

Will's 993- A Rennthusiast Vision



A typical story I have heard, repeatedly, is that many of us are bitten by "the bug" at an early age. Often it is the "it was a hot car during my high school years" story that many of us reading these pages today will relate to so well. That plays out to be true here with Will's 993. I find his story to be refreshing and that many of us will shake our heads North-South in agreement and "I've been there too" as we are reading; Please enjoy Will's story:

Background: I bought this car from the third owner, who was out of Omaha, Nebraska. I found the car on Rennlist classifieds and reached out to get comfortable with the seller. The seller reportedly bought this 993 from another Porsche enthusiast and was selling it and his 997 GTS to fund his acquisition of a GT3 RS. I share that only because I have found that you are not only buying the car, but the seller as well. I have learned that the story behind "why the car is available" needs to make sense.

Upon contact, I learned that the seller had some – but not a lot – of maintenance documentation on the car from previous owners. During my seller's ownership, he did a fair amount of maintenance on the car as well as some light performance mods and did have paperwork to substantiate that. I did have an independent PPI conducted which revealed several minor issues. We were able to negotiate the sales price around these needs and I subsequently bought the car, had it shipped to NC and it immediately began to blow my mind.

My story of the 993: I have been an avid car enthusiast and collector for much of my life and at the time I found the 993, I had built a small collection of BMW's (a couple of e30's, 3 generations of M3's, a 2002 and an X5M). I had basically scratched my BMW itch and had always dreamed of owning an air-cooled Porsche at some point, so I began to investigate them. Growing up, my parents had owned a couple of Boxsters ('98 and an '02) so I had some experience with Porsche and had an understanding of the brand (on some level).

I knew that if I were to eventually buy one, that it had to be a coupe. Meanwhile, I had started to obsessively watch You-Tube videos and read articles about the 911, specifically the air-cooled generations. I really liked the aura, history and alluring culture surrounding the vintage 911's. Through my research I learned that they are some pretty bulletproof machines once sorted. I, like many others, had always incorrectly perceived them as being finicky to own. I finally decided to pull the trigger and begin to look in earnest.

I started my search with a mid-\$30,000's SC in mind, but the more I learned about the market the more I learned that in order to get the quality of example I would want, I would have to bump up my budget. Well, as I began to increase my



budget, I found I was in 3.2 territory and was now climbing into the high \$40,000's - low \$50,000's range.

One night, as I was scouring Rennlist (once again - IoI) I tripped over this 993. It was a high \$40's car, driver quality (which I wanted) with sub-100,000 miles (96,000 on the clock at the time, I think).

The 993 was the hot 911 when I was in high school so of course it had always been a bucket list car for me to own and when I saw this ad it dawned on me that based on my budget, it was right in my strike zone...

so I pounced!

When the car arrived, it was "mostly" as promised. There was a little more maintenance to be done; more than I would have liked, so the acquisition of the car cost me a little more than I thought. I have found that's always the case with vintage cars.

Here's the thing: Once I got over the disbelief that I was a 993 owner (I was SOOO stoked); I was completely smitten by air cooled. The driving experience is so visceral and really hits all the senses. Almost immediately I began to sell my BMW's (I no longer own even one). I just felt that they didn't really compare with the overall excitement that the 993 gave me. Yes, they were cool, fast, "fairly" well built, etc. but for me, they just lacked the soul that the 993 had.

Over the next year and a half, I drove the car constantly and had to have work done on it from time-to-time. I had the ignition coils replaced, a few sensors replaced and had an engine out reseal done. The steering rack failed as well and required maintenance. On the elective side, I also had Bilstein PSS10 coil overs put on the car as well as MY02 wheels and a 3 spoke steering wheel.

I also took the car on a couple of solo road trips into the mountains and had a blast just experiencing the car by myself. I have documented much of my time with the 993 on my YouTube channel. As a result of someone seeing my videos, I received an invitation to an air-cooled road Rallye in Western NC, and this experience caused me to be even more in love with air-cooled Porsches. So, running through the back roads and twisties with other air-cooled cars is frankly among my top 3 passions in life at this point. I loved my 993 so much that I also picked up an '86 Carrera Coupe in Guards Red to join the 993 in the garage.

A couple of months ago, however, I found myself wanting a change. I initially wanted to pick up a 993 in a funkier color but also knew that if I was even able to find one (they're so difficult to find right now) I would still have to spend thousands to get it sorted regardless of "how well it was maintained." Just the nature of the beast. Since my example is so sorted, I made the decision to really dive in and make the car my own instead of selling it and starting over with another.

That brings me to where I am with the car currently. My vision for the car, is I wanted it to be funky (maybe even tacky and stand out in a certain way?) and I wanted it to be mine. I have incorporated some elements of 993 heritage in an RS steering wheel as well as turbo fascias. I wanted to bring in some older Porsche touches also; grey square weave carpet and non-traditional Porsche tartan. Other odds and ends in the performance realm are; FD

motorsports Stage 3 exhaust, FD Motorsports SSK and a Steve Wong chip to really make the car "Personalized and unique". I wanted something to be more aggressive looking as well as more aggressive sounding - a real "Hot roddish" feel.

The internal struggle – if there is any – is that I have limited my market in terms of resale, as well as put dollars into the car that I will likely have a hard time getting back out. That said, at this stage, my 993 is a keeper...a member of the family.

As an item of interest, part of what's been so special about my experience with my 993 has been the air-cooled Porsche culture. The people I have met, the friends I have made and the enjoyment I have gotten out of building my YouTube channel has been life changing.

So far, I've put together 72 videos mostly on my experience with my Porsches, as well as interviews with fellow Porsche owners. I continue to collaborate with Porsche owners to feature them on the channel. I am also in discussions with Sonderwerks, the shop down in Cornelius that's done the work on my 993 to continue to publish Porsche videos together. Only the future will know where this all leads; but for now,...I'm lovin' my 993 – funky...tacky...and best of all – All Mine!

I believe you will agree with me in that Will has done an amazing job creating his own personalized and unique 993! I love the tartan touches done in the interior; stirring up feelings and images of those 50's to 80's era Porsches.



Hello again from your friendly neighborhood HPDE program! As I write this, spring is in full swing, the yellow tide has begun down in SC, and temps are warming to shorts weather. I always love this time of year as you never know what you are going to get on a weekly basis. Our March DE event at the fabulous Carolina Motorsports Park was no exception! Just a couple years ago we came to the track on Sunday to an inch of snow, while this year it was highs in the mid-70s the entire weekend. Over the years the weather has been all over but this year it was just about as perfect as one could request.

HBi Auto has become our exclusive sponsor for the 2021 DE season, providing at track support for many participants and showcasing some of the cars they support and sell through their dealership side. The crew

lenges of running 6 full groups while keeping scheduled track time had some comments that I heard and am working on. The feedback on the Vintage group was extremely positive from the folks who chose to run in it, and I'll be looking at ways to shorten the day, not have such large gaps between sessions (sorry Black group on Sunday), while keeping the group and the track time for all participants whole. This is your program, not mine, and it takes experimentation and all of us to make

it the best it can be.



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
