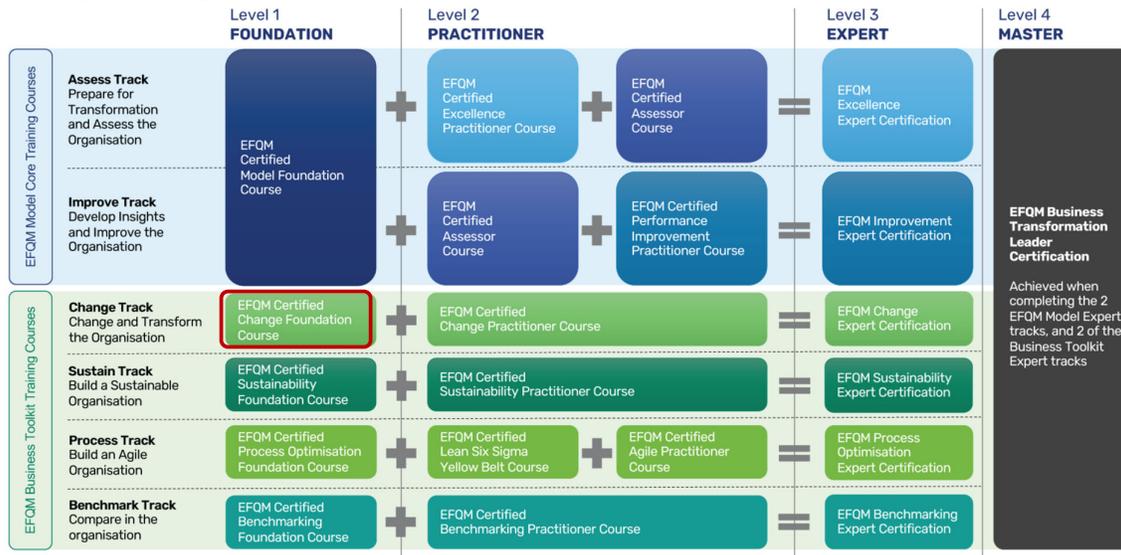


EFQM Certified Change Foundation 2025

Goals

By participating in this course, learners build a clear baseline understanding of what Change Management is and why it is critical for delivering business value (beyond “installing” new processes/technology), including how human responses to change (the Change Curve) affect adoption in practice; they also gain the ability to recognize the value of structured models and apply two widely used approaches (ADKAR and Kotter) to real project scenarios, while being introduced to the CPC Change Management Method and its initial key tools for business application—equipping them to better anticipate resistance, engage stakeholders, and support implementation in an EFQM-aligned transformation context.

Learning objectives

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Understand what Change Management is and why it is essential to achieving business value and sustained performance.
- Use the Change Curve to interpret human responses to change and anticipate adoption challenges in real situations.
- Recognise when and how to use structured Change Management models to simplify, structure, and control complex change efforts.
- Apply ADKAR and Kotter at a foundational level to plan actions for change initiatives and projects.
- Understand the CPC Change Management Method, its knowledge areas, and key tools for business application.

Learning outcomes

After completing the course, participants can:

- Explain the EFQM–Change Management connection and why “people-side” change is critical to transformation success.
- Diagnose likely stakeholder reactions using the Change Curve and identify practical responses to resistance.
- Outline a basic change approach using ADKAR (Awareness→Reinforcement) for a project scenario.
- Translate Kotter’s 8 Steps into concrete actions (urgency through institutionalisation) for an organisational initiative.
- Describe CPC’s method (Initiate/Lead/Steer/Commit/Sustain), name the five knowledge areas, and select initial tools to support delivery.
