



Aging Out, After 121 Years

For this month we have a tale of the times... age, in this case. I know that as we grow older, and obviously much wiser (right??), circumstances change the way we do things. Many throughout the Region are experiencing or have experienced what Phillip and Carol have. We only get

one shot at this thing called "life" ... ENJOY it... EMBRACE it... make a difference! Read their story and I know you will smile often...I certainly DID! Please ENJOY!

"Aging Out, After 121 Years"

Porsches have been in the Evans family for generations. My Grandparents owned several, my dad has owned two and I've owned two. Carol and I have been PCA Club members for a combined 35 years and my Mom and Dad, Ruth and Phil, have been members for a combined 86 years. Between the four of us, not counting my grandparents, we have 121 PCA membership years and as a family probably over 200 combined years of Porsche ownership. But an interesting thing happened this year, we sold our *CARS*.

"Aging Out" as defined by my Porsche Hickory salesman, Bob

Smith, is a phenomenon whereby a "more mature" Porsche owner begins to have trouble getting in and out of the sportscar and desires a more luxurious/comfortable ride as compared to the sportiness of most Porsches. He has witnessed it time

and again with 911/356 owners trading in their cars, often having owned them for 20 years or more.

At age 40, my first Porsche was a red "hand-me-down" 1965 356 Cabriolet that my dad bought when I was 10. Carol and I went on our first date in the 356 when we were High School seniors. My daughter and her husband drove away from their wedding reception in it. It was a part of our family. Carol and I enjoyed that car immensely. I became a regular at club autocrosses for a few years and even won my class a year or two in the Carolinas Region.

The 356, while not restored, was a "5-footer": It looked good from 5 feet away. I entered it in various shows, and it usually was a respectable representation. It never competed well with fully restored cars, but it still had the horsehair insulation under the floor mats and the exterior was in reasonable shape. It had been repainted once or twice over its forty-year run in our family and really deserved a complete restoration.

In giving me the 356 for my 40th, my Mom no longer had a Porsche

in the family. She was sullen, to say the least, it was like there had been a death in the family. "Something" was missing.

Fortunately, within days of getting the 356, I was able to locate a 1969 912. It was the 12 Volt system and a 911 style body down in Birmingham, AL. It was bright yellow and had a bashed in front headlight. The previous owner had wrecked it on a rainy road, driven it home and parked it in his garage. It remained untouched for a decade or longer. It was a classic "barn find".

Remarkably there was no rust on the yellow car, the wiring harness was fully intact, and the engine "started". Dad bought it and we trailered it home. My mom who had gone quickly into "Porsche withdrawal", immediately fell in love with the little 912.

Dad spent a couple of years sourcing original parts, having the body work redone and having it repainted. When Dad bought it, it was a bright

yellow color, however, when we removed the front license plate cover the original "Bahama Yellow" color was determined; a much richer, deeper color. The car was correctly repainted and placed into service as a daily driver and driven for 25 more years.

Then something happened: after returning from an unsuccessful autocross on a hot August evening, I decided to sell the

356. The car was hot, it had no A/C, and it had developed vapor lock after I spun out; as well, it wouldn't start with the 6-volt battery. After an embarrassing push start in front of my autocross friends, I decided that I was ready to sell the car and buy something else. I had aged out of the red 356.

I sold the 356 to a friend and very capable Porsche restoration expert, Tim Hermann. Tim does national level restorations on primarily older Porsches in his shop in Hickory. (See carreramotorsport.com for more information.) After digging into the "Evans" 356, Tim decided to "preserve it" and drive it himself. It'll be repainted and worn parts will be selectively and carefully replaced.

I liked the two-seater convertible feel that the 356 offered. To me, that's a true sports car. My grandfather had owned several

356's. He and my grandmother would travel to Germany, buy their car, and tour Germany. Then they'd have it shipped back to the States and imported as a "used" car. I have a few grainy black and white photos from the 1960's of him in his white 356, including one of him driving through the carousel on the Nürburgring. There's just something "honest" about a two-seater sports car.

