



Michelin Proving Grounds – Mountville, SC June 12, 2022

To start this report with a word — "HOT 95F to 100F HOT" — Michelin is a 10.5 acre asphalt pavement without any shade within 100 feet. The perfect place for a large and fast Autocross event.

To make things comfortable for our participants we rented the Conference Center that is near the pavement on a small hill that provides an excellent view of the whole event. An airconditioned space with real restrooms, a water cooler, snacks, tables and chairs, and running water.

We also purchased 3 new 10x15 ft canopies that we deployed for the timing control area and the other 2 for participants to get out of the sun while waiting their turns to run or work. A welcomed addition to our equipment.

I picked a bad weekend to have this event as we competed with PCA Parade and a DE at VIR that drew some of our regulars away. But we still had 33 registrants, 9 of which were NON-Porsche entries. Three were my friends from the SCCA side of the tracks. Glad to see our other car clubs joining us – they said they would be back and liked the course and Michelin location. One will be joining us in Greensboro in July

We got started a little later than planned as we were having some issues with our old timing equipment and the new Axware software that we use to collect all the run data and tally the scores. We are working on getting funds to upgrade the timing equipment, but it just did not happen in time for this event.

The 3 morning runs where timed with stop watches (cell phones). During the lunch pizza break David sorted out the timing gear and the software so the afternoon ran smooth, and everyone got in 6 more runs for a total of 9 out of the 10 we had advertised for this event. "Improvise and overcome" got us to the end of our event and everyone was happy.

There was only one incident with one car that over heated as it waited on grid in the morning. Interesting car - a 1973 914 with a V8 – hmmmm?

The last Autox we made personalized awards that was coffee mug with the persons car photo and their Name, class and position on the mug. I got a lot of comments as how they really liked these awards/trophies.

For this event we are providing a curved glass trophy with engraved image of a 993 911, and the person's info engraved as before. These awards are custom made and mailed directly to the recipients.

One of the SCCA guys commented on the layout of the course as challenging – areas that required patience to get thru the elements and areas that were wide open – pedal to the metal.

President's Project Page

My Love for Porsches

For this month we have the tale of a red 914 igniting a passion that has lasted over 40 years. From an emulating Porsche customized Beetle to a dedicated "Kermit" R, Dougs story will take many of us down memory lane as well as put a smile on your face! Please ENJOY!


Like many of us, my love affair with the Porsche brand started when I was a teenager. Growing up in the 70's and 80's, unlike my buddies I was not into the American muscle cars. I appreciated the power, but they lacked refinement and attention to detail that I had seen in the Motor Trend magazines my dad used to have around the house. My first experience laying my hands on a Porsche was when I was about 13. I had a friend whose dad had a red 914 that I would just go stare at and sit in whenever I would hang out at his house.

By the time I turned 16, knowing my very limited budget (provided by mom and dad), my first car was a light blue 1969 VW bug with a hand crank sunroof – a perfect southern California car. I loved the car but needed to make it "mine". So, after a small fender bender, my dad and I took it down to our local paint and body shop where they added a little bondo, sanded down the car to the bare metal, and painted her Porsche Guards red. I then added some cool gold rims and a Blaupunkt radio and cassette player and a few other cosmetic items I ordered from the JC Whitney catalog my dad had around the house and she was now "mine."

About that same time, I think my dad got tired of hearing me complain about us not having a sports car in the garage, a Porsche to be exact, so he started on a search to find one for himself; not me! I remember the day he came home with a used 1966 black 912 with a deep red interior – I had a grin from ear to ear. I would spend nights cleaning and waxing it and talked him into replacing the stock rims with the Fuchs brand to make it look a little more modern for the time. While I rarely got to drive it as a 16 to 17-year-old, I probably sat in it more than my dad!

