POSH & PODD

Now in their 7th year our two Flagship Events have been growing in popularity year on year and have now become part of the established race circuit for some of the fleets.

POSH 2017

For the 2017 Paignton Open for Single Handed dinghies we had exactly 60 boats. The classes included: RS100s, D-Ones, Phantoms, RS600s, Blazes, RS Aero 7s and 9s, D-Zeros, Lasers, Laser Radials and 4.7s, Europes and an OK. Due to the number of boats we ran 4 start sequences, meaning we had about 15 to 20 boats in each start, this really helped to spread out the competitors and made finishing easier as we used a finish boat as well as start boat. Having this type of system means we can keep sailors sailing rather than waiting for other fleets to finish before starting the 4 start sequences again. We had 2 days of good weather with just the right amount of wind, in that time we managed to get in 3 races each day making a 6 race series. Another successful event!

PODD 2017

The Paignton Open for Double handed Dinghies traditionally does not attract the numbers that POSH does, nevertheless we had a great selection of classes with the Fireballs, as usual, in abundance. 20 boats turned up for a weekend of excellent weather for racing. The classes that supported us this year were: Fireballs, Tasars, Laser 4000s, Merlin Rockets, RS200s, Scorpions, Albacores, RS400s, 2000s and a Comet Trio. Not surprisingly the Fireballs dominated the results sheet with celebrity helms and crews like Thomas Gillard and Geoff Edwards on the startline!

POSH & PODD 2018

This year we are again hosting these two iconic events and hope that more of our home grown helms will participate. If you haven't taken part in a big open event before this is a great opportunity to try one and enjoy the thrill and spectacle of competing on the water with so many boats of varying classes. Anyone can help, regardless of experience. The more people who are willing volunteer, the better the club runs, so please help if you can. I hope you all have a really good 2018 season on the water.

About The Club

Objectives

The objectives of the club are described in the club's constituton. The club is a not-for-profit organisation and a registered amateur sports club dedicated to providing the facilities for the enjoyment of sailing by members of the local community. It does this by providing organised racing and by teaching adults and children to sail. The club is a recognised RYA training centre and beginners are given further training to develop their skills to the point where they can enjoy racing. The social aspect of sailing is also encouraged with the holding of regular social events and the availability of a social category of membership.

Management

The club is managed by the General Committee which consists of four flag officers (Commodore (Chair), Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore Social and Rear Commodore Sailing), three officers (Treasurer, Secretary, and Sailing Secretary) and seven members. The committee meets monthly and its minutes can be read. All members of the committee are elected annually at the Annual General Meeting held in early December. The sailing activites are run by the Sailing Committee chaired by the Rear Commodore Sailing and the social side is run by the Social Committee chaired by the Rear Commodore Social. Before each season starts a programme of sailing, training and social events is published. The club relies on the running of championships and open meetings to keep its financial head above water. Championships are organised by the Championship Committee.

Rules and Bye-laws

All members are expected to comply with the rules and bye-laws of the club. The rules and byelaws can be found at the back of the club's constitution. The General Committee can write new bye-laws if it considers it necessary to meet new situations and deals, as it sees fit, with members who break club rules. The main rules and bye-laws are summarised as follows:

Behaviour

Members are expected to behave in a manner which is not injurious to the interests of individuals or the club. Examples of unacceptable behaviour could be physical or verbal abuse, foul language, drunken behaviour, deliberate damage to club property, cheating to gain competetive advantage, repeated failure to carry out rostered duties etc.

Duties

Sailing members rostered for duties must carry them out, unless they have arranged an exchange with another member. In addition to rostered duties members are expected to help event organisers with the running of important events such as championships.

Pets

Members can bring their dog(s) into the club as long as they are well behaved and stay towards the pool table end of the clubhouse. If a dog causes damage to the club the owner will be liable for repairs and/or cleaning.

Guests

Members are permitted to bring guests into the club, who must be entered in the visitor's book held behind the bar. A maximum of three guests may be signed in at any one time and an individual guest can be signed in no more than six times in one year. Guests wishing to use the sailing facilities may do so no more than three times before applying for sailing membership.

