



Marcus Gardley is a poet-playwright whose work includes Every Tongue Confess (Edgerton New Play Award), On the Levee, And Jesus Moonwalks the Mississippi, This World in a Woman's Hands, Love is a Dream House in Lorin, dance of the holy ghosts. (L) imitations of Life and like sun fallin' in the mouth. He recently received the 2011 PEN Laura Pels Award for Mid-Career Playwright. The New Yorker describes Gardley as "... the heir to Garcia Lorca, Pirandello and Tennessee Williams."

Tala Manassah is deputy executive director of the Morningside Center for Teaching Social Responsibility, the national leader in school-based social and emotional learning programs. She earned her A.B. with honors in philosophy and A.M. in the humanities at the University of Chicago, under the tutelage of Martha Nussbaum. As a playwright, she has co-written, with Mona Mansour *The House, The Letter, After* and musical

The Wife. Most recently, they were given an Ensemble Studio Theatre/Sloan commission to write a play about 1970s Iraq.

Her activist collection of short plays and monologues will be published in Spring 2014 by No Passport.
