

Why:

In October 2015 the Council adopted the Christchurch Energy Action Plan. The Council's Electric Vehicle Programme forms part of the Action Plan and has projects to encourage the uptake of electric vehicles. Parking for electric vehicles on Nayland Street is one of those projects.

With the rapid improvement in electric vehicle technology, we're seeing an increase in the range and affordability of electric vehicles for use in corporate fleets and by private individuals. Developments are already underway to provide charging infrastructure for electric vehicle travelling out of Christchurch, which will further support the uptake of these vehicles.

Project Cost:

If approved, Orion will cover the cost of installing the electric vehicle chargers. This will be coordinated as part of the "Sumner Lyttelton Corridor Geotechnical Risk Mitigation" works project. As part of this geotechnical works project, the Orion substation box is due to be relocated from its current location to opposite the new Sumner Library, Community Facility and Museum.

All other costs relating to the marking of the two electric vehicle charging parks, and any associated signage, along with the two replacement parks will come from the Christchurch City Council.

Timeline:

- 26 August 2016
Information leaflet distributed
- 21 September 2016
Anticipated Hagley Ferrymead Community Board decision
- November/December 2016
Anticipated electric vehicle charging parks to be complete (if approved). Dependant on the timing of the relocation of the Orion substation box.



Parking for Electric Vehicle Charging on Nayland Street, Sumner.

In keeping with the Christchurch Energy Action Plan, the Christchurch City Council is proposing to install two electric vehicle charging parks on Nayland Street (refer to plan overleaf), opposite the new Sumner Library, Community Facility and Museum. As these parks would be dedicated electric vehicle charging parks, two additional parks on Nayland Street will be created to replace these two parks. This will ensure there will be no further loss of existing car parking spaces along Nayland Street.

The location of the electric vehicle charging parks has been selected due to their proximity to the power supply via the Orion substation box. It is also due to the visibility of this location from the main street in Sumner to make the parks highly visible and easy to find.

When:

It is anticipated that a report seeking approval from the Hagley/Ferrymead Community Board for installation of these parks will be presented at their 21 September 2016 meeting.

If approved, installation is expected to be completed by the end of 2016.


