A NOTE ON ASWANGS BY PLAYWRIGHT BONI B. ALVAREZ

Aswangs are essentially Filipino witches. Over the past few centuries, they have transformed from terrifying demonic monsters (with enormous bloodshot eyes, fangs, and wings) to contemporary human shapeshifters with an "evil" eye. Their special powers are activated at night. With the aid of the moon, they cause headaches and food poisoning, shapeshift into birds or pigs, feast on humans—or turn them into *aswangs*.

According to the mythology, *aswangs* come from the Visayas and Mindanao islands. In these provincial areas of the Philippines, belief in *aswangs* still runs as strong as belief in a Roman Catholic God. You'll hear gossip about who might be an *aswang*—they could be your neighbors, your friends, or even your family members.
