The Smannell and Enham Church of England (Aided) Primary School is currently in need of new Foundation Governors.

Governors are one of the largest volunteer forces in the country and have an important part to play in raising school standards. The role of the governing body is absolutely key to the effectiveness of a school. Ofsted (the national inspection body for schools) has noted that the most effective schools demonstrate effective leadership and management, and that includes the leadership brought by the governing body.



Our school Governing Body is made up of people who come to us through a variety of routes and with a range of different backgrounds, skill and experiences, but they are all volunteers who work together for the benefit of the School and are the link between the School and the community it serves.

The role of the Governing Body is a strategic one and its key functions are to set the aims and objectives for the school; set the policies and targets for achievement; monitor and evaluate the progress the school is making, all this while being a source of challenge and support to the headteacher (a critical friend).

This isn't an application to be taken lightly, as it involves time, energy and a willingness to become involved in the life of the school on a regular basis over at least four years. However, it is very rewarding, as together we can strategically input into the school and see another generation of children growing in knowledge and development within our community. A Foundation Governor represents the Church of England and should be a regular communicant within the Church.

# SUMMARY REPORT OF A FULL COUNCIL MEETING OF ENHAM ALAMEIN PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON 13 JANUARY 2016 AT THE CEDAR PRINT ROOM, ENHAM TRUST, ENHAM ALAMEIN, ANDOVER

Members carefully considered and unanimously agreed to approve the budget for 2016/2017 as presented and set the precept requirement at £9,082, while delivering a zero increase in Average Band D Council Tax for residents.

The Chairman advised about the pavilion and potential creation of a disabled path for all of the village and the cost implications are very high for the concept of safe access. It does appear that due to cost constraints, it is not possible to undertake disabled access together with refurbishment of the pavilion as this is cost-prohibitive but alternative funding sources will be assessed.

The Chairman advised that the committee wants to revisit the questionnaire surveys undertaken and reevaluate what people would like as it is important to integrate and combine for all. Consideration can then be made for on-going costs and firm-up the types of provision and therefore grants that could be available.

The Chairman advised those present that there will be a Street Party to celebrate the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> birthday on 11 June 2016.

Cllr. North reported that the Government Planning Inspector had ruled that the new TVBC Local Plan is sound and that there would be no further strategic housing sites allocated. Thanks to the help of Alamein Ward residents the Local Plan also ensures the protection of our Local Gaps including between Andover and Smannell/Enham Alamein.

Secondly, he reported that Taylor Wimpey's bid to reduce the amount of affordable houses due to be built on Augusta Park has now been rejected by Test Valley Borough Council.

Thirdly, Test Valley Borough Council has launched a brand new smartphone app that allows residents to report issues such as street cleaning and waste and recycling concerns quickly and easily. "My Test Valley" is simple to use, free of charge and works with the mapping software on smartphones so that users can pinpoint exactly where in the borough they are reporting from. "My Test Valley" is available to download from the Apple App Store for iPhones and iPads, Google Play for Android phones, or the Windows Store for Windows phones.

Borough Cllr. Alex Brook reiterated that the Local Gap will be protected for some 20 years. He advised members of a forthcoming Alamein Conference taking place on 23 January 2016 at 10.00am at the Long Meadow Centre, Smannell Road, Smannell.

The Chairman invited Peta Wilkinson to update on Enham Trust activities. Peta Wilkinson advised that phase 2 planning application for the development at Enham Trust is to be submitted by the end of January. The Enham Trust has been shortlisted for another award for the development at Bradbury Place. The trust is still awaiting a Homes & Community Grant via the Department of Health.

The Chairman formally wished all present a very happy New Year. She advised that a village agent volunteer has now been appointed to work with Age Concern. She felt that the Christmas Lights Switch-On Event was excellent and the presents were very well received.

# Lilly Doreen Robson Better known as Lil

Lil was born on 14th April 1911 at Enham to Fred and Ann White.

Fred was head gardener to the Earl family at Enham. Lil had a sister Edith (known as Edo) and a brother Roy. She also had a cousin May who lived with them and who was thought of as another sister.

Lil attended Smannell School and later Hatherden when the family moved there. On the 29<sup>th</sup> April 2010, Lil opened the new extension at Smannell and Enham School, being their oldest pupil still living. Lil was honoured to do this. Lil and Frank had three children, Clive, Janet and Paul. Sadly, Janet died in 2006 and Clive in 2010. This was a monumental blow to Lil and she never stopped missing them and talked of them daily.

Lil was very proud of her grandchildren Ian and Debbie and great grandchildren Ben, Lilly and Holly. She surrounded herself with photographs of them and would proudly go through them all when she had visitors. Lil loved to be visited by all her nieces and nephews, and she had quite a few.

Both Lil and Frank worked at the factory at Enham. When Lil celebrated her  $100^{\text{th}}$  birthday, the boys she worked with were all invited: Eric Collins, Terry Geoghegan, Keith Harman, Joe Copper and John Peters. Lil also worked at the Wool Shop in Andover and Webster's Shirt factory on the Walworth Estate. During the 1960s and 1970s Lil played in the ladies' darts team for The Enham Club and also for The Hare and Hounds at Charlton Down. Apparently she was a good darts player, winning the Ladies' Singles one year.

During her time she had three poodles which her family adored. Lil loved her dogs and then later her cats, Ginger and Bobbin. When we were young she

used to take in baby rooks that had fallen out of the trees...one was called Rookie!! It was quite tame and kept us amused as children.

Lil had a caravan at West Bexington, at which many a family holiday was spent with her family. Even so, she still liked to fit in a holiday each year and this was usually arranged when her favourite Irish singer, Dominic Kirwan was singing at a nearby venue...the last time being in May last year when Paul and Lil spent a week in Swanage. Lil also liked to visit Lincoln to see her daughter-in-law, Julia and all her grandchildren. Her love of the Donkey Sanctuary at Sidmouth came from her holidays and will always hold a special place in our hearts.

From May last year, Lil's health slowly deteriorated, but she still liked to keep up with the gossip in the village. Lil enjoyed having visitors, it was never a few minutes with her, more like an hour or two!!

Lil was glad to have her son, Paul, to look after her and kept a big secret from the family when Paul married Elsy and gave her another daughter-in-law, who also took care of her.

Lil would have loved to see so many people turn up on the day of her funeral, she was a lady who had a strong willed nature, but she was always there to help anyone or give a bit of advice.

Lil took so many memories of the village with her. Who will put us all right now when we ask questions about the village??

Sorry Aunt Lil for calling you Lil throughout all this, but I'm sure loads of people have different stories and memories of you.


