



LAKE NORMAN MEETINGS & EVENTS SCHEDULE

Our next meeting will be on Thursday, August 11th at 6:30 pm again at Skybrook Country Club. Troy Macias with Legendary Autosports will be our guest speaker informing us about some of the great organized driving tours his company offers to car enthusiasts.



Our June 23 Triangle Area meeting involved a presentation by David Gold, owner of: rolling tones.

Since 1985 David has owned this company, which specializes in custom automotive electronic upgrades for German cars. He brought approximately 20 large color photographs with text and arrows on them explaining locations, features & benefits, mostly of Porsche cars.



The gist was about how you can upgrade your current car to modern technology without changing the look and without damaging it such as through drilling holes. One of David's mottos is: "Don't Trade, Upgrade!" He went on to explain that if you like your car, and it's paid for, and it has no rust, it makes a lot of sense to upgrade the technology rather than spending huge money on a new, or newer, car.

For example, he can upgrade your Porsche to include Apple



CarPlay, android auto, color backup camera, heated seats, inflatable lumbar support, remote start, and since he is set up as a mobile service, he can do the work at your home or office or facility.

David has specialized in automotive electronics and is a member of SAE, and has a practice of ongoing training and always learning new things about his business. The product which he refers to as his "signature product" is the K40 radar and laser protection system. This will protect your car regardless of how fast you are going and the company will pay any speeding tickets you have in the first year, expandable to a total of three years of coverage.

For a few owners he has used NASA materials to silence their vehicles with no visible signs.

He has spent many years perfecting his techniques so that these can be installed without damage. He refers to those techniques as "stealth installation practices." His primary concern, like he says, is not your pocketbook or his pocketbook rather, it is the health & value of the car. He spends a fair amount of time talking people out of ideas they have for various electronics in their car.

He says that the ultimate economy is preserving the resale value of these fine cars, and he strives to do so with every installation. When he is finished, he provides a complete tutorial explaining everything about your system (or systems) and how they are operated.

In recent years he has even carved out a niche category of installing trailer hitches and trailer hitch wiring for expensive German vehicles. His special wiring techniques never touch the wires in the vehicle so it will not store any codes.

Carolinas Challenge Club Race

Carolinas Challenge—2022

October 21-23, 2022 marks the return of a Carolinas Region tradition—the Carolinas Challenge Club Race and Drivers Education event at Carolina Motorsports Park located in Kershaw, SC. For more than 20 years, the Carolinas Region hosted a fall club race event that brought racers from all over the east coast (from New York to Florida) and as far west as Texas, Illinois, and Missouri to test their skills on the 14-turn, 2.3-mile road course.

This event, historically attended by racers from Autometrics, Protech Motorsports, Docs Grrrage, SpeedWerks, Kelly Moss, Eurosport, and South Shore Performance just to name a few, is a favorite on the PCA Club Racing schedule because the course has both technical as well as rhythm sections, and the venue has a festival atmosphere punctuated with good food, good music, and a driver celebration that is second to none!

Thursday October 20

The event starts with registration on the afternoon of Thursday October 20 at the garage paddock area. As drivers and support teams arrive and setup their paddock areas for the weekend, all cars (race as well as driver education) as well as driver equipment (helmet, head-and-neck restraint, fireproof suits, shoes and gloves) must be inspected for safety and rules compliance before they are approved for on-track activity. Technical inspection for race cars takes place Thursday afternoon and Friday morning. After technical inspection, all drivers will finish setting up their paddocks for the weekend and begin the final preparations for Friday's on-track activities. Often, this entails fine-tuning suspension setups, tire pressures, and fueling. At 6pm on Thursday, the Carolinas Region will hold a "track walk" to familiarize drivers (who wish to partake) with the race course. This one-hour walk/drive around the course allows drivers to see corner entry, apex, and exits up close and to better understand the subtle elevation changes around the course. Due to COVID restrictions over the past two years, the Orientation Meeting that would normally be held at the track on Thursday night, will be held virtually (Orientation Zoom) the week before the event. The Orientation Zoom is mandatory for rookie candidates, first time provisional licensees and "invited quests". The PCA National Club Race Director will send details to racers required to attend.

