## APPLEBAUM INTERNSHIP PROGRAM & APPLEBAUM FELLOWS

The Applebaum Internship Program (AIP) is an exclusive initiative of Applebaum Family Philanthropy (AFP) providing opportunities for young people to inspire entrepreneurship, independence and leadership.

- The Applebaum Fellows network is a community of individuals who have benefited from opportunities made possible by Applebaum Family Philanthropy.

## THE PROGRAM

AIP is a unique opportunity to enhance leadership, networking, and work skills in a student cohort experience. Students will receive a stipend to participate in an internship with your organization and engage in a series of educational, interactive and leadership roundtables.

## THE OPPORTUNITY

- The organization is required to provide a bona fide internship experience with the following criteria:
  - *Ensure* a meaningful, hands-on assignment portfolio
  - *Assign* a dedicated supervisor/manager to the student for the duration of the internship
  - *Provide* informal learning opportunities, including engagement with organizational leadership (E.g. CEO, President, Board members, executives, senior staff)
  - *Duration of internship* must be at least 8 weeks
  - *Internship engagement* must be a minimum of 25 hours per week
- Students are required to participate in each programming session (3-4 during the course of the internship, dates shared in advance.)
- AFP curates and organizes the programming sessions

## RECRUITMENT

Recruitment, selection and placement of candidate is conducted by organization.

## FUNDING + STIPEND PAYMENT

AFP provides a \$3,000 stipend to allow interns to focus fully on the program. AFP will pay the stipend in two installments of \$1,500, midway through and upon the successful completion of the entire program. The payment is made directly to your organization. It is the responsibility of the organization to administer the payment to the intern. If you have questions about setting up the payments, please contact us directly.

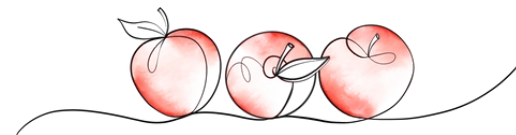
## PROGRAM PARTICIPATION + ELIGIBILITY

Eligible participants are undergraduate/college students currently enrolled in schools based in Southeast Michigan. Students must be in their sophomore year or higher (equivalent). If a student resides outside of Southeast Michigan or has graduated before the start of the program, they are not eligible to participate.
