EDITORIAL

I am very pleased to have recently joined the Editorial Team for the Parish Oak and I thought that for my first editorial, I would take the opportunity to share these thoughts with you ...

I have certainly been fortunate enough over recent years to meet some people in my daily life who have provided me with food for thought and reflection, and opportunities to open my mind to new ideas and approaches. One particular piece of wisdom shared with me at a difficult time gave reference to a poem which may have originated from a piece written by Eleanor Roosevelt "*Footprints in your Heart*".

People generally come into your life for a **Reason, a Season or a Lifetime**. Understanding this principle can enhance your relationships, helping you better serve others and learn or grow from what they have to offer. When someone is in your life for a **REASON**, it may be they have come to assist you through a difficulty, or to provide you with guidance. They may be in your life to support you physically, emotionally, or spiritually.

Some people come into your life for a **SEASON**— an extended period of time. Just as there are seasons for planting, growing, and harvesting, there are seasons when you are prepared to learn or grow. There are other times in your life when you're not prepared to grow, learn, or even listen. So, when someone comes into your life at a certain season, it is likely that the timing is right for what they can offer you.

Some people are in your life for a **LIFETIME**. These people are, perhaps, the greatest gift because they stick with you through the Reasons, Seasons, and through your entire lifetime. Lifetime relationships teach you lifetime lessons. These are often qualities, skills, and aspects of your character you can build upon in order to have a solid foundation for yourself and in service to others.

I have found this piece an inspiration at times, particularly to help explain the jigsaw of life and when evaluating your own connections, be it family, friends, colleagues, acquaintances, and teachers. It sometimes makes it easier to understand why things happen and helps one or me, to rest easy in the knowledge that, maybe, it was meant to be.

Refugees and terrorists have been very much on my mind; as well as Lent and the delightful blooming of Spring flowers letting us know that Easter will soon be with us.

Let's work backwards ... Easter is just around the corner and you are welcome to join in with our Lent lunches or Lent groups or any of our Easter services ... please see the details in the magazine to find out where these are being held.

The Spring flowers help to cheer us up when the weather is either cold or wet ... but I have never seen before such a profusion of daffodils in January, as well as the wonderful snowdrops which I expected to see during February ... and it has been a delight to watch the first grape hyacinths and violets popping up in sheltered corners of the Rectory garden, before we've even got to March.

We have been looking at our beautiful world in our first session of the Lent groups ... we talked about stewarding faithfully and tried to think of ways that we could help to look after our world better, even if it is just trying to recycle more or picking up litter as we go on our walks along the local footpaths ... taking a plastic bag and some plastic gloves with us in our pockets when we go out for a walk. There are still a few more Fridays left in Lent, and if you would like to join us, you would be most welcome.

As well as going to a Lent group or a Lent lunch, you may have been doing the 40 Acts? You will find these if you look online and they are a more positive thing to do for Lent, rather than trying to give something up, we are encouraged to do an act of generosity each day. And then we come to the refugees. Like many of you, I have been

overwhelmed by the pictures of refugees on our TV screens over the last few months, but as these recede, let us continue to pray for all those who are homeless and who have had to flee from terrorist bombs.

The Diocese sent out a prayer for us to use for the Syrian refugees and this part I would like to share with you:

'We pray that the desperate may find new hope, and that lives torn apart might be restored ... we ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, who fled persecution at his birth, and at his last, triumphed over death.'

And as we celebrate Christ's triumph over death, may I wish you all a truly happy and blessed Easter!

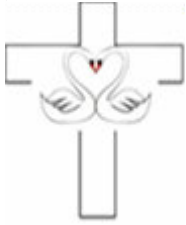

So our children took great pride in seeing how many of their works appeared on the giant screen as the orchestra performed.

They spent the morning in Enham as part of their local study finding out what makes it such a special place. I'm told that the radio station became a favourite place for many of them. REPORT ON PCC MEETING HELD ON 2ND FEBRUARY 2016 AT JUBILEE HOUSE

All PCC members were present and the meeting was chaired by Rev. Alex Randle-Bissell, who opened with a reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians, followed by reflection and prayers.

Parish Oak Editor Peter Calcraft was also present and brought members up to date with the changes in the magazine, with special reference to the online version. It was hoped that the Benefice webpage would be fully operational by the end of August. Each church in the Benefice would have its own page. Peter then left the meeting.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were approved and signed as correct by the Churchwarden.

The search for a new Foundation Governor at the School was continuing. It was hoped that the work on the uphill path at the burial ground at Christ Church, Smannell would commence shortly. Elizabeth would be organizing a small Committee to plan the celebration of the history of the Hatherden and Smannell Churches. The Christmas Service, with wine and mince pies in the church, had been very successful. Mr. and Mrs. Michael Dawson had agreed to host the Summer BBQ at their home on 17th June. Arrangements had been made for a replacement for Margaret Hughes for cleaning Christ Church. A Retirement Gift had been presented to Rev. Derek Cooper. All arrangements were in hand for the Lent Lunches.

