





## PCA Club Racing at Monticello Motor Club, Monticello, N.Y.

The Porsche Club of America (PCA) recently introduced a new Club Racing class for Vintage Porsches. This class includes all air cooled Porsche's from 1983 and older. This is the third year for this growing class. Due in part to early air cooled cars not being competitive when racing against newer modern cars, e.g. Caymans and Boxters, PCA felt the need to create this class.

Each year new track venues have been added as Club Racing popularity has grown. One of the newest and most popular venues is Monticello Motor Club in Monticello, New York. It is located about 2 hours north of N.Y.C. MMC is a challenging 22 turn, 4.1 mile long track that includes hairpins, increasing and decreasing radius turns and fast straight sections.

My first thought when I arrived was, wow this is definitely a luxurious destination! Everything was new and impeccable, and looked like a country club, and that's exactly what it is! PCA is the only club that has been given the opportunity to host a club race at this track. Typically MMC is open to its members, who often fly in via private plane or helicopter, to drive their exotic cars housed in one of MMC's multiple garages.

One really cool event occurred during lunch when eight MMC members came out and drove parade laps in their Carrera GTs! Yes, I said eight! I've seen two in person, but not eight.... together. MMC also features a Collector Car Gallery housing MMC members significant classic and sports cars. This first class show car facility is 13,000 square feet and overlooks the road course.

MMC was my second club race event. Of course, being very nervous after traveling hundreds of miles, still a rookie, and driving a new track! Initially, I thought I would never be able to drive his track comfortably because there were a lot of different types of turns that I had not encountered before, and my car had a lot of oversteer. After my second session I started to settle down and things were beginning to come together but; I still had a lot of oversteer. After making a sway bar adjustment the track seemed to flow better and the car felt great in the corners!

Typically during a club race weekend, Day 1 would be a practice day with practice starts, Day 2 would be practice and 30 minute sprint races, and Day 3 would consist of a warm-up session and a another sprint race. In spite of my trepidation I was able to improve my times every session. My first lap time was 3:02.994, and my last lap time was 2:53.608. The highlight of my sprint races the entire weekend was that I was always slower than two of my competitors. But, during my final race I was able to catch and pass both drivers simultaneously. This move allowed me to finish forth in class. Wow, what a sense of accomplishment! As a result of me

having a flawless event with no incidents, I am now allowed to remove the X from my rear bumper indicating that I am no longer a rookie club racer!

For those that have an early air-cooled Porsche and have been contemplating racing, do it! It is so much fun and every minute is exciting. Over my many years of track events, I've done drivers education and instructed for years but, not until I started racing did I find out how it all came together. My biggest regret is that I didn't start sooner! Go For It!




