

Look forward to seeing you around the Region.....your comments; suggestions for improvements to the region are always welcome.



Driver Education:

Despite the challenges of some rain during the final on-track session, I am pleased to report that all our candidates successfully completed the training and are entering our Instructor pool. Congratulations!!

Thankfully, after a quick rainstorm late Friday, the rest of the weekend's weather was pretty typical for March. Cool in the mornings but pleasant in the afternoon, with a bit of wind and some mixed sun and clouds. For anyone who remembers our March event several years ago when snow covered the ground, this was almost perfect weather. There were conflicting weather reports based on the old sailors saying "Red sky at night - sailors delight. Red sky in the morning - sailor take warning". Anyone who was taking note would have seen beautiful red sky sunsets AND sunrises. Apparently the evening sunsets took precedence as rain stayed away all weekend.

I would be remiss if I didn't thank HBi Auto for their continued sponsorship of our DE's at CMP. They were the exclusive sponsor for the March event and have already signed on to sponsor our fall event. Everyone got to see their team's resourcefulness and efficiency on Saturday as they quickly sourced and replaced a broken windshield on a participant's car. This event was held in memory of Jim Strowd who passed away last fall after a battle with cancer. Jim was instrumental in the early years of the Carolinas Region PCA driver's education programs as an instructor who taught many of our more senior current instructors. Jim was also an accomplished driver within the PCA Club Racing program and a very competitive karter. During the Saturday lunch hour we conducted missing man formation laps in his honor. These were led by his two sons Jay and Zack then followed by club racers in double file formation and then a long line of DE participants. It was truly a sight to see. The memorial continued in the evening as a large group met following the social to listen as Jim's fellow club racers and friends recant tales of the many ways Jim touched various lives in positive ways. Our thanks to Jim's long time track and race buddy Walter Dennis for spearheading the memorial activities.

Sunday started without any complications - no freezing temperatures, no rain, no snow, no fog. Seems like the past few events we've had some sort of weather issue holding up the start of our driving so this was a pleasant surprise which allowed us to stay on schedule and make sure all drivers got their full allotted time on track. Things were running smoothly. Our green student group, which was the largest run group of the weekend, was making great progress. After starting off slow with a long train of cars looking to be doing parade lap in their first session, they were now spread out around the track, hitting those apexes and building up speed. By the time the quiet hour came around on Sunday we had a group of cars lined up and ready to

take on our charity parade laps. For a small \$10 donation per car we use lead and follow drivers to take groups of cars for several parade speed laps around the track. This is open to anyone after signing appropriate waivers and gives participants and their friends and families the opportunity to see and drive the track. We collected \$200 for our charity - St. Vincent de Paul Society. This have been a great fund raising activity for the DE program. Last year we were able to raise \$1150 to help those in need thanks to your participation. Let's see if we can't beat that number in 2019.

Jerry Widner stepped up and performed classroom instructor duties for the first time this weekend. Classroom sessions are open to all and I wish I had made time to sit in on one as feedback has been very positive. And finally, a special thanks to all our instructors. As noted we had a very large green student group for this event. That's always a good thing since it means we're introducing plenty of new people to our sport. But it puts a burden on our instructor pool as several of them had to perform double duty with both green and blue students. 

Upcoming events:




