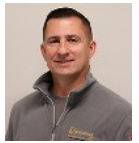

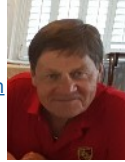

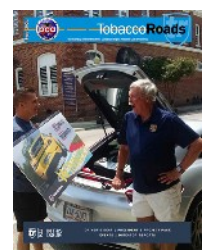

President's Project Page

Igniting the Spark ... One Person at a Time

The love of a Father-Son relationship is truly unique. Having three adult sons myself, I can certainly feel and understand what Marc's words mean. We share the car passion and I've spent hours upon hours working on "our cars" over the years...side by side; a very enjoyable experience. I'm so proud of my sons, and I know that Dale is looking down – proud of his Marc and the legacy that remains!

We all have "that spark" that ignited our Porsche passion...and we have "Our Story". I hope you enjoy Marc's story of who set it all to life for him.

Jerry Widner's column in the June Issue of Tobacco Roads invited members to write about what ignited their passion for Porsches. I read that issue a few days before Father's Day, which is fitting since my dad, Dale Hewitt, was the spark for me.

I grew up in the 1970s and 80s. He and my mom, Jane Hewitt, would eventually both become longtime PCA members, but were just young, working-class parents back then. One of our first family cars I remember as a kid was a Chevy Vega with wood paneling, which no one would ever, ever confuse for a Porsche. Even though Dad was a car guy my whole life, he worked for the natural gas utility company. So even as his career advanced, he was condemned to drive super-boring company cars (the burgundy mid-80's Chevy Citation hatchback was a particular low point). But I remember his stories about seeing a professor's foreign car that looked like a bathtub at Western Carolina University in the 1960s, which he later discovered was a Porsche 356. He was into Porsches from then on, and even though he wouldn't have his own sports car for years to come, he had the singular good taste to buy my big brother and me matching red VW Golf GTIs as our first cars. I'm pretty sure they were built in Pennsylvania, but they were German sports cars as far as we were concerned.

It wasn't until Dad had become an executive and was approaching early retirement that he finally pulled the trigger and bought a new 1997 Boxster, which I was even allowed to drive occasionally with the appropriate fear of death if I let anything happen to it. He bought several more Porsches in early 2000's, mostly air-cooled, including a white 1997 993 Carrera, a red 1965 356C coupe, and a brown 1973 911T, and eventually a water-cooled navy blue 2003 Boxster S for good measure. He and Mom started attending social events and drivers' education events with the Carolinas Region PCA in the late 90s and early 2000s, and by the time I left the military and moved to Raleigh in 2000, he had already been the editor of Tobacco Roads for a couple of years.



The Brown 1973 911T was Dad's track car. It was named "M&M" by a previous owner, and it stuck. An instructor once commented about Dad that they'd never ridden with anybody who was so comfortable sliding all the time. Dad invited me to come with Mom and him to the October 2005 Carolinas Region driver's ed at Carolina Motorsports Park. I was driving a BMW 3 series at the time (don't judge me). That first weekend I recall meeting Stan Simm, who had instructed my mom; "she's fast" he said; he still instructs regularly today. In fact, Stan was my instructor at my last track event (a BMW club event) just this past June. Stan let me ride along with him one session in his newest Mini, and he's as fast as ever. I also met a bunch of other PCA regulars that first weekend, whom I still

see at track days 15 years later: Jerry and Sadie Kilcrease, Bob and Nadine Saville, Marty Barrett, Shane Tisdale and Sandy Liles, Harvey Yancey, Charles Rupert, Herbert and Kathy Boehm, and others. The slogan is true - It's not just the cars, it's the people. Everyone was welcoming and encouraging as my skills went from non-existent to merely bad over the next few years, and I still see and talk to all of them at every PCA track day.

Despite my not driving well that first weekend in 2005, I didn't hurt myself or my car, and I was hooked. By 2007 I bought my own first Porsche, a red 1996 993 Carrera coupe, and joined the Porsche Club shortly after that. I live in Raleigh, which is really in the Hurricane Region footprint, but at least back then the Hurricane Region didn't do any track events, and that was not going to work for me. So, I followed in my parents' footsteps and joined the Carolinas Region and have been a member ever since.

I drove the 993 on the track and street for a few years until I got too nervous about hurting it. There was the time I "drove through" the grass on the inside, right after Turn 14 at CMP. It was cold and raining at that March 2009 DE with Harvey Yancey in the right seat (I wonder if Harvey remembers that). I still have the 993 and added a new 2015 Macan S as a daily driver after a couple of shorter affairs with Audis (a 2001 Audi S8 and a 2007 S4) in the 2000s.

