CHURCH IN SMANNELL & ENHAM



Ramblings from the Rectory ...

As we come into the month of May, we begin to think about summer holidays and hope for warmer weather.

It makes me think of going on a pilgrimage ... and I do know that one person from the Pastrow team of churches is currently undertaking a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela.

I walked a small part of that journey in 2013 and it was an amazing experience. Arriving at the cathedral at Santiago was all that I imagined it might be ... if I had been a medieval pilgrim having journeyed on a pilgrim boat across the channel and walked for months through France, finally arriving at Santiago, I guess that I might have been even more amazed.

But even though we had only walked for a few days, finally arriving at the cathedral after our months of planning and preparation, was still a wonderful moment. The sight of the main altar is certainly dazzling - the richness of the gold and silver is really quite breathtaking.

But you might wonder why people from medieval times to the current day would want to travel this pilgrimage route of the Camino de Santiago. People from the first century onwards have travelled on pilgrimages, but to begin with they journeyed to Jerusalem or Rome.

Santiago became a favoured destination after the discovery of St James' body nearby. It is thought that St James came to this area of northern Spain, Galicia, in the first century. The story goes that he made 7 or 8 disciples and then went back to Jerusalem and was martyred. His body apparently found it's way back to this area and was discovered much later in a cave on a hillside after someone saw stars twinkling above it. So the name Compostela means field of stars [Campus stellae] and Santiago means St James, of course. When I said to someone that I was making a pilgrimage to Santiago, they thought I was going to Chile ... we'll have to leave that journey for another time perhaps! But the real point about a pilgrimage is the journeying together - the companionship and fellowship along the way. We learnt a lot about each other as we travelled along and ate together and worshipped together. I also gained a sense of being a part of something greater as I walked in the steps of thousands of pilgrims who had walked the same way before. It was a humbling and a liberating experience, and I felt a stronger connection to the sheer greatness of God. I could discard the fripperies of modern living and just walk on this path like people had done for centuries past.

Pilgrimages can help us to grow spiritually and in my previous churches we undertook a pilgrimage journey each year in Lent. We travelled to Iona, the holy wells of Wales, and discovered some of the Cornish saints together, as well as walking on part of the Camino de Santiago. If you are interested in pilgrimage do let me know, as it may be something we could explore together as a team of churches.

Have a good month wherever you journey, both near and far, and may God go with you on all your paths.

I am sure that you will remember that in the last edition of The Parish Oak we were waiting excitedly for our space seeds to arrive. At the time of writing this article we have received confirmation that the seeds have returned to Earth and are on their way to us. Our green-fingered growers are making sure that everything is ready for them to be planted.

As we are planting seeds it must mean that summer has officially arrived. One of the highlights of summer for our children is being able to make full use of our lovely environment. Enham Alamein Parish Council

The Parish Council is constantly working with Hampshire Police and Hampshire Council to try and reduce the speed through the village.

The recent media regarding the "fake" speed camera has proved that there is a speeding issue. After a series of monitoring exercises with both a road device and then with police presence, Hampshire Police decided it was too "high risk" for us to carry out our own Speed Watch programme as had been previously committed to. The police are now using a mobile unit when possible and the Parish Council are purchasing a speed indicator device to make drivers aware of the 30 mph limit. We have also requested that the speed limit approaching the village is reduced to 40 mph. There will also be new village signs at each road entrance and a new updated pedestrian crossing is also being installed with more extensive lighting.

You can be assured that we will continue to work towards road safety within our community. We would like to remind readers that, through a previous campaign, a few years ago, we were successful in getting the main A343 speed limit reduced to 30 mph.

Looking back over the last few weeks, we have so much good news to share with you.

We have had many fantastic local businesses raising awareness and funds for our vital cause; these include The Chillies, who kindly held a curry night on our behalf, raising £500 for us, and Webkick, an Andover digital marketing agency who raised £150 towards our work. Alice Holt Forest in Farnham has donated £5000 towards our accessible bicycle project, after working with us to support some of our clients to try out some specially-adapted bikes, promoting exercise, raising confidence, and maintaining mobility. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

FRAUD

This information has been sent on behalf of Action Fraud (National Fraud Intelligence Bureau).

Fraudsters are targeting members of the public who are expecting to make a payment for property repairs. The fraudsters, via email, will purport to be a tradesman who has recently completed work at the property and use a similar email address to that of the genuine tradesman. They will ask for funds to be transferred via bank transfer and once payment is made the victims soon realise they have been deceived when the genuine tradesman requests payment for their services.

Protect Yourself

Always check the email address is exactly the same as previous correspondence with the genuine contact.

For any request of payment via email verify the validity of the request with a phone call to the person who carried out the work.

Check the email for spelling and grammar as these signs can indicate that the email is not genuine.

Payments via bank transfer offer no financial protection; consider using alternative methods such as credit card or Paypal which offer some protection and avenue for recompense.

If you believe that you have been the victim of fraud you can report it online or by telephone at: 0300 123 2040

NOTE: At least one such fraud attempt has been made on our parish.