In 1999, I moved to Charlotte, NC and decided, at the age of 34, it was time to splurge for a used Porsche. I located one in Columbia, SC after weeks of searching and within my budget of about \$16,000. My wife and 1 year old son drove down to see it, and I fell in love with the Guards red 1985 Carrera – gold rims, a tan interior, and the whale tail. As soon as I sat in it, it reminded me of my dad's 912 – the smell of German leather "I only had that car for about a year before I decided it was a little small for a growing family so I sold it and bought a Ford F150, always knowing I would have another Porsche someday. Look closely and you can see my 1-year-old son, Blake, sitting on the tail.





Fast forward up to 2016, kids are older, and I have been fortunate in my professional life to once again own a Porsche, so I decided to just go "looking". I drove to Hendrick Porsche here in Charlotte and found a 6 speed 2013 Carrera S – Silver with black interior and 40,000 miles. Again, when I sat in it, memories of childhood dreams came rushing back. When I started the car on the lot, the sound made me melt, the feel of the leather...and the smell of the interior. I drove off the lot that day with the car after a very pleasurable sales experience at Hendrick and stopped to take pictures of the car several times on the way home to text to friends and family, and probably even a few Facebook posts. I finally really had my dream car.

After driving the car for 2 years and about 15,000 miles, enjoying every one of them, I decided it was time to go a little faster and a little brighter, so I sold my 2013 to Tim in Jacksonville, FL and set myself out on a search for a 2016 Carrera GTS. I love the sound of a naturally aspirated car and that was the one year and model I really wanted. I considered a 2016 GT4 but wanted something comfier for everyday driving and a few creature comforts like 18-way heated seats. As I did a nationwide search for about 6 weeks in the first quarter of 2020, I finally found the one I was looking for in Evansville, Indiana that met all my requirements – AND it was Guards Red!!!! After negotiating the deal (basically paying him what he was asking), my wife and I drove to Louisville, KY to pick up the beauty the next day. She



was sitting outside at the end of a cul-de-sac brightly polished waiting for me to open the door. Little did I know at the time until I got home and went through all of the service records that the car was initially sold in 2016 from Beverly Hills Porsche, where I used to go look at cars and dream growing up an hour away from that dealership and working after college about 5 miles away. I made some very good time from Evansville to Charlotte and had dinner made for my wife that night by the time she got home in the Jeep.

So, current day, I still have the Guards red beauty that I have left completely stock. with the red stitching and Alcantara seats. It makes me smile every time I walk into the garage and start it and brings back childhood memories and my love for the Porsche brand. Then, if just having the car to drive around wasn't enough, a buddy told me I should try to get it out on a track someday. So, I quickly came home and signed up for a Turn One track day at Carolina Motorsports Park and the GTS and I were on our way. I must admit it was very intimidating getting on the track not having a clue what to do and what the car could handle. I quickly found out the car can handle much more than I could throw at her. I remember my instructor asking me "what are you afraid of in the Carousel, you can't coast through there in a rear engine car!" I told him I was afraid I would lose the back end...and he said, "you will if you coast!" So, after a day of that, and having an absolute blast I signed up for my first PCA HPDE weekend down there later that year.

After that weekend I decided if I was going to do this, a track car would be very cool, and I didn't need heated 18 way seats. So, while I wasn't really looking, I got an email from a friend of a friend mid 2021 that his friend was selling his 2012 Cayman R and was the original owner. I spoke with the seller on a few occasions, and we agreed on a price (e.g. pay him what he was asking for it) and within 2 weeks it was on a covered carrier on its way from Palo Alto to Denver, NC. You may see her at the track for PCA HPDE days and she goes by the name of "KRMT" which was a name my daughter gave it for obvious reasons! Kermit has some nice track goodies installed like AP Racing Brakmand JRZ suspension and how can someone not love the Peridot 12 This picture was taken just as it came off the truck after the crosscountry trip. Once again, getting in the car and driving it home from the drop off point, the sounds and smells brought home more memories that I will always cherish.

Needless to say, I will always have a Porsche in my garage as it means more to me than just a car or transportation, it breathes life into me, brings back childhood memories, and still makes me smile every time I get in one.