I wasn't the only one in the family to catch the Porsche bug either. Mom drove the white 1997 993 or the 2003 Boxster S on track for years (mostly at CMP), and she's had a Cayenne S or Cayenne as her daily driver for well over a decade. My older brother John, who lives in Greensboro, had a grey 1989 911 Carrera while he was in the Navy and stationed at MCAS Beaufort, SC in the 2000s (yes, he probably wishes he'd kept it) and later had a gorgeous black 2017 991 Carrera after he moved to Greensboro. I haven't gotten him to come to do a DE yet, but I haven't given up hope yet.

Although the whole adventure started with my Dad, I didn't get to

share the passion for cars and track time with him for long enough. We only got to do a few track weekends together before he passed away too soon in the fall of 2010, at only age 65. Although he had a great circle of friends both personal and professional, PCA is where he seemed most at home, and the friendships he made decades ago continue with my Mom and me.

My love of the cars and performance driving continued too. After I retired my red 993 from track duty, I had a couple of other street/track cars, including a 2002 BMW Z3 M Coupe and a 2006 BMW M3, and currently an old Miata with a recently installed full roll cage. A friend and I co-own the Miata, and we're going endurance racing this December with ChampCar on VIR's North Course. I'm just hoping we finish but building the car has been fun; and while nobody ever said racing is cheap, Miata parts are way cheaper than Porsche parts (\$40 each for front brake rotors! Woo-hoo!).

But Porsches are still my favorite, and I've said for years I'll get back to driving a Porsche on track. So, like many other car nerds, I spent lots of time during the COVID-19 lockdown browsing sports car ads online, on Rennlist and PCA classifieds, bringatrailer.com, and others. If you haven't browsed bringatrailer.com yet, don't do it, at least not if you have a job. It will consume many hours of your time with beautiful, awesome, and some impressively weird sports cars, 4x4s and exotics.



Hunting for another Porsche is tough when you have sports car ADD like I do. I mostly like older ones for their simplicity and rawness, but they just can't keep up with the newer cars and they have old car problems. New Porsches are faster and more comfortable, but they're also expensive, heavier, more complicated, hard to get a manual, and not as direct or visceral to drive. I temporarily had my mind set on picking up a 2004 996 40th Anniversary Carrera (pretty rare, not too flashy, and a riot to drive with standard X-50 power option, LSD and sport suspension), but I couldn't find a good one, and they're getting close to 20 years old already. Air-cooled or water-cooled? Rear engine or mid-engine? First world problems - I know.

I eventually decided a Sapphire Blue 2016 Cayman GT4 was the "goldilocks" solution: not too old, but not brand new; not front engine or rear engine, but right in the middle; manual transmission, check - just right! I bought the car from a Chrysler/Jeep dealer

in Arlington Texas in June after a prepurchase inspection by Zimm's Autotechnik, a faithful Panorama advertiser and PCA event sponsor. A quick plug for Zimm's - They were responsive, professional, flexible and reasonably priced even though a PPI is small change for a shop. I had the GT4 picked up in Texas by Intercity Lines (another Panorama advertiser) and dropped off in Raleigh a few days later. I haven't taken it to the track yet, but I will soon. In the meantime, I live in fear of speed bumps (the GT4 is low) and my boys (11 and 9 years old) think it's the coolest thing ever just because it has a wing.

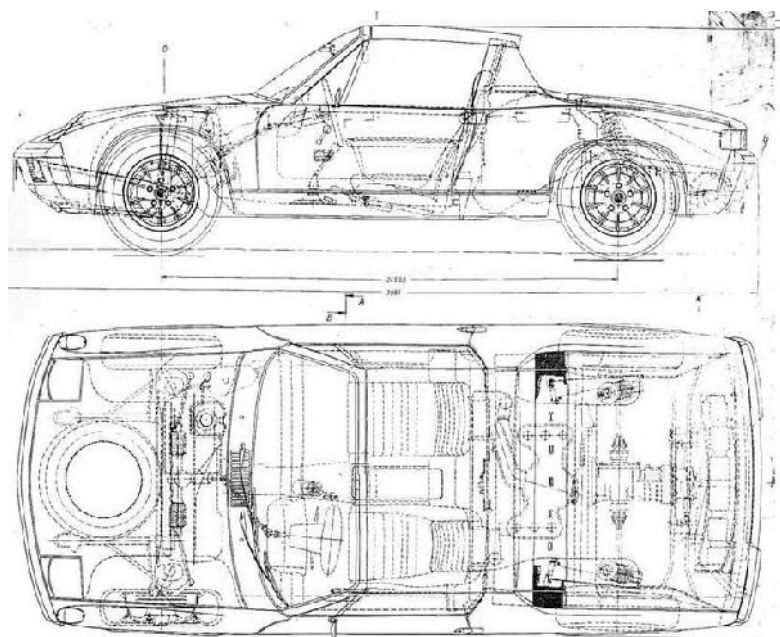

Mom still sometimes comes to the track to visit, but I miss my dad and envy the Fathers and Mothers and the sons and daughters I see at the track having fun and enjoying each other's company.
