Each Boys' Brigade group meets in a local church and is called a Company. Each Company is broken up into age groups called Sections. Each Section creates a program that is specific to the development and social needs of the boys.

The Sections are called: Anchors: Ages 5-7 years Juniors: Ages 8-11 years Seniors: Ages 12-18 years.

Companies in locality areas are grouped together to form a **Battalion**. Battalions get together to compete against each other in activities such as: Soapbox

The Boys' Brigade Qld State Office also runs events for Companies to attend. Some of these are State Events include Soapbox Derby and The Great Canoe Race. They also run a variety of camps for fun. BBQLD also hold events for the training of Leaders and Leadership Development for

Derby, Figure Marching and Drill **Competitions, Swimming Carnivals,** Archery, Dodgeball and more. They also get together socially for fun activities like Camps and Day Outings.



# Uniforms

Uniforms are an important part of The Boys' Brigade. The boys are proud to wear their uniforms and be a part of the Company. We have a Classic and Contemporary Uniform. The choice of uniform worn is decided by the Company. As boys move through the Sections, their uniform changes slightly.

Anchors wear: navy shorts, sky blue BB shirt, cap and BB socks, black shoes and armband. Juniors wear: navy shorts, navy BB shirt, cap, BB socks, black shoes and armband. Seniors wear: navy trousers, navy BB shirt, BB belt, cap, black shoes, shoulder belt and armband.

Officers wear; White shirt, black pants, black tie, BB tie bar, BB Belt, Glengarry A navy BB polo and contemporary baseball are substituted for the comtemporary uniform.

Boys' Brigade trained leaders (Officers) prepare challenging and adventurous activities for the boys in their Section. As boys move through the Sections, their activities will become more challenging and include hiking, camping, canoeing, bush skills, archery and more. Each Company will arrange different activities according to the interest of their leaders. Many of the leaders will be trained in Outdoor Education Certificates. Those Companies who have leaders trained can register to be an Active Club and families will have access to Fair Play Vouchers, which can be used towards yearly BB Company Membership Fees.



All our leaders comply with the Queensland Blue Card Requirements and are trained and compliant with their Church Child Safety programs and The Boys' Brigade Australia Child Safety and Risk Assessment Program.



Based on Luke 2:52, The Boys' Brigade program is a holistic program that engages boys in five aspects of who they are. Each Section's program will cover these aspects with age appropriate activities, allowing them to develop these aspects as they move through the Sections.

> Boys participate in age appropriate activities that aim to develop boys physically and include team and individual sport, drill and figure marching, expeditions and learning about healthy living.

Boys have the opportunity to stretch their mind through learning about the world they live in, The Boys' Brigade and the environment.

Boys have the chance to discover a God who loves them and learn about the Bible and Christian life.

Boys explore their creative talents through developing new skills and hobbies, giving them opportunities to discover and express their own

through engaging in community service projects, learning about the needs of others, how our society works and how hey can be an active

part.

### finding the leader in your son LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT



The BBQLD Leadership Development Program is run in weekend or weeklong courses and are designed to find the leader in your son.

The BB Leadership Development Program is recognised by the Studies Authority, contributing points to the Qld Certificate of

Education.

The Leadership Course is broken into stages over 3 years, starting when a boy is 15 years old.

A Trainee explained his time at Leadership like this: At Stage 1, I learnt Leadership Skills At Stage 2, I learnt how to be a man At Stage 3, I learnt how to be the man I want to be. And I've made all these plans, because there is no Stage 4 Leadership.

#### Stage 4 is the rest of your life!



Badges and Awards Solution The Boys' Brigade encourages boys to earn badges through a variety of actvities: Service: Long term participation, commitment, sacrifice and good conduct Activity: Aquiring skills and experiences in many different areas, such as BB Knowledge, Scripture Knowledge, Service to the Community, Skills, Expedition, Environmental, Physical, Sports, Hobbies. Special: Awards for Heroism, Gallant Conduct, Duke of Edinburgh, Sir William A Smith Award, The Queen's Badge.

The Badge System requirements are age appropriate and for the Anchors and Juniors, their badgework is completed within the Company Program. The Seniors is more challenging and has requirements for the boys outside of Company Night.

The Boys' Brigade was founded on 4 October, 1883, by William Alexander Smith at the Free Church Mission, North Woodside Rd, Glasglow, Scotland.

William Smith, a voluntary Sunday School teacher and "volunteer" member (similiar to our Army Reserves) devised an unique youth movement and program based on Christian ideals, achieving personal goals for his Sunday School members aged 12.

Choosing activities that engaged boys of that generation, the initial program included a simple form of parade drill, gymnastics and team games. Other activite is were soon added and in 1886, William Smith held the first camp. In fact, it was the start of recreation camping for young people.

BB was quickly taken up by many Scottish churches and then, by churches throughout Britain and Ireland. This growth in Britain was soon followed by the starting of Companies overseas in places such as Canada, USA, South Africa, Asia, Australia and New Zealand.



William Smith asked his friend, Lord Baden-Powell, to rewrite his articls about "scouting" for the army and tailor them to run within a boys program, which eventually resulted in Baden-Powell founding the Boy Scouts as a separarte movement in 1908. William Smith was knighted in 1909 in recognition of his work with BB and the nations youth. He died in 1914. The Boy's Brigade is now in 60 countries around the world with around 750 000 boys and leaders involved.

For over 135 years, The Boys' Brigade world wide ministry has been "advancing the Christ's Kingdom among Boys and the promotion of habits of Obedience, Reverence, Discipline, Self-Respect and all the tends towards a true Christian Maniness" - The Object of The Boys' Brigade