The 2015 accounts were being prepared. There was likely to be a small deficit for the year. The Parish Share for 2016 had been set at £17,436, a 10% increase over 2015. A generous donation of £250 had been received for Churchyard maintenance at Christ Church. Accounts would be prepared, independently examined and displayed in the Churches in advance of the annual meeting which would be held on 26th April at 6.30 p.m. at The Oak. Contact with regular donors had been maintained.

It was unanimously agreed that the Benefice should employ a Benefice Administrator who should be installed by September. Rev. Alex tabled modified Patterns of Services. (At a meeting held on 11th February the new pattern, including a Family Service whenever there was a 5th Sunday in the month, was agreed).

A United Benefice Service would be held at Christ Church, Smannell on 21st February which would be attended by the Bishop of Basingstoke, at which The Big Ask would be launched. A Day Away was being arranged for all PCC members on 4th June. It was emphasized that Enham residents would require transport.

Rev. Val said that the Christingle Service had been a lovely occasion. The Craft Group had met in January.

Rev. Alex had visited most of the churches in the Benefice and had been most impressed with the lay leadership in all the Parishes. He outlined his plans and hopes for the future of the Benefice with particular reference to the various Parishes operating together.

The next meeting will be held on 11th February at Jubilee House at 6 p.m.

The meeting closed with the Grace at 8.38 p.m.

DEFIBRILLATORS IN LITTLE LONDON AND SAMNELL

Smannell Parish Council has placed defibrillators in the phone box in Little London and on the side wall of The Oak in Smannell. The cabinets are unlocked, in line with British Heart Foundation advice, so the device is immediately available.

THE DEFIBRILLATORS ARE EASY TO USE.

If someone is experiencing heart problems, phone for an ambulance and get the defibrillator. Switch it on to follow the simple voice instructions.

The council will be holding training sessions in what to do in the event of a heart attack and these will include use of a defibrillator. But this training is not essential as the equipment is designed for use by any untrained person.

FRAUD

Fraudsters are sending out virus-infected emails that claim a package has been seized by HM Revenue & Customs upon arrival in UK. The official-looking scam emails, claiming to be from Royal Mail, contain a link which will install malicious software on your computer designed to steal credentials like account names, email addresses and passwords.

An example email reads:

Title: Your parcel has been seized.

Royal Mail is sorry to inform you that a package addressed to you was seized by HM Revenue & Customs upon arrival in UK. A close inspection deemed your items as counterfeit and the manufacturers have been notified. If your items are declared genuine then they will be returned to you with the appropriate custom charges. You may have been the victim of counterfeit merchandise and the RM Group will notify you on how to get your money back. Please review the attached PDF document for more information: Document (RM7002137GB). Zip.

If you receive one of these emails, DO NOT click on any links or download any attachments and report it to Action Fraud. Royal Mail will never send an email asking for credit card numbers or other personal or confidential information. If you believe that you have been a victim of fraud you can report it to Action Fraud online or by telephone: 0300 123 2040.

SCAM: A TRUE STORY

A few days ago I received a telephone call purporting to be from my service provider AOL, stating that due to some recent break in service I was due compensation. In order to complete the claim form I should switch on my computer and fill out the details required. This would of course include my bank details. I knew that AOL always credited my account for any compensation that I was due and that they already had my bank details because I paid by direct debit. I told the caller (an Indian lady) in no uncertain terms what to do and reported it to Action Fraud. Please be alert, new scams are appearing every day.

Repetition

One of the saddest effects of dementia is the repetition, either of things said or of things done. This year I have had 2 birthday cards and 3 Christmas cards from the same person. This is sad because the person concerned is disconcerted to discover what they have done and the rest of the world is not too sure what to say or do about it.

But it has caused me to think about the increasing repetition we find in daily life. There are commercial radio or television channels where the "ads" are repeated pretty well verbatim all day long. It may be argued that this is good advertising because it roots the product in our memories. That may be so, but it is also deeply patronising and, to be frank, very boring. I won't listen to one of the commercial radio stations simply because I cannot stand the tedium of the repetition. A more enlightened advertising campaign might at least have a range of "ads" to stop us dying of boredom.

But it goes further than that. Turn on a certain TV channel any weekday night at a certain time and you will find "Heartbeat" showing. I have nothing against "Heartbeat" – in fact, I used to enjoy it. But it has been done to death. The same is true of the "Lewis" programmes which have taken over the omnipresent spot from "Morse". There were not so many Lewis programmes so they come around with stupefying rapidity.

Is this repetition symbolic of the age that we live in? No one apologises for it, but it assumes that we are all short of memory and that we can be fobbed off with constant repeats. Clearly the programme makers don't have a high opinion of their viewers, hoping we won't notice the vain repetition. But there is also another question. How far does all this repetition serve to create a place where people find it quite normal to repeat everything? If I constantly hear and see repeated material, is it any wonder if I start repeating myself? Isn't it sad?

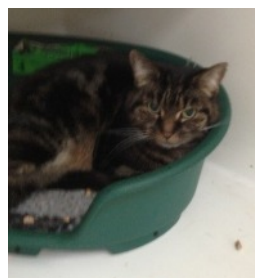
