Germany. Because it was close enough to our 25th Wedding Anniversary he used his air miles to get us First Class tickets. I was very grateful for those fully reclining seats during the 9 hour flight! We arrived at Stuttgart airport and were met by a very nice english speaking German gentleman who transferred us to the Steigenberger Graf Zeppelin Hotel, helped us check in and get our bags to the room.

Stuttgart is the capital of southwest Germany, Baden-Wurttemberg state. It is known as a manufacturing hub. Both Mercedes-Benz and Porsche have headquarters and museums there. We had purposely arrived a day before our tour was due to start to have a free day to settle in, relax and see a little of Stuttgart. There are a number of large green spaces (parks) that are popular with the locals. We were a bit bleary eyed upon arrival but it was cool and sunny so we walked down to Schlossgarten Park just a few blocks away. There were lots of places to sit or stretch out on the lawn, and several tables dedicated to Chess were very popular.

The more than 400 years old remains of the New Lusthaus in the middle castle garden. The Lusthaus was built between 1575 and 1593 by court architect Georg Beer on behalf of Duke Ludwig of Württemberg. It was considered one of the most magnificent works of the German High Renaissance. The pleasure house was a

place of court games and amusements and became famous for its facilities and equipment. It had a fountain hall with water features and upstairs one of the largest ballrooms in Europe, spanned by a cantilevered, painted barrel vault. After a fire in 1902, the former splendor could no longer be guessed. All that remained was the western arcade with two flights of stairs. From the original location of the Lusthaus on Schlossplatz, his remains were transferred to the palace garden. The ruin fell into decay, was overgrown with weeds and prevented from collapsing by steel and wooden scaffolding.

On Day 2 the rest of the tour group arrived while we had the morning free to sleep off some jet lag. Just before lunch there was a Driver's Meeting to review road rules, signage and details regarding where we'd be going. Then we were all whisked off to the Mercedes-Benz museum.

It is a large and impressive museum. You start at the top of the building and the early history of Mercedes-Benz and walk down the gentle sloping spiral (like a big parking garage), through history to present day.



It's a great museum that not only covers Mercedes-Benz history but puts it all in a world timeline to make it relatable to cultural and historical events.

Day 3 we toured both the Porsche manufacturing facility and the Porsche museum. That was a *lot* of walking! Porsche has very strict rules about no photography in the factory. So strict that they don't take any chances. They take your phones and cameras away from you before allowing you in! It was pretty cool though to see some of the cars in various stages. We were not able to tour the engine or paint areas but among other things we saw how they hand stitched and stretched the leather interiors and installed windscreens. And they have automated carts that follow magnetic strips on the floor delivering needed parts to each assembly station based on each cars specifications and options - true just in time manufacturing.

There was a Fast Lane tour group before us that overlapped our tour by a day. They completed their driving portion the day after we arrived for our tour, and joined us for the Porsche Factory and Museum. We lunched at the Porsche Museum restaurant "Christophorus". Later that evening the days walking and some lingering jetlag got the best of me, so I begged out of what I understand was a very entertaining evening at Fruhlingsfest...Spring Oktoberfest! Jeff tells me the group had seating in a private, reserved section. There were tons of people, music, food, beer, people dancing on tables and singing!

Day 4 - We got our cars! Peter Sontag, founder & CEO of Fast Lane Travel was our personal tour guide. He drove the lead car (Panamera Hybrid) followed by three 2018 Porsche 911 Carrera 4S's and a GTS Cabriolet.



They were all pretty sweet rides, let me tell you. Jeff did 90% of the driving. His daily driver is a 2015 Cayman and is used to driving a sporty car that handles like it's on rails. I on the other hand am very happy to sit in the passenger seat, watch the scenery go by, call out speed limits, handle the walkie-talkie and take photos. On this morning we left at 9am sharp to drive the (partly) no speed limit Autobahn south through the Bavarian countryside!

Jeff managed to reach 258 kph (160 mph) on the Autobahn, but I was too busy holding on and watching the traffic zip by to get a photo.




Alps, southern Germany

Bavaria's Neuschwanstein Castle


Both Cinderella's Castle at Disney World and Sleeping Beauty's Castle in Disneyland are modeled after this beautiful castle.

There were so many quaint shops and restaurants and coffee houses.

Along the Lech River there is a Franciscan Monastery that dates back to the 1600's.