Club Notice-boards

Any member wising to display a notice on a club notice-board must seek approval from the club secretary who will sign and date it. 'For sale' notices can be displayed for a maximum of three months.

Security

Any member who is last to leave the premises must ensure all lights are out, heaters are switched off, the alarm is re-set and all doors are locked.

The races will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing. All PY rated dinghies and cruisers are eligible to race if all crew are members of Paignton Sailing Club – for Special Events, the crew need not be members of Paignton Sailing Club, crew may also sail on no more than six days if they are not Paignton Sailing Club members. The Sailing Instructions will be available on the club website and at the club at least one week before the first start of the first race of the series. RRS 40 (personal buoyancy) and the meaning of some race signals will be changed in the Sailing Instructions.

The courses to be sailed and all other information regarding the series will be published in the Sailing Instructions. The schedule of races is as defined in this program.

Using DutyMan

We use DutyMan, an online, interactive and dynamic duty roster. Using this system allows members to log in and view the dates when we need support.

Using this system provides the following advantages:

- 1. Duty notifications are automatically sent out by email
- 2. Duty swaps can be arranged between members
- 3. Swaps are automatically updated and become visible to all
- 4. Availability for a duty can be confirmed online

Duty Allocation

Duties are allocated twice a year, at the end of April and the end of July. This allows new members to be added to the roster in their first year. If each eligible member does four duties per year, this allows us to run a full racing calendar.

Reminders of the impending allocations will be sent out in the Club newsletter.

Duties for events such as external championships are *not* counted towards club duties, but members are encouraged to volunteer for these too, and they are available on the DutyMan calendar.

The racing calendar and eligible membership list are added to DutyMan as soon as they are finalised, so members wishing to reserve dates for duties early can do so before the April allocation. Similarly, members wishing to block out dates when they know they will be unavailable can email **duties@paigntonsailingclub.co.uk** before the allocation to avoid clashes with holidays or outside commitments.

When new members are added, DutyMan sends out an automated email with login credentials. Please keep this email, as it contains a link which will take you directly to your own page on DutyMan.

Duty Swaps

Please remember that if you cannot attend your duty, it is your responsibility to arrange a swap.

The online Duty Roster provides a facility which allows you to request swaps via email. Multiple requests can be sent out as only the first positive response will be accepted. Alternatively, a swap can be arranged verbally or via the

Procedure to swap or volunteer for a duty:

Click the link in the introductory email you received from DutyMan. This should log you in automatically.

You will be taken to a web page with a set of options on the right hand side ('What do you want to do next?'). The top two are 'Request a duty swap' and 'Volunteer for a duty'. Choose your option. Choose a date from the calendar on the left hand side, and click the 'Request swap' or 'Volunteer' button on the bottom. You can also write a message to those concerned which is copied to the DutyMan administrator.

You can make multiple requests to swap the same duty, only the first acceptance will matter.

If you receive a request to swap a duty, please help out if you can.

Please help the Club to keep a full roster: for instance, if you only sail on Wednesdays but are allocated a Sunday, please arrange a swap before Wednesday sailing is finished for the season.

If sailing is cancelled for weather or attendance reasons, members with duties on that day may be allocated duties for later in the season if there are empty slots.

The club can only manage to operate such a full and successful calendar with the support of all its members. We thank you for your cooperation!

Paignton Junior Sailing Club

Paignton Junior Sailing Club (PJSC) provides structured social sailing, tuition and race training for youngsters. Our aims are to promote dinghy racing by encouraging youngsters to have fun out on the water in safety and to enjoy the thrill of dinghy sailing. We are the junior section of **Paignton Sailing Club**.

Training Courses - Our courses (RYA stage 1 and 2) have been highly commended by the **Royal Yachting Association** (RYA). **PJSC** use the facilities of the training centre and the main club to run courses and activities for its young people. Our training courses are run to the RYA syllabus and coached by fully qualified dinghy instructors with safety support at all times. The **RYA** junior courses in 2018 start on Friday 8th June for 5 weeks (Friday evenings)

Junior Sailing Night - Throughout the year (April to October) **PJSC** run supervised sailing with safety cover on Friday nights. These sessions start at 6.00 and close at 9.00 with a £5.00 fee for sailors using club boats. These sessions are for general sailing taking place close to Paignton beach with longer sail aways to Goodrington and Preston beaches or Broadsands when conditions are suitable. There are no absolute entry requirements to participate although we encourage all juniors to complete our junior course and achieve **RYA level 1** as a minimum. Junior Friday night sailing starts in April. We use a "whatapp" group to provide weekly updates on the plan and likely conditions for Friday night sailing.

