## TOURNAMENT AT JONES'S ROAD LEINSTER JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP WEXFORD DEFEAT WESTMEATH

A tournament organised by the County Dublin Committee was held at Jones's Road yesterday in aid of the men locked out or on strike in connection with the present labour trouble in Dublin. The weather was fine, and the attendance was large. The programme was one of three matches...The Davis team won from the Rapparees by 3 goals and 4 points to 3 goals and 2 points, and the Parnells defeated the Keatings by 2 goals and 5 points to one goal and 2 points.