Magic Castle Event Center

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Driver's Education:

Getting ready for the Track

I must admit, I have been remiss in keeping up with my automotive related maintenance activities and it finally caught up with me. First off was my Trailex open car hauler trailer. I really like the trailer - super lightweight and usually when towing I don't even know it's back there. So it was real odd last season when I started having a severe vibration issue that developed while driving home from our fall DE at CMP. It was driveable but annoying and despite stopping several times to check out the trailer, brakes, bearings, etc. I couldn't figure out the source. Ultimately, I discovered one of my tires had broken an internal ply belt and was out of round causing the trailer to bounce down the road as it rolled over the lump in that tire. The tires were over 5 years old but looked in good shape and had plenty of tread left. Most experts recommend replacing trailer tires after 4-5 years of service since the rubber degrades creating a higher potential for blowouts. So I ordered up 5 new Carlisle Radial Trail HD tires and had them mounted and installed. These are a new generation of tires and with a D rated Load Range and a higher 81 MPH speed rating suitable for my highway towing requirements. At that point I figured all was well with the trailer. Fate had different plans. Apparently all that vibration, unbeknownst to me, had slowly been disintegrating my bearings. While recently moving the empty trailer from storage to my house, I noticed one of the hubs had gotten a bit warm. I had brought it home so I could take my race car to a local shop about 10 miles away and thought "I need to check that wheel hub closer when I get home". Well, you guessed it. The bearing exploded before I got to the shop. Foolish me...being on a mission to get it to the shop just pushed forward thinking "I'm going slow - I'm on these back roads - it will be OK". Well, I arrived at the shop with smoke pouring out from that brake and hub. Giving things a chance to cool off, I unloaded the car and then set about removing the tire, brake drum and the few remaining bearing bits so I could limp the empty trailer home on the remaining three hopefully good hubs. I decided it was probably a good time to go ahead and do a full overhaul on the trailer, so ordered up all new brake assemblies, all new bearing kits, and a new drum assembly for the wallered out one. Amazingly after a little light polishing the spindle was still good, so I was saved from the aggravation of dealing with



replacing that component. As my punishment for not taking care of this issue in a timely manner my body was subjected to 2 days of sunny mid-July scorching hot blast furnace heated concrete as I re-

placed all those components while laying on my back and rolling around, under and beside the trailer. After a quick test drive, it looks like I got everything back together and working properly.

My next adventure was getting the Boxster back in track ready

shape. Normally I take care of my planned maintenance issues in the spring before it gets too hot and stuffy in the garage but I had put it off this year because of some other activities. Now it was time to get it done. I had developed an oil leak from somewhere on the upper front passenger side of the engine, but was having no luck in determining the actual source. What had started as an occasional drip left on the garage floor that I could tolerate, had now developed into a more noticeable leak that had to be corrected. I also needed to replace the starter as it was making that undeniable squeal when starting up indicative of the gear not retracting properly. And finally it was time to replace the AOS yet again since I was starting to get that occasional tell-tale white cloud of smoke from the exhaust at start up. I guess at 107,000 miles and the abuse I give the car that's not too bad for repairs. Parts were ordered and received along with new oil and air filters. A good engine degreasing started things off to make the job less messy and hopefully help locate that oil leak. Overall, replacing the starter and AOS isn't all that difficult. Plenty of good tutorials and YouTube videos can get you through the process all done with basic hand tools. For me the most difficult part was the odd positions I needed to contort myself into to work on the Boxster's mid-engine design. I'm not sure what people passing by may have thought as they saw this sweaty guy in a strange position on the back end of a car with his feet off the ground and his head and arms buried somewhere deep inside. It's what I call the maintenance position. Of course I picked two of the hottest afternoons of the summer to do this work. People who know me know that I sweat very easily - just reaching down to pick up a tool on a hot day brings out perspiration. These were four t-shirts afternoons. I'd get one soaking wet then swap to a dry one. Do a little more work and repeat. Again, this was my penance for putting off the work until the summer rather than the cooler days of spring. One nice benefit of all that perspiration water loss was seeing the bathroom scale hit a much lower number than normal. Nothing that a few rehydrating adult beverages didn't fix! Oh, and that oil leak. With a cleaned up engine I was able to trace it to an oil pressure sensor sender. Replacement part quickly ordered and installed all for under \$20. One of the cheapest fixes I've ever done!

So now I feel good that my car and trailer are both properly serviced and ready for the fall DE season. How about you and your car?? Are they ready to go? Need to get started on a few projects? Our next DE is just around the corner. Time to get busy.