After not much thought, I decided to replace the 356 with a Boxster. My wife had seen a Boxster at the grocery store, a beautiful blue color with "red brakes". She loved the color combination. I told her that she'd seen a Boxster S and we'd never be able to afford that. But, after selling the 356 to Tim, finding the right car became the main challenge.

I scoured the online classified ads (cargurus.com) and found a likely candidate at a FORD dealership. Honestly, I'm not sure they knew what they had. After a bit of back-and-forth negotiations, I secured the 2011 Metallic Blue Boxster S with the "pretty" red brake calipers. I enjoyed driving the Boxster, auto crossed it once coming in second in my class and even went on a few tours with the Carolinas Region Hickory Area. Carol liked having an airconditioner and I liked being able to travel with the top down. Carol and I even developed a routine with another couple our age

with a red two-seater convertible. He would map out a route using back winding country roads that would lead us to a small rural town that conveniently had an ice cream shop and usually an adjoining coffee shop. It was a wonderful way to enjoy the Boxster and do

exactly what it was designed to do. But, as I approached my Medicare age of eligibility, I was noticing that the Boxster "seemed" to be getting pretty low to the ground. I found getting in and out of the car was taking a whole lot more effort. Often, I would find myself literally rolling out of the car and onto the garage floor. The lack of events due to Covid, my 65th birthday approaching, and "rolling" out of the car after a spin in the Boxster led me to again think: "I have aged out of this car." What next? Am I done with Porsches? I decided to sell the Boxster: it was a sobering thought. Then Carol came up with a crazy idea: "What if we sold the Boxster and your daily work driver to buy a Cayenne? It's a Porsche!"

Sell TWO cars and get a Cayenne?? That might just be a *wonderful, brilliant, crazy* idea! It comes in an E-Hybrid model and that intrigued me. A Cayenne would be easier to get in and out of, plus, we could take trips together and have actual luggage space. Most importantly, I could drive a Porsche every day!

Hmmmm...a Cayenne? But is it <u>really</u> a "Porsche"? Caleb Pletcher, the former General Manager at Porsche Hickory explained that the only people who think a Cayenne is NOT a Porsche are those who have never driven one. The Cayenne, Macan and Panamera are the cars of choice for folks like me that have "aged-out" of the "sportscars" but still want to drive a Porsche. And it's a fine point; but the Cayenne turns out to be a sportscar that "looks" like an SUV versus an SUV "trying" to be a sportscar.

We discussed our options with Porsche Hickory, and they acknowledged it was common for "more mature" Carol and Lat Christmas...waiting on our Cayenne

Porsche owners to move into a Cayenne, Macan or Panamera. Their knowledgeable staff and tax incentives led us to decide on getting a new Cayenne E Hybrid. It has "Porsche" performance with a 0-60 in the 4.7 sec range and the economy of a hybrid at 40+ EMPG.

With any options added the car can quickly approach or exceed six figures. That was more than I intended to spend, but <u>Carol</u> wanted a newer Cayenne with the new large infotainment center and piano black console. (I tried to talk her into a used one, but she "made" me opt for a new one.) So, we decided to special order our own Cayenne and we got to pick our options. Carol picked the color: Cashmere Metallic Beige.

Again, Covid/Supply Chain issues hit and alas, our car was backordered waiting on both parts and a slot on a ship. We ordered it in early Aug of 2021 its scheduled arrival was delayed from Nov to Dec: just in time to arrive around our Anniversary (Mid-Dec), Christmas, or my Birthday in early Jan.

As of writing this, our Cayenne has arrived, and we love it!

It gets decent mileage (I can drive to work and back on the battery only), has amazing acceleration and it is comfy to ride in. We especially love that we can turn the car heat (or A/C) on with my cell phone app and have the e-hybrid battery warm (or cool) the cabin before we get in.

So, (from my perspective) this is all Carol's fault: I have a NEW Cayenne E-Hybrid! I haven't aged out after all! Carol tells me "Happy Anniversary, Merry Christmas and Happy Birthday.... for as long as we both shall live." It's the cars. It's the people.

I will continue to provide the opportunity to showcase members across the Region, here in the President's Project Page...be ready with YOUR story, YOUR project, YOUR passion. I look forward to travelling around our Carolinas Region to find it. We will put it here!