PJSC has a fleet of club dinghies comprising of 6 Toppers, RS Tera, 3 RS Fevas and 2 RS Visions. For Friday night sailing we have a flat charge of **£5.00** for juniors using club boats. This is paid on registration each week.

Progression into racing - As a club we encourage transition into racing and for those interested introduce race practice as part of the Friday night sailing. At **PJSC** we support participating in local racing opportunities and advancing into **RYA Zone and National Squads**. The main single handed fleet is the 'Topper' with a strong core of juniors regularly racing locally and at national level. Owning your own boat can have many advantages when moving onto racing and we can advise on what boat and potentially local boats that may be coming up for sale so please speak to us.

Club racing – Juniors can participate in all club racing which runs on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings (April to October). There is no charge for club toppers being used in club racing. Wednesday evening racing is increasingly popular with a separate "Junior start" (start 18.30).

For this purpose there is an annual planning event with occasional ad hoc meetings of an informal committee to shape the activities and support required throughout the year.

Training

Paignton Sailing Club is affiliated to the **Royal Yachting Association** and has been accredited with Recognised Training Centre status. As such, the venue is inspected annually to confirm that **Paignton Sailing Club** complies with the required standards of safety and teaching.

The training side of Paignton Sailing Club is run under the Operating Procedures which can be found under "Documents & Instructions" on our website. The document covers general policy statements, such as Health and Safety, Equal Opportunity, and Child Protection. Furthermore, it provides detailed information about safety afloat whether training, racing, cruising or powerboating.

The Club offers a wide range of **RYA** courses led by a team of qualified instructors and can deliver Youth Training Stages 1-4, Adult Learn to Sail Level 1-3 plus Day Sailing, Spinnaker Handling, Seamanship, Racing and Performance sailing. **PSC** also offers Powerboat Training Level 1 – 2 and Safety Boat Training. The club runs Assistant Instructor, Instructor and Senior Instructor courses as the need arises.

In addition to sailing and powerboat courses, the club can arrange First Aid, Short Wave Radio (VHF), Racing Coach, Race Officer Training and Mark Laying courses, on request, at very reasonable prices.

Safety afloat

1. A support boat shall be launched and manned for any sailing activity organised by the club. Support boats will be manned by two persons when carrying out support duties and have on board all designated support and first aid equipment. If racing, an extra support boat must be launched if the wind is in excess of 20 knots or there are more than 25 boats. Volunteers for this must be sought at the time.

2. A buoyancy aid shall be worn by any person taking part in a club organised activity afloat.

3. No racing shall take place unless the committee boat crew and support crews can maintain radio contact with each other.

4. The decision not to sail in the event of poor conditions will be taken by the principal race officer in case of racing, and the senior instructor in the case of training.

5. A number of dinghies owned by the club are available for hire with the permission of a club officer or instructor. Members who use this facility shall book them out and in. Hired dinghies shall not go afloat unless support boats are available.

6. Club members who take part in casual sailing (sailing not organised by the club) do so entirely at their own risk but are expected to show responsibility for the safety of themselves and others. This includes wearing buoyancy aids and taking into account the prevailing conditions, the forecast and the competency of themselves and their crews. If unsure of the conditions they should seek the advice of an experienced club sailor or the harbourmaster.

Assisted Sailing

Aimed at our more inexperienced sailors and juniors, assisted sailing takes place either on a Friday evening or Saturday morning. The club boats are available for all members to use so that you can practice your sailing skills or just get out on the water in the knowledge that there are experienced sailors and support boats on hand to make sure everyone is safe. The club boats are available to hire for a small fee, but if you have your own boat you are still welcome to join in. Keep an eye on the club website for more information about when these sessions occur.
