

Drivers Ed - Steve Barrier

It's officially summer; that hot, humid time of the year when you wish you were cool enough to have AC in the garage (unless you already have it, in which case I'm coming to work on my car at your place). We're ramping up for our September event at Carolina Motorsports Park. Yep, it's that time again... registration opens July 12 and there are a mountain of tasks to accomplish that started at the end of last year. HBi Auto will again be our sponsor for the event, providing at track support for our participants and helping the club promote safer high performance driving.

We will continue with in car instruction as we did in March, with an emphasis on limiting exposure as much as is feasible. The new track surface at CMP has brought about a much larger group of participants than recent events usually see, so make sure you register early as we will be confirming students as instructors register. This event will return to our customary five run group format, with beginner, novice, solo, advanced, and instructor groups. Response to the vintage group in March was good, but there are logistical challenges to running six groups, and September is already hot enough in South Carolina we don't need to add 2 hours to each day.

Speaking of the weather, it is usually pretty warm in late September, with summer clinging madly to the calendar. As you prepare to come to the event think about your time in between sessions. CMP has some shade with most of the paddock open to the whims of the weather. Bring plenty of water, healthy snacks, and if you can fit it in, a pop up tent and folding chairs. I've seen a myriad of ways to get things to and from the track. I tow my cars because I historically bring older (read, breakdown prone) cars to the track and I never know if it will be running at the end of the weekend. I've seen roof racks, tow behind utility trailers, and full tow rigs. If you're creative enough to get your significant other to come to the track, don't discount the space of bringing their car! Of course, nothing beats having a buddy who already has a full setup and you share with them!! Either way, preparation and planning will make for a much more enjoyable weekend.

Speaking of plans, when you come to the track, do you have a plan for what you want to get out of the weekend? As a student, begin thinking now about what you want to accomplish. Are you familiar with your car's braking ability....have you pushed that pedal all the way to ABS activation on purpose under a controlled scenario? How do you approach and analyze a turn? How do you manage power within a turn? Which gear is appropriate for what speed and turn geometry? Listing the goals you can have for a weekend would fill the entirety of Tobacco Roads. If you're not sure what to work on, have an in depth conversation with your instructor.

As a solo driver, when was the last time you had an instructor in the car? Are you still performing at peak capability? Is there something new you can learn about the track, your car, left foot braking, trail braking? When I had a passenger seat, I would regularly ask instructor friends to ride with me and provide tips and pointers. Getting more feedback to reinforce what you already know, or tweak something you thought you had down is the foundation of learning. As an instructor, what are your plans to improve your instruction game? When was the last time you sat in on a student classroom, helped out

with mentoring our instructor school, or participated in the school to refresh skills? We are all in a constant state of learning! And remember to break down larger goals into manageable tasks that can be learned in a specific session. Just as with bringing the right equipment, preparation and planning make for a more productive weekend.



Along the lines of learning and growth, we continue to grow and mature the program, and refine it to make the experience the best it can be. Over the past couple years we've seen increased participation in the management of the event, and I can't tell you enough how much we all appreciate that help at registration and tech inspection. If you have the desire to get more involved in the program, reach out to me. We would welcome your help to federate some of that mountain of tasks I spoke about earlier. There is much more we can do within this program, and it takes all of us to make it the best it can be. Thank you for tuning in and reading this month's edition, and I hope to see you at the track!

Considerations When Insuring Your Porsche

As our good friend Jim Hess phrased it, "insurance is only good when you need it". Well unfortunately, sometimes you need it, and when you need it, you do not want any unexpected surprises. Here are a few points to consider when insuring your Porsche.

The typical personal auto insurance policy settles a claim at "actual cash value" which is the "fair market value" of the car if totaled, or the cost to repair it. Today, many insurance companies offer enhanced loss settlement options such as "stated value", "agreed value", "new car replacement", and "OEM parts".

"Stated value" loss settlement provides coverage for the stated value or the actual cash value of the car at the time of loss, whichever is less. Do not confuse "stated value" with "agreed value".

"Agreed value" loss settlement provides coverage for the agreed value of the car without consideration of the car's actual cash value. You and your insurance company agree on this value when you insure the car.

Just think if you purchased a 2021 718 Cayman T for \$80,000 and six months later it was totaled. At the time of the claim, the car may only be worth \$70,000 at actual cash value, but if it were insured for an agreed value of \$80,000 your insurance company would pay you \$80,000 and make you whole.

In addition, you may be able to achieve this same outcome with a "new car replacement" endorsement. There are a few caveats and limitations with these endorsements, like you may have to be the original owner, the car must be three years old or newer, but all in all they can be a great value.

Porsche owners are typically conscientious about the parts used to repair their car, so check if your insurance company offers an "OEM endorsement" which guarantees only Porsche factory parts will be used to repair your car.

Hagerty Insurance is an excellent option for agreed value coverage, and they provide concierge claim service. Not only will Hagerty insure your vintage Porsche, they are also an option for newer Porsches as long as it is not your "daily driver". With Hagerty, you can purchase agreed value coverage at a reasonable price.

And if you are taking your Porsche to the track for a PCA High Performance Drivers Education event, check your track insurance policy for its settlement options. The options will vary by insurance provider. Furthermore, check if liability, pollution clean-up, debris removal, and towing coverage is provided. Chances are, your personal auto insurance policy will not provide coverage for any of the above as soon as you enter the paddock, so be sure you are familiar with your insurance coverages in the unlikely and unfortunate event you need it. You don't want to get surprised!


John Kenney-