Friday October 21—Practice Day

Friday starts the race weekend. The race groups (usually one "stock" class, one GT class, and one vintage class) will each take to the track for three (3) 20-minute practice sessions where drivers and teams will assess the performance and setup of their cars for the qualifying session and Saturday sprint races, and drivers will practice getting around CMP as quickly and efficiently as possible while practicing their race craft (e.g., safely passing cars). Qualifying for Saturday's sprint races takes place Friday afternoon for each race group. The day of practice will conclude with 15-minute <u>practice starts</u> for each race group, where the purpose is to give rookies some race start experience before Saturday's races. Once the track goes cold after the final practice start, drivers and teams get together for some strategy and setup talk as well as some good old fashion bench racing among friends.

Saturday October 22—Sprint Race Day

It is race day! Each of the race groups are called to and line up on the false grid according to their qualifying times (fastest first) and roll off for one pace lap followed by a green flag race start (as long as the cars are lined up two by two and not too spread out) for a 40-minute race (typically 20 or so laps). The action is always exciting at turn one for the race start and spectators can see the action from a number of vantage points in the infield. As a matter of fact, spectators can see the race action at turns 1, 2, 3, the "kink" (turn 10), and turns 11, 12, 13, and 14. In between each race group session, we will host 4-5 20-minute sessions for advanced solo drivers in the PCA High Performance Driver Education (HPDE) program. Many of these drivers are former racers, national HPDE instructors, or highly experienced drivers with loads of seat time ensuring the DE sessions are fast and safe. The DE sessions have controlled passing (with a signal by the driver being passed) whereas passing in the club races is open and does not require a passing signal to be given.

Once the races and DE sessions have concluded, the track host the "Pit Crew Challenge" where race team crew members are pitted against one another at the go-kart track for bragging rights. No race drivers or DE drivers are allowed to participate in this event but are encouraged to come and cheer on their friends and team members. Immediately following the Pit Crew Challenge, the Carolinas Challenge hosts the driver celebration where drives, families, friends, teams, and special guests are invited to enjoy a traditional southern barbeque, southern music, libations of all kinds, speakers and awards (top three in each race class as well as the Carolinas Region "Hard Luck" award). This year's return event will celebrate the rich history of the Carolinas Challenge and recognize people, teams, and sponsors who have had a hand in making this event one of the safest and most fun club races on the PCA schedule.



Sunday October 23—Enduro Race Day

The Sunday morning activities starts with qualifying for the 90-minute enduro race. Some cars will have a single driver, while others will have two drivers for the race. A five-minute pit stop is required for each car (except when the pits are closed) when cars may change drivers as well as add fuel in a controlled and safe environment that is observed and timed carefully. The vintage race group also has a 3rd sprint race on Sunday, providing one last chance for glory. After the excitement of the enduro race, a brief awards ceremony will take place and the event will conclude by mid-afternoon.

Brief training will be provided by PCA National, and no one is expected to be an "expert"; truly observers reporting any obvious infractions.

Driver Celebration Ambassadors—3 positions; this position is designed to assist me getting attendees to the celebration area (the pagoda at turn 2) and assisting with the celebration itself (e.g., supporting food service staff, entertainment, and awards)

Pit Crew Challenge Assistants—2 positions; responsible for assisting with coordinating the Pit Crew Challenge which takes place Saturday October 22 at the go-kart track when the track goes cold (about 5pm) and before the Driver Celebration (which starts at 6pm). Fun event that has pit crew members (no race drivers) for teams race one another in heats for pit crew glory.

ADDITIONALLY, I need one "paid" volunteer for the following position.

Race Director Assistant—1 position; this position supports the PCA National Race Director in their duties. I am looking for someone who will commit to full days each of the three days of the event (8am-5pm). I offer a hotel room for each night (at one of the event hotels in Camden) and a modest (\$100/day) stipend for this position.




